### Re: Board of Supervisors March 1, 2022 Consent Agenda Item 4

Supervisor Christy requested supplemental information regarding the range of contracting activity with Partners In Health. Attached please find a detailed summary from Dr. Cullen that describes both contractual and non-contractual collaborations between the Public Health Department including the value of such contracts, and a description of the individual scopes of work.

Currently the County has three federal and state multi-year contracts approved by the Board and valued at \$22.9 million. These are intended to support COVID-19 testing and vaccination in school settings, underserved communities, and across the community. Partners In Health is providing technical assistance and support for some of these activities via these three subcontracts with a total value of \$974,000 or 4.2 percent of the total awarded amount.

Significantly, this contractor has invested \$438,845 of its own separately contracted federal resources in Pima County in support of COVID-19 mitigation in vulnerable communities. This support was provided to the Sunnyside Foundation, Tucson Indian Center, and other local entities and was in coordination with the Health Department.

Partners In Health has been a valuable asset and well-performing contractor that brings value to COVID-19 prevention activities in Pima County.

### **Re:** Request for Information – Partners In Health Subcontracts

**Background**: During the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, Pima County Health Department (PCHD) sought new, innovative opportunities to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 in Pima County by partnering and collaborating with local and national organizations to help us identify best practices, models and systems. Partners In Health (PIH) National Learning Collaborative, in which PCHD is a member, assisted us with the tasks listed above. As a member of the learning collaborative, we recognized the value, knowledge and expertise PIH offered, and therefore requested technical assistance, support and guidance for contact tracing and care coordination design and implementation. A formal contractual agreement for this assistance (at no cost to Pima County) was created, effective July 7, 2020 – April 30, 2023.

In addition to the work above, PIH's RECOVER (Reaching Equity through Community-based Vaccination Engagement and Resourcing) initiative, funded via a Health Resources and Services Administration grant (HRSA-21-136), has allocated over \$438,845 to Pima County communities over the last 6 months through sub-contracts with the following community based organizations:

- Tucson Indian Center \$130,000
- ACE/LUCHA \$102,452
- Sunnyside Foundation \$206,393

**PCHD Grant Opportunities and Funding:** In the Spring/Summer of 2021, PCHD was presented with three unique, non-competitive opportunities to obtain grant funding to further Pima County's COVID-19 mitigation strategies and address health disparities; The National Initiative to Address COVID-19 Health Disparities, funded by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), and two funding opportunities from the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS), one to address COVID-19 Vaccine Equity and another to support K-12 School Reopening Programs and enhance PCHD's Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity (ELC).

Strategies under these funding sources required the mobilization of partners and collaborators to advance health equity and address social determinants of health as they relate to COVID-19 health disparities among populations at higher risk and that are underserved.

In an effort to sustain the work cited above and leverage PIH's expertise in building equity-first programming, data-driven practices, and high-quality strategy implementation, PCHD identified PIH as a funded partner for these grants.

Please refer to Attachment 1 for information related to each grant, including the total award received by PCHD, amount awarded to PIH, PIH Scope of Work, anticipated outcomes, PIH tasks/deliverables and PIH outputs to date, in addition to the percent of each award subcontracted to PIH.
