Addendum Agenda Item – Discussion/Action on the Pima County Attorney's Office request to utilize Anti-Racketeering Revolving Funds in support of Fresh Start International

*Introduction/Background:

Funds are requested in the amount of \$5,000.00, for the Fresh Start International to host the Fresh Start Expo 2022 event for those needing to migitate the collateral consequences of a conviction history.

*Discussion:

This request is for Fresh Start Expo 2022 is an annual event sponsored by Fresh Start International. It is a unique program originating in Tucson through the efforts of Dr. Pastor Da'Mond Holt and the collaboration of Laura Conover, the Pima County Attorney, and the Judges of the Superior Court, Justice Court, Tucson City Court, and Pima County Juvenile Court. Each of these entities have agreed to support the relocation of the courts to the Tucson Community Center on Saturday, October 22, 2022 to support assisting people returning from incarceration. This population is given the opportunity to clear their records of warrants, fines, restitution obligations, expungements as appropriate as well as other legal entanglements that create barriers to their becoming employed, housed, eligible for health care both mental and physical.

*Conclusion:

The event will be held on the first floor of the Tucson Convention Center this positive community event is supported by and are consistent with Law Enforcement objectives.

Approve the funding request in the amount of \$5,000.00.

Describe the community-based program for which funds are being sought and how the
program benefits the community.

Fresh Start Expo 2022 is an annual event sponsored by Fresh Start International, an Arizona nonprofit corporation. It is a unique program originating in Tucson through the efforts of Dr. Pastor Da'Mond Holt and the collaboration of Laura Conover, the Pima County Attorney, and the judges of the Superior Court, Justice Court, Tucson City Court, and Pima County Juvenile Court. Each of these entities have agreed to support the relocation of the courts to the Tucson Community Center for several hours on Saturday, October 22, 2022, for the sole purpose of assisting people returning from incarceration or, as Pima County Attorney Laura Conover identifies them, "those needing to mitigate the collateral consequences of a conviction history." This population is given the opportunity to clear their records of warrants, fines, restitution obligations, expungements as appropriate as well as other legal entanglements that create barriers to their becoming employed, housed, eligible for health care both mental and physical. In addition, resources are made available so they can participate in Restoration of Rights Clinics and obtain legal identification such as birth certificates and other important records like driver's licenses. The purpose of the FRESH START EXPO is to facilitate the reentry of the formerly incarcerated to the community by enabling them to have free access to services that would normally be beyond their ability to purchase or obtain. These services are made available to them through the generosity of the community via its legal system, agencies. U of A law School. government elected officials, non-profit organizations, faith groups, friends and neighbors. It is a welcoming event made up of people who understand the needs of the formerly incarcerated and care about their wellbeing. With this facilitated reentry into the community, most of the formerly incarcerated will be able to become self-supporting and reconciled with their family. This positive assistance and cultural change from shunning this population to accepting and supporting it, will reduce their need to survive by illegal, criminal activities. Removing the need to support oneself outside the legal system reduces crime in the community, reduces criminal cases in the courts, reduces the likelihood of return to incarceration for the population most likely to experience the "collateral consequences of a conviction history."

2. Specifically, what law enforcement effort, policy, and/or initiative of this agency does this program support in this community?

The Fresh Start Expo 2022 strongly supports the enforcement efforts, policies and initiatives of the Pima County Attorney Laura Conover as she works to "transform Pima County into a safer and more just community." Her objective is to "not rely solely on prosecution and incarceration but to have a more proactive, holistic and crime preventive approach to public safety by also working to mitigate the collateral consequences of a conviction history; helping to provide resources for underserved communities and by treating both victims and people who have committed crimes with dignity and respect." Members of the Pima County community initiated the first Fresh Start event in 2019 at Pilgrim's Rest Missionary Baptist Church, pastored by Dr. Pastor Da'Mond Holt. There were many in the community seeking a proactive opportunity to improve public safety while mitigating the collateral consequences of a conviction history and creating resources for underserved communities. They came together under the leadership of Dr. Pastor Da'Mond Holt and devised a strategy for change: Fresh Start. Although the initial

