**RESOLUTION OF THE PIMA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
ORDERING AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS OF
THE GOVERNING BOARD OF RINCON VALLEY FIRE DISTRICT**

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of A.R.S. §48-803, the Board of Supervisors shall order an increase in the number of members of a district board,

WHEREAS, it is prior to one hundred twenty days before the next regular scheduled election for members of the Rincon Valley Fire District board and

WHEREAS, the Rincon Valley Fire District Board is currently a three member board and has requested an increase and

WHEREAS, the estimated population of the Rincon Valley Fire District exceeds four thousand inhabitants based on: the United States Census Bureau Vail Community Demographic Profile estimate of 9,468; Pima County Assessor parcel count of 6,633 and estimate of 10,796; Pima County Recorder registered voter count of 6,819; and Vail School District student count of 10,259.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Rincon Valley Fire District Board is ordered to increase to five members, effective with the election of the additional members at the next regular election of members of the Rincon Valley Fire District Board.

Data are based on a sample and are subject to sampling variability. The degree of uncertainty for an estimate arising from sampling variability is represented through the use of a margin of error. The value shown here is the 90 percent margin of error. The margin of error can be interpreted roughly as providing a 90 percent probability that the interval defined by the estimate minus the margin of error and the estimate plus the margin of error (the lower and upper confidence bounds) contains the true value. In addition to sampling variability, the ACS estimates are subject to nonsampling error (for a discussion of nonsampling variability, see Accuracy of the Data). The effect of nonsampling error is not represented in these tables.

The ACS questions on Hispanic origin and race were revised in 2008 to make them consistent with the Census 2010 question wording. Any changes in estimates for 2008 and beyond may be due to demographic changes, as well as factors including questionnaire changes, differences in ACS population controls, and methodological differences in the population estimates, and therefore should be used with caution. 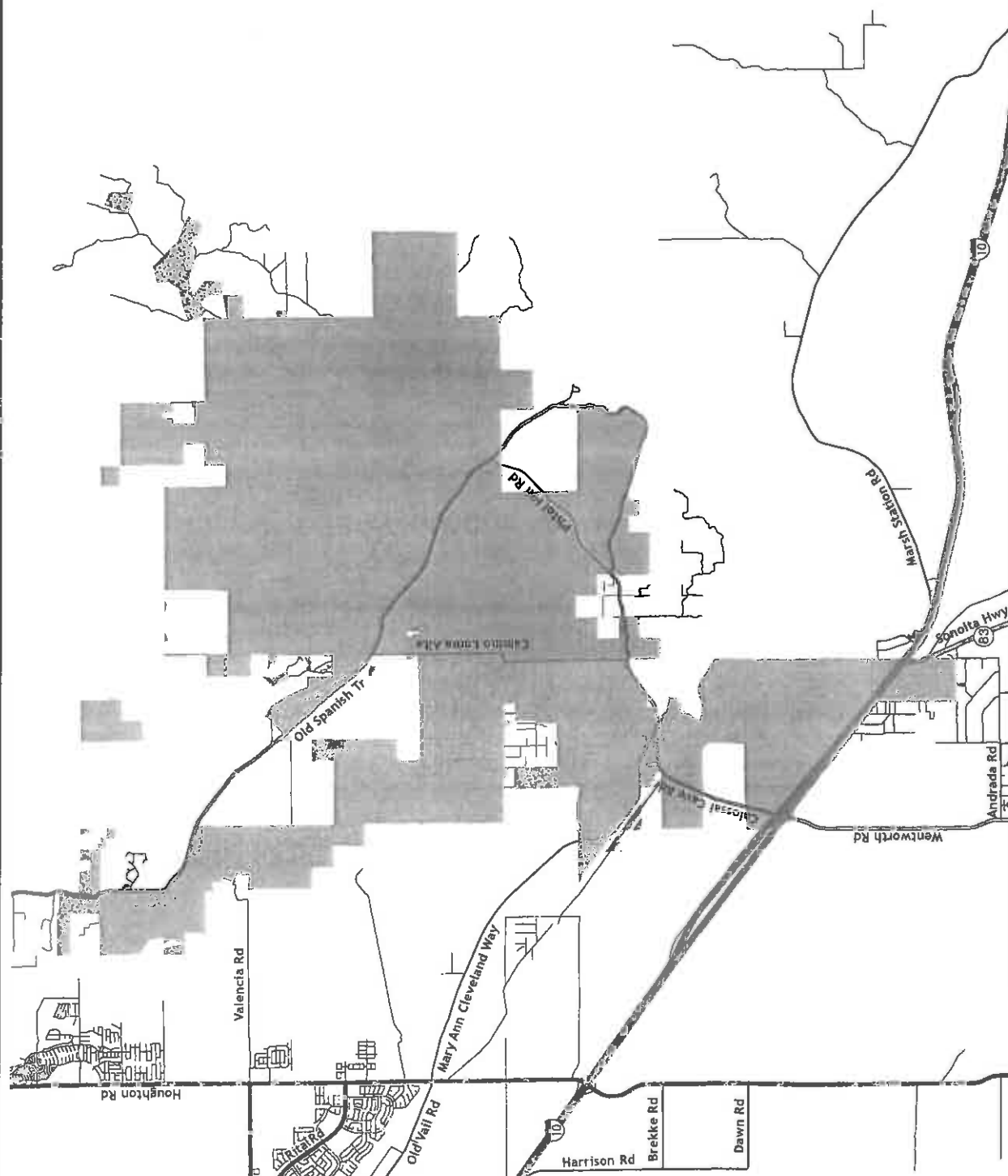
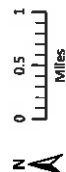

3. An '-' following a median estimate means the median falls in the lowest interval of an open-ended distribution.
4. An '+' following a median estimate means the median falls in the upper interval of an open-ended distribution.
5. An '*****' entry in the margin of error column indicates that the median falls in the lowest interval or upper interval of an open-ended distribution. A statistical test is not appropriate.
6. An '*****' entry in the margin of error column indicates that the estimate is controlled. A statistical test for sampling variability is not appropriate.
7. An 'N' entry in the estimate and margin of error columns indicates that data for this geographic area cannot be displayed because the number of sample cases is too small.
