What are you going to spend the money on?	The funding requested will provide support of local hazardous materials emergency planning training and exercises to enhance territorial, tribal, and local hazardous materials emergency planning and training in Pima County. The HMEP grant is on a 3 year grant cycle and funds are dispersed on an annual basis. OEM requested \$169,147 for the entire 3 year grant cycle. The 1st year - FY 2019-2020 HMEP grant award is for \$51,483. This grant application was originally submitted on 04/25/2019 and OEM received the award letter on 10/7/19. See the award letter attached. In the past, 100% of this grant paid for costs incurred by LEPC and other Hazmat training activities and not for PC personnel wages, fringe, travel and training. If eligible costs are charged, OEM will include a 10% indirect rate on those costs.					
What will be the benefit to Pima County?	HMEP funding will make available Hazmat training, exercises and planning for LEPC and first responder Hazardous Material (Hazmat) training in Pima County. The training, exercises and planning will allow OEM, LEPC and the local first responder community to increase effectiveness in safely and efficiently handling hazardous materials accidents and incidents including the unique challenges of responses to transportation situations. Additionally, HMEP funding is used to develop, improve and implement emergency plans, and train public sector hazardous materials (hazmat) response employees to respond to accidents and incidents involving hazardous materials in transportation. This is coordinated with all jurisdictions within Pima County.
