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Priorities of the Office of Housing Opportunities & Homeless Solutions



<u>Priority No. 1</u>: Inventory existing County and partner programs addressing homeless / at-risk populations.



<u>Priority No. 2</u>: Describe and illustrate the homeless response system and care coordination.

<u>Priority No. 3</u>: Develop County and public-facing communication strategies to enable individuals to understand where and how to access information and resources.

<u>Priority No. 4</u>: Develop a Strategic and Continuous Improvement Plan with the goal of ensuring County programming is responsive, sustainable, and equitably distributed.

<u>Priority No. 5</u>: Develop means of tracking the efficacy of County assistance programs and work with departments and partner agencies and governments to develop attainable measure of success.

Regional Planning Body


Establishes a body for regional homelessness strategies

Coordinated Entry


Manages a process to assess, prioritize, and match clients to housing





What is TPCH?

Our Continuum of Care is locally known as Tucson Pima Collaboration to end Homelessness (TPCH)





Five Pillars of Responsibility



Resource **Allocation**

Planning, ranking, and rating of CoC and YHDP grant applications.



Needs **Assessment**

Assessing community needs through data and gaps analysis



Planning

Developing strategic plans, policies, and processes to address homelessness.



Evaluation

Assessing the effectiveness of current strategies necessary support through monitoring, and evaluation against performance metrics.




Infrastructure

Youth in Imminent
Risk of Homelessness

18-24 year olds facing housing loss in the next 14 days

Fleeing Domestic Violence

Or attempting to flee, and lacking resources for housing.


