Pima county has 9,189 square miles. The present 232 locations yields 39.6 square miles per voting location. Only 100 voting locations would yield 91.9 square miles per voting location. My concerns involve the proposed change to centralized Voting Centers and the use of Electronic Pollbooks

A move to centralized voting centers will make getting out to vote more difficult for some Pima County voters — particularly for those who may not have the ability to easily reach a polling center (vs. the one that's in their precinct and closer to home.) This can lower voter turnout!

Electronic Pollbooks are prone to malfunctioning and can be vulnerable to Internet-based attacks. Who pays the penalty if, for instance, a device malfunction interrupts the check-in process or, even worse, a data breach occurs involving personally identifiable information collected on these devices? You and your fellow voters do.

United States elections should be decentralized, accessible, and accountable. We can maintain this standard in Pima County by ensuring that local precinct voting locations aren't consolidated, and by continuing the use of paper Pollbooks.
