Greetings, please add my comments into records.

1. My research into Tenex Software solutions found they also had a company located in Russia. I reported this to the BOS 2/27/2022.
That is very disturbing, especially now with reports of Russia having successfully breached airports, banks, and government systems.
ABC News reported that Tenex software solutions had possibly been breached. Tenex never denied nor confirmed it.
2. Tenex Software solutions had problems with their website and their web certificate. I reported this to you 2/27/2022.
It doesn't bode well for their ability to run an election for over 1 Million people, if they neglect their own website.
3. There's the matter of the Election Dept "renting 80 e-poll books from Tenex" to ensure adequate supply for Vote Centers.
Will they be tested for Accuracy and Logic? When will this public event happen? Reminder, both testing Labs are still not accredited
pursuant to the HAVA act of 2002, nor per ARS 16-442(B).
4. None of you are election equipment experts, not even your IT personnel. Tim Laux and Christine Bauserman made you aware that you had
ordered a centralized databank, similar the Records office with a server here in Pima co. Those data bases could "talk" to each other, if needed.
However, you have accepted a distributed databank. Those would be uploaded to the Cloud and be continuously on-line. That is opportunity for
hackers 5am-7pm or longer. This opens the door to massive failure or problems that you will be held liable because we warned you numerous times.
Pack up and return the distributed database and equipment, but BleachBit it first.
5. Peter Norquest made you aware 10/04/2022 of GEMS fractionalized voting and submitted the information to you.
We want to see the source code,
chip and the motherboard of the tabulators. Our taxes pay for these expensive toys.
6. In Ms. Hargrove's After-Action report, she intends to let an employee of Tenex, a 3rd party vendor run our election "to assist". I DO NOT CONSENT!
Supervisor Christy pointed that out in the last BOS meeting, "That's like the fox guarding the henhouse." I agree!

Provide Pima County 15 Early Voting locations with CAMERAS. No Party Observers will be provided at any of the 15 Early Voting locations: based up on on comments by Recorder, Cázares-Kelly in the 10-04-22 Board of Supervisors' meeting discussion with Supervisor Christy (refer to BOS 10-04-22 Board of Supervisors' Video at 2:54-3:08). Where is transparency and resolving election integrity issues in the Recorders' areas of responsibility? Additionally in the Recorder's After-Action Report, she indicates some employees who will be assigned to Early Voting Locations have concerns about their safety and work environment. I also spoke with David, Supervisor at the Elections Department regarding some Early Ballots remaining overnight at unidentified Voting Locations and are not returned daily to the Ballot Tallying location due courier pick up routes. Where is chain of custody for these ballots? All of these concerns can be resolved by providing CAMERAS at all 15 Early Voting Locations during all hours of their service to Pima County. Provide CAMERAS now.
