Supervisors,

I'd like to thank Supervisor Christy for bringing this to the Board for consideration.

I am asking that all of you vote **YES** to **lifting** the mask mandate in Pima County buildings and programs.

Things to consider for your YES vote:

- 1) During the last 2 years of the pandemic, has the Pima County Health Department ever gathered or analyzed Pima County transmission data to determine the efficacy of mask wearing in reducing transmission? No. The Health Dept's job is to look at local data and apply it to local needs. They have not done this.
- 2) Both Dr. Garcia and Dr. Cullen have never provided full disclosure to the public about the fact that their Arizona State retirement pension fund invests in pharmaceutical

companies and companies that benefit financially from Pima County Health Department medical and mask mandates. They should be required to announce this conflict of interest at every meeting where they make recommendations for medical mandates.

3) The apparent discrepancy between lifting the mask mandate for public spaces not owned by Pima County while maintaining them in facilities owned by Pima County is absolutely confusing and makes you look weak and ineffective. There is no need for this nonsensical double standard. If the Pima County Health Department does not gather and analyze data to see if continuing mask mandates is justified or not, then a continuation of the mask mandate in Pima County buildings comes across as an "arbitrary and capricious abuse of governmental authority" and should immediately be lifted.

4) The 2-year-old narrative about a deadly "novel" virus does not hold up when the Pima County Board makes so many exceptions for how it applies the rules. These exceptions cause us to question the justification for the lockdowns.

5) These lockdowns and mandates caused so many businesses to fail, causing a spike in domestic violence, drug use, child suicide, unemployment and homelessness. Were any of the restrictive pandemic measures actually justified by the "lives-saved" argument? Also, has the Pima County Health

Department ever done a side-by-side analysis of this? If not, why?

Please note **YES** to lifting the mask mandate in Pima County buildings and programs.
