Agenda Item – Discussion/Action on the Pima County Attorney's Office request to utilize Anti-Racketeering Revolving Funds to fund the Barrios Unidos Land Trust's Trunk-or-Treat Event

*Introduction/Background:

Funds are requested in the amount of \$4,983.72 for Barrios Unidos Trunk-or-Treat event to engage with the community in a safe alternative neighborhood celebration in collaboration with TPD in an effort to strengthen the community policing relationship.

*Discussion:

The purpose for the event is to provide a safe and supervised Halloween celebration that brings together neighborhood residents. In collaboration with TPD and their GAIN (Getting Arizona Involved in Neighborhoods) program, Barrio Unidos looks to strengthen the community policing bonds with the neighborhood by offering neighborhood and community events which have a visible law enforcement presence in order to familiarize the community with law enforcement efforts and personnel, and to connect law enforcement with community leaders and effots to strengthen the neighborhood bonds.

*Conclusion:

The event will serve as a way for Barrio Unidos to create a safe and controlled environment for celebrating Halloween as a community, while bridging the gaps of community-based policing and law enforcement policy with those community members who are leading our neighborhoods.

Describe the community-based program for which funds are being sought and how the program benefits the community:

Our barrio team is organizing "Ay Caramba" Trunk or Treat for children/families in our barrios on October 21, 2023, at the Santa Cruz Parish school field from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. (1220 S. 6th Ave). The leaders of the Barrios Unidos Land Trust are active with our Santa Rita Park-West Association barrio association-also serving as officers on the board of directors for many years.

Aside from outreach to our barrio, our team includes outreach to children/residents/schools in our immediate area - South Tucson, South Park and the Vistas. Our families have had little opportunity over several years to interact and engage with each other in a family-friendly, safe environment.

We are planning to organize our Trunk or Treat by recruiting residents and car clubs whose trunks will be decorated and where candy will be given out to the children, prizes for best-decorated trunks, and the event will include music.

Specifically, what law enforcement effort, policy, and/or initiative of this agency does this program support in this community?

The team has partnered with the Tucson Police Department in the area of community policing for several years now in participating in G.A.I.N. (Getting Arizona Involved in Neighborhoods), as well as being participants in community policing with TPD in our barrio. This has helped to get our residents to become more comfortable with TPD in our barrio, they are a welcomed presence here. TPD knows several of our residents by name, as well as being familiar with our businesses.

Involving TPD in our activities helps toward building strong relationships and trust. Having our Trunk or Treat at our church school field builds on that trust and strengthens our relationships with all.

By doing so, it allows children attending our event to feel comfortable with police, as well as their parents as they see police participating first hand in community service in an event all can enjoy.

Describe in detail how this program is supportive of and consistent with this law enforcement agency's efforts, policies, and/or initiatives in the community. What elements of the program specifically enhance or extend the efforts of law enforcement in the community, and how does the program do this?

Children, families witness and experience police being friendly and engaged in our events, the children see the officers giving out candy, grilling hot dogs.....everyone participates in a family-friendly event and celebration. We have also included the Tucson Fire Department as a participant, also handing out candy from a fire truck.

In the years before COVID, TPD would partner with our barrio to bring movie nights to the children. This effort again works toward the children seeing officers as adults they can trust.....friendly and approachable. TPD is in constant communication with our leadership.

For decades, there have been limited opportunities for entertainment and safe activities for children in our barrios. While we are deep-rooted, and respect the investment as made by our parents, grandparents in our barrios ... as with many other neighborhoods, there is crime. With drug activity and other crimes, it has not been safe for children to be outdoors without adult supervision.

The table below identifies the schools in our immediate area which we invite to our Trunk or Treat events; these schools are eligible for the Free and Reduced Meals program.

By continuing to provide a safe and enjoyable environment for our families, our children and families can enjoy safe and fun activities in our own back yard.
