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Dear County Administrators,

Pima County misspent nearly \$875,000 of federal program money and is now on the hook to pay it back -- with our tax dollars. These were mistakes made by highly compensated administrators, some earning nearly three times the average rate for a county government employee. To make matters more difficult to track, the reimbursement is being pulled from the General Fund rather than the budget where the spending originated, effectively obscuring the money trail.

The General Fund carries a required minimum balance set by the Board of Supervisors, and this is at least the third time this year that balance has been drawn down. Adding to the concern, Item 28 on this same agenda would take another \$100,000 from the General Fund to give to Catholic Community Services -- the same organization that received payments through the asylum seeker program. Residents should expect more General Fund adjustments as the fiscal year winds down.

It is worth noting that Item 32 on this week's agenda involves the sale of County land to Project Blue for \$20,855,849. That revenue should be directed toward replenishing the General Fund reserves first, before any new spending is approved.
