Dear Board Members, I'm writing to ask that the Pima County Board of Supervisors adopt the county-wide mask mandate for indoor public spaces as outlined in Resolution 2021-87.

It is proven that masking indoors decreases COVID-19 transmission rates [1]. It is, at most, an inconvenience that the community can quickly implement to keep businesses and schools humming along. There is no chance of vaccinating our way out of this variant.

Teachers and parents in Pima County schools with mask-optional policies have experienced unprecedented stress and anxiety. We have spent the past twenty weeks dealing with exposure quarantines and classroom closures. A county-wide mask mandate would provide some bare minimum mitigation in some Pima County schools.

The correlation between school districts with mask-optional policies and school districts with employee and substitute shortages shows a solid cause-and-effect relationship. Superintendents of mask-optional school districts have previously disclosed that they do not want help from the county, and clearly, they need help retaining employees and to keep children safe.

The implication of not following public health policy of multi-layer mitigation strategies has placed the burden on already-taxed parents and teachers stressed to the max. Parents of children with medically fragile children cannot be guaranteed that schools can keep their children safe. Ultimately, parents have no option but to withdraw their children from public school and begin homeschooling.

With the first case of Omicron detected on November 27th in the UK, today, the UK reported 90,000 cases. Pima County is still experiencing high community transmission with Delta, and the Omicron variant was just identified in Pima County this week. The concern is that the transmission rate of Omicron can easily overwhelm the hospital system. With Omicron R naught value estimated to be 3-4 times higher than Delta, we must be proactive in dampening the spread.

Preliminary data shows that twice vaccinated and boosted offers the best protection against

Omicron. However, monoclonal antibodies and the Regeneron antibody cocktail are ineffective against the Omicron variant, and the Sotrovimab monoclonal antibody is in short supply.

Pima County Supervisors have the opportunity to be proactive in slowing the spread of Omicron, preventing the healthcare system from being overwhelmed, and keeping our community safe.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) will no longer recognize **PCR tests** as valid methods of diagnosing COVID-19 by the end of this year. The CDC announced in a **lab alert** on its website that it will be withdrawing its standing request to the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to grant emergency use authorization for PCR tests to be used to detect SARS-CoV-2. The request, which was issued in February 2020, will be withdrawn on December 31, 2021, a move which signals that the CDC no longer approves of the use of PCR tests as valid diagnostic methods for COVID-19.

In the CDC's own words: "After December 31, 2021, CDC will withdraw the request to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) of the CDC 2019-Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) Real-Time RT-PCR Diagnostic Panel, the assay first introduced in February 2020 for detection of SARS-CoV-2 only."

In the summer of 2018, I fainted—rather unexpectedly—after climbing the stairs at the Park Place movie theater. A week later, I was meeting with a [REDACTED]. A week after that, I was undergoing [REDACTED] that had, unexpectedly, taken a rapid turn for the worse.

My [REDACTED] was technically elective, but nonetheless urgent. When the [REDACTED], he discovered my [REDACTED] was in even worse shape than we'd thought, bad enough shape that it pretty much fell apart even as he removed it. Had we delayed [REDACTED] I might not be here to tell you about it.

Yet if I needed [REDACTED] today, it almost certainly *would* be delayed.

Thanks to Covid 19, our hospitals are near capacity. Procedures are getting put off, and even emergency patients are waiting for beds. Non-emergency patients who nonetheless have urgent, even life-threatening needs like I did? Who knows how long they're waiting.

Who knows how many of them, after waiting too long, won't make it.

It's only going to get worse. Experts agree that we're on the brink of a Covid19 surge that will stress our already near-capacity hospitals past breaking. When that happens, people—many with ordinarily treatable, correctable medical conditions—will die.

We have both a moral and practical obligation to reduce the harm done by the coming surge. It's past time for the county to start taking Covid19 mitigation seriously.

We need countywide a mask mandate now.



To Clerk of the Board (for Inclusion in The December 21 Meeting Minutes) Although I thought the issue of mandatory masking had been settled, apparently that is not the case. Therefore I am writing again to let you know that I do not support such a mandate. Are there any scientific reasons to mask? No. Random clinical trials have concluded there is no scientific evidence supporting facemasks' efficacy. They do not prevent people from exposure and infection with this or any virus. All masking seems to be good at doing is helping people feel like they have some control over this supposed pandemic and COVID-19. It has become a security blanket and/or pacifier for those who are so frightened about a virus that is less deadly than the flu for which no masking is required except during the 1918-1919 influenza pandemic and they did not work then either. Masks have been shown through overwhelming clinical evidence to have no effect against transmission of viral pathogens. Remember the SARS-CoV.2 virus is smaller than the pores in the masks so masks cannot filter out the virus whether you are coughing out viral particles or someone else is. The virus is everywhere now, so it is no surprise that the outside of the masks can become colonized with the virus from the environment and as a masked individual breathes drawing in air while talking or simply breathing, they are pulling in portions of the mask colonized with the virus. The bacteria (normal oral flora) found in the upper respiratory tract of humans increases in number when wearing a mask. The inner side of the mask becomes colonized with the bacteria which are breathed back into the individual. These bacteria as they concentrate can move from the upper respiratory tract down into the lower respiratory tract, the lungs, and cause secondary infections. This increase in bacteria can also cause more dental caries, gum disease, and abscess over time. How many people change their masks or clean them regularly? How many people adjust the mask, touching the outside of it or pulling it up and down, taking it off and putting it back on? They are handling the mask with contaminated fingers gloved or otherwise, contaminating the mask that is supposed to protect them. The best way to cut down on viral transmission is to practice good hygiene. Wash your hands

