*Title:

Pima County Resolution to Approve Acceptance of Tohono O'odham Nation State-Shared Revenue Program Funds and Pass-Through to additional named awardees.

*Introduction/Background:

As a result of Prop 202, A.R.S. 5-601-02 12% Gaming Distribution, the Tohono O'odham Nation provides grants to cities, towns and counties for services benefiting the general public. The Nation announced awardees on September 5, 2024 via emails to awardees.

*Discussion:

County was provided a list of awardees on September 9, 2024, by email from Matt Smith, liaison to Tohono O'odham Nation. Eleven (11) applicants approved in Resolution 24-51, approved September 3, 2024, were awarded in the amount of \$856,474.50. Seven (7) awarded proposals were not approved on Resolution 24-51.

*Conclusion:

This additional Resolution is for approval to pass through funds to the seven (7) additional named awardees, in the amount of \$503,913.03, for the purpose as stated in submitted proposals.

*Recommendation:

The additional awardees have been vetted and Grants Management and Innovation recommends approval of this additional Resolution for the purpose of passing through the grant funding. This resolution also directs staff to work with the Nation to prepare distribution agreements and authorizes the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to execute all necessary agreements and other documents, if any.

*Fiscal Impact:

The total impact of the 2024 twelve percent (12%) Shared Revenue grant funds to named awardees is \$1,360,387.53.

RESOLUTION 2024 -

PIMA COUNTY RESOLUTION TO APPROVE ACCEPTANCE OF TOHONO O'ODHAM NATION STATE-SHARED REVENUE PROGRAM FUNDS AND PASS-THROUGH TO THE ENTITIES IN PIMA COUNTY SELECTED BY THE TOHONO O'ODHAM NATION

The Board of Supervisors of Pima County, Arizona finds:

- 1. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 5-601.02, the Tohono O'odham Nation ("the Nation") and the State of Arizona have entered into a compact requiring a certain portion of funds generated from gaming operations of the Nation be distributed to governments or 50l(c)(3) organizations or entities for services benefitting the general public, including public safety, promotion of commerce and economic development ("State-Shared Revenue Program").
- 2. The Nation published a Request for Proposals from Arizona cities, towns, counties, and non-profit organizations for the Nation's 2024 State-Shared Revenue Program. Proposals were due June 7, 2024.
- 3. On September 3, 2024, Resolution 24-51 (attached) was executed by the Board of Supervisors to accept funds for entities named on the known Applicant List.
- 4. On September 9, 2024, Pima County Grants Management and Innovation received the list of awardees from Tohono O'odham Nation. Seven (7) proposals were awarded funding that were not included on the known Applicant List.
- 5. All non-profit organizations selected for the 2024 State-Shared Revenue Program must enter an agreement with a city, town, or county to act as a fiscal agent to accept the funds from the Nation on behalf of the non-profit organization. In addition, the County and the Nation must negotiate and execute a Grant-in-Aid agreement for the purpose of passing through funding to named awardees.
- 6. This resolution will ensure County is able to facilitate the necessary agreements for the additional seven (7) awardees in attached list. The Nations' timeline requires agreements to be completed by November 30, 2024.
- 7. It is in the best interests of the residents of Pima County to accept all State-Shared Revenue Program funds for the County and for non-profit organizations selected by the Nation who want County to serve as their fiscal agent to pass-through those funds for the purposes established by the Nation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that:

A. Staff are directed to work with the Nation to prepare the agreements for the distribution of State-Shared Revenue Program funds to the additional Grantees selected by the Nation.

	3. The Chair of the Board of Supervisors is authorized to execute all necessary agreements and other documents, if any, with the Nation to accept and pass-through State-Shared Revenue program funds to Grantees.