vision was for Fresh Start to be an annual event, the Covid pandemic interrupted those plans. Laura Conover was elected Pima County Attorney and took office in early 2021. When the Fresh Start Committee sought resources to initiate a Fresh Start event for 2021, they found an enthusiastic supporter in Laura Conover and a new energy throughout the legal system in Pima County for supporting those who had been incarcerated. And they also found new policies in effect throughout the legal community. With the support of the Pima County Attorney and Mayor Regina Romero of the City of Tucson, Fresh Start's concept was expanded and moved to the Tucson Convention Center in 2021. That successful event served 400 formerly incarcerated people and removed significant barriers to their effective self-sufficient reentry to the community. The event slated for October 22, 2022, is the second Fresh Start Expo in the expanded venue of the Tucson Convention Center. It is anticipated that additional publicity and increased efficiency that comes with experience will significantly expand the number served.

3. Describe in detail how this program is supportive and consistent with this law enforcement agency's efforts, policies, and /or initiatives in the community. What elements of the program specifically enhance or extend the efforts of law enforcement in the community, and how does the program do this?

Perhaps the new subtitle of the Pima County Attorney's Office, The People's Office, and the publishing of Our Core Values by Pima County Attorney Conover, best exemplifies the focus of the agency's efforts that Fresh Start Expo supports and enhances. Fresh Start Expo follows the concepts of making legal services accessible to people without money, means or influence and does so by providing the services free, in a community space, at a time and day best accessed by the working poor. Fresh Start Expo brings the judges, courts, staff, files and clinics to the Tucson Convention Center on a Saturday. There is no charge for the services being provided. Everyone has equal access to the service via a "first come first served" process because everyone waits in line. However, legal services are located on the mezzanine of the Tucson Convention Center so that people seeking legal services can be screened to verify they have a legal need and the type of legal assistance needed can be ascertained. After screening, they are directed to the appropriate legal service.

Everyone has access to all the free resources on the entire first floor of the Tucson Convention Center. It is filled with tables of resource providers offering free information and access to housing, utilities, employment, training program information, educational opportunities, mental and physical health care, clothing, haircuts, food boxes, snacks, childcare, vaccinations, spiritual support, and more. In addition, there is a stage with a full line-up of speakers welcoming and encouraging attendees, i.e. County Attorney Laura Conover, Mayor Regina Romero, faith leaders, singers and musical groups. Individuals are also encouraged to share their stories of their journey through the legal system as well as stories of success or struggles.

Groups and agencies that work directly with people recently released from incarceration are encouraged to bring their clients to the event and to help them through the legal and resource areas. Sample groups participating: Federal Bureau of Prisons on Wilmot, Catholic Community Services Kolbe Society Prison Ministry, Bridge Prison Ministries, The Gate Ministries, One Stop/DES, Adult Probation, Pantano Church, Rights Restoration Clinic, 4Tucson, Homeless ID Project, New Life Transition Program, member groups of the Pima County Reentry Coalition.

The requested RiCO funding of \$5000 will enable ordering and covering the costs of items that need to be pre-ordered, contracted or in place several weeks before the event.


5. Please describe how your initiative will directly assist people from underserved communities and/or those who have been marginalized by a conviction history.

FRESH START EXPO brings resources to the neighborhood accessible to these groups by public transportation or walking. Additionally, all the expensive resources needed to navigate the legal system are offered at no cost to the individual and at a day and time that these groups can access the resources without losing time at work or losing a job. Childcare is provided free by reliable, trained adult staff of the Girl Scouts. The process for accessing resources and legal help is kept simple. There are no fees, admission costs or confusing rules that have to be paid or navigated. Mentors, case managers, and trusted adults are encouraged to accompany clients who are insecure in new environments. All participants are treated with respect and dignity.

As a concession to the trauma that some participants may have suffered through contact with uniformed officers, no uniformed officers will be present on the site or will be part of the security staff.

FRESH START EXPO addresses changes and resources in the judicial system. It does not involve enforcement. Consequently, neither the Pima County Sheriff's Department nor the Tucson Police Department is involved.