With the first case of Omicron detected on November 27th in the UK, today, the UK reported 90,000 cases. The concern is that the transmission rate of Omicron can easily overwhelm the hospital system. With Omicron R naught value estimated to be 3-4 times higher than Delta, we must be proactive in dampening the spread.

Preliminary data shows that twice vaccinated and boosted offers the best protection against

Omicron. However, monoclonal antibodies and the Regeneron antibody cocktail are ineffective against the Omicron variant, and the Sotrovimab monoclonal antibody is in short supply.

Pima County Supervisors have the opportunity to be proactive in slowing the spread of Omicron, preventing the healthcare system from being overwhelmed, and keeping our community safe.

Dear Board Members,

I'm writing to ask that the Pima County Board of Supervisors adopt the county-wide mask mandate for indoor public spaces as outlined in Resolution 2021-87.

It is proven that masking indoors decreases COVID-19 transmission rates [1]. It is, at most, an inconvenience that the community can quickly implement to keep businesses and schools humming along. There is no chance of vaccinating our way out of this variant.

Teachers and parents in Pima County schools with mask-optional policies have experienced unprecedented stress and anxiety. We have spent the past twenty weeks dealing with exposure quarantines and classroom closures. A county-wide mask mandate would provide some bare minimum mitigation in some Pima County schools.

The correlation that school districts with mask-optional policies with employee and substitute shortages are a solid cause-and-effect relationship. Superintendents of mask-optional school districts have previously disclosed that they do not want help from the county, and clearly, they need help retaining employees and to keep children safe.

The implication of not following public health policy of multi-layer mitigation strategies has placed the burden on already-taxed parents and teachers stressed to the max. Parents of children with medically fragile children cannot be guaranteed that schools can keep their children safe. Ultimately, parents have no option but to withdraw their children from public school and begin homeschooling.

With the first case of Omicron detected on November 27th in the UK, today, the UK reported 90,000 cases. Pima County is still experiencing high community transmission with Delta, and the Omicron variant was just identified in Pima County this week. The concern is that the transmission rate of Omicron can easily overwhelm the hospital system. With Omicron R naught value estimated to be 3-4 times higher than Delta, we must be proactive in dampening the spread.




I am emailing you all to implore you not to impose mask requirements on our county. The masks are doing more harm than good.

Dear Supervisors,

In the summer of 2018, I fainted—rather unexpectedly—after climbing the stairs at the Park Place movie theater. A week later, I was meeting with a cardiac surgeon. A week after that, I was undergoing open heart surgery for a congenital heart valve defect that had, unexpectedly, taken a rapid turn for the worse.

My surgery was technically elective, but nonetheless urgent. When the surgeon operated, he discovered my failing valve was in even worse shape than we'd thought, bad enough shape that it pretty much fell apart even as he removed it. Had we delayed my surgery—delayed replacing that valve—I might not be here to tell you about it.

Yet if I needed heart valve replacement surgery today, it almost certainly *would* be delayed.

Thanks to Covid 19, our hospitals are near capacity. Procedures are getting put off, and even emergency patients are waiting for beds. Non-emergency patients who nonetheless have urgent, even life-threatening needs like I did? Who knows how long they're waiting.

Who knows how many of them, after waiting too long, won't make it.

It's only going to get worse. Experts agree that we're on the brink of a Covid19 surge that will stress our already near-capacity hospitals past breaking. When that happens, people—many with ordinarily treatable, correctable medical conditions—will die.

We have both a moral and practical obligation to reduce the harm done by the coming surge. It's past time for the county to start taking Covid19 mitigation seriously.

We need countywide a mask mandate now.

Dear Board Members, I'm writing to ask that the Pima County Board of Supervisors adopt the county-wide mask mandate for indoor public spaces as outlined in Resolution 2021-87.

It is proven that masking indoors decreases COVID-19 transmission rates [1]. It is, at most, an inconvenience that the community can quickly implement to keep businesses and schools humming along. There is no chance of vaccinating our way out of this variant.

Teachers and parents in Pima County schools with mask-optional policies have experienced unprecedented stress and anxiety. We have spent the past twenty weeks dealing with exposure quarantines and classroom closures. A county-wide mask mandate would provide some bare minimum mitigation in some Pima County schools.

The correlation between school districts with mask-optional policies and school districts with employee and substitute shortages shows a solid cause-and-effect relationship. Superintendents of mask-optional school districts have previously disclosed that they do not want help from the county, and clearly, they need help retaining employees and to keep children safe.

The implication of not following public health

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policy of multi-layer mitigation strategies has placed the burden on already-taxed parents and teachers stressed to the max. Parents of children with medically fragile children cannot be guaranteed that schools can keep their children safe. Ultimately, parents have no option but to withdraw their children from public school and begin homeschooling.

With the first case of Omicron detected on November 27th in the UK, today, the UK reported 90,000 cases. Pima County is still experiencing high community transmission with Delta, and the Omicron variant was just identified in Pima County this week. The concern is that the transmission rate of Omicron can easily overwhelm the hospital system. With Omicron R naught value estimated to be 3-4 times higher than Delta, we must be proactive in dampening the spread.

Preliminary data shows that twice vaccinated and boosted offers the best protection against Omicron. However, monoclonal antibodies and the Regeneron antibody cocktail are ineffective against the Omicron variant, and the Sotrovimab monoclonal antibody is in short supply.

Pima County Supervisors have the opportunity to be proactive in slowing the spread of Omicron, preventing the healthcare system from being overwhelmed, and keeping our community safe.

To Pima County:

I am sending you this notice, related to Pima County mask mandate policy. My findings raise significant concerns, both medically and legally, of the current mask policy in place. Masks are ineffective for the purpose claimed by the mandate, potentially harmful, and only authorized for use by an EUA.

Masks are ineffective and in many ways they harm.

It's a myth that masks prevent viruses from spreading. The overall evidence is clear: Standard cloth and surgical masks offer next to no protection against virus-sized particles or small aerosols.¹

There has been one large randomized controlled trial that specifically examined whether masks protect their wearers from the coronavirus. This study found mask wearing "did not reduce, at conventional levels of statistical significance, the incidence of Sars-Cov-2-infection."³

The size of a virus particle is much too small to be stopped by a surgical mask, cloth or bandana. A single virion of SARS-CoV-2 is about 60-140 nanometers or 0.1 microns.² The pore size in a surgical mask is 200-1000x that size. Consider that the CDC website states, "surgical masks do not catch all harmful particles in smoke." And that the size of smoke particles in a wildfire are ~0.5 microns which is 5x the size of the SARS-CoV-2 virus!

Wearing a mask to prevent catching SARS-CoV-2, or similarly sized influenza, is like throwing sand at a chain-link fence: it doesn't work.

Consider also, that the existence of more particles does not mean more virus. Research shows less virus does not mean less illness. Dr. Kevin Fennelly, a pulmonologist at the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute, debunked the view that larger droplets are responsible for viral transmission.

Fennelly wrote:

"current infection control policies are based on the premise that most respiratory infections are transmitted by large respiratory droplets- i.e., larger than 5 [microns] – produced by coughing and sneezing, ...Unfortunately, that premise is wrong."⁴

Fennelly referenced a 1953 paper on anthrax that showed a single bacterial spore of about one micron was significantly more lethal than larger clumps of spores.⁵ Exposure to one virus particle is theoretically enough to cause infection and subsequent disease. This is not an alarming thought - it simply means what it has always meant, that our immune system protects us continually all our life.⁶

There have been hundreds of mask studies related to influenza transmission done over several

Related to the 1918-1919 influenza pandemic, there was almost universal agreement among experts, that deaths were virtually never caused by the influenza virus itself but resulted directly from severe secondary pneumonia caused by well-known bacterial “pneumopathogens” that colonized the upper respiratory tract.⁹ Dr. Fauci and his National Institute of Health studied pandemics and epidemics and concluded, “the vast majority of influenza deaths resulted from secondary bacterial pneumonia.”¹⁰

All parties mandating the use of facemasks are not only willfully ignoring established science but are engaging in what amounts to a clinical experimental trial. This conclusion is reached by the fact that facemask use and Covid-19 incidence are being reported in scientific *opinion* pieces promoted by the CDC and others.¹¹ The fact is **after reviewing ALL of the studies worldwide, the CDC found “no reduction in viral transmission with the use of face masks.”**¹²

Any intervention, especially one that is prophylactic, must cause fewer harms to the recipient than the infection. The cost-benefit of mandating an investigational face-covering with emerging safety issues is especially difficult to justify. Anthony Fauci was very clear that asymptomatic transmission was not a threat. He stated, “in all the history of respiratory-borne viruses of any type, asymptomatic transmission has never been the driver of outbreaks. The driver of outbreaks is always a symptomatic person.”¹³

Wearing respirators come(s) with a host of physiological and psychological burdens. These can interfere with task performances and reduce work efficiency. These burdens can even be severe enough to cause life-threatening conditions if not ameliorated.¹⁴ Fifteen years ago, National Taiwan University Hospital concluded that the use of N-95 masks in healthcare workers caused them to experience hypoxemia, a low level of oxygen in the blood, and hypercapnia, an elevation in the blood's carbon dioxide levels.¹⁵ Studies of simple surgical masks found significant reductions in blood oxygen as well. In one particular study, researchers measured blood oxygenation before and after surgeries in 53 surgeons. Researchers found the mask reduced the blood oxygen levels significantly, and the longer the duration of wearing the mask, the greater the drop in blood oxygen levels.¹⁶

Moreover, people with cancer will be at a further risk from hypoxia, as cancer cells grow best in a bodily environment that is low in oxygen. Low oxygen also promotes systemic inflammation which, in turn, promotes “the growth, invasion and spread of cancers.”¹⁷ Repeated episodes of low oxygen, known as intermittent hypoxia, also “causes atherosclerosis” and hence increases “all cardiovascular events” such as heart attacks, as well as adverse cerebral events like stroke.¹⁸

Informed consent is required for investigational medical therapies.

Regardless of the lack of safety and efficacy behind the decision to require employees to wear a mask, it is illegal to mandate EUA approved investigational medical therapies without informed consent. Mask use for viral transmission prevention is authorized for Emergency Use only.¹⁹ Emergency Use Authorization by the FDA, means “the products are investigational and experimental” only.²⁰ The statute granting the FDA the power to authorize a medical product of

emergency use requires that the person being administered the unapproved product be advised of his or her right to refuse administration of the product.²¹ This statute further recognizes the well-settled doctrine that medical experiments, or “clinical research,” may not be performed on human subjects without the express, informed consent of the individual receiving treatment.²²

The right to avoid the imposition of human experimentation is fundamental, rooted in the Nuremberg Code of 1947, has been ratified by the 1964 Declaration of Helsinki, and further codified in the United States Code of Federal Regulations. In addition to the United States regarding itself as bound by these provisions, these principles were adopted by the FDA in its regulations requiring the informed consent of human subjects for medical research.²³ Add State info here if possible. The law is very clear; It is unlawful to conduct medical research (even in the case of emergency), unless steps taken to ... secure informed consent of all participants.²⁴ Furthermore, by requiring employees to wear a mask, you are promoting the idea that the mask can prevent or treat a disease, which is an illegal deceptive practice. The FDA EUA for surgical and/or cloth masks explicitly states, "the labeling must not state or imply... that the [mask] is intended for antimicrobial or antiviral protection or related, or for use such as infection prevention or reduction."²⁶ As you can see from the image below, masks do not claim to keep out viruses. product or service can prevent...disease unless you possess competent and reliable scientific evidence... substantiating that the claims are true.²⁵

Illegally mandating an investigational medical therapy generates liability.

There are proven microbial challenges as well as breathing difficulties that are created and exacerbated by extended mask-wearing.

Requiring employees to wear a mask sets the stage for contracting any infection, including COVID-19, and making the consequences of that infection much graver. In essence, a mask may very well put us at an increased risk of infection, and if so, having a far worse outcome.²⁷

The fact that mask wearing presents a severe risk of harm to the wearer should – standing alone – not be required for employees, particularly given that we are not ill and have done nothing wrong that would warrant an infringement of our constitutional rights and bodily autonomy. Promoting use of a non-FDA approved, Emergency Use Authorized mask, is unwarranted and illegal. This mandate is in direct conflict with Section 360bbb-36(1)(A)(ii)(I-III), which requires the wearer to be informed of the option to refuse the wearing of such "device." Misrepresenting the use of a mask as being intended for antimicrobial or antiviral protection, and/or misrepresenting masks for use as infection prevention or reduction is a deceptive practice under the FTC. It is clear, there is no waiver of liability under deceptive practices, even under a state of emergency. As such, forcing employees to wear masks, or similarly forcing use any other non-FDA approved medical product without the wearer's consent, is illegal and immoral.

This letter serves as official notice that I do not consent to being forced to wear a mask. I will not fail to take the maximum action permissible under the law against your organization, and against you personally.

Accordingly, I urge you to comply with Federal and State law, and advise employees they have a right to refuse or wear a mask as a measure to prevent or reduce infection from Covid-19. Any other course of action is contrary to the law. I am willing to testify as to the veracity of the contents in this document. Please confirm no further pressure will be exerted upon me to follow this illegal mask mandate, and that I will not face any retaliatory disciplinary action.
