Vote Centers are a great idea for Pima County. After a record turnout and one of the cleanest elections in history in 2020, we need to continue that progress. I've listed several of the many reasons they should be instituted. I've worked at polling locations many times and I can personally see how every one of these reasons is legitimate.

- There will be no more sending people to a different polling location because they aren't at the right
- Check in time will go from 3 minutes to 30 seconds
- It eliminates the possibility that someone could vote twice
  - Voter is automatically checked in and cannot vote again
  - Human error of marking the wrong line for a voter is eliminated
- Ballots are only printed as someone checks in. Someone being able to print a stack of ballots and stuff the box is impossible.
- Eliminates the need to print ballots for each voting location ahead of time. The ballot style is printed for each voter, therefore there are no blank ballots at the polls or unvoted ballots after the election.
- Poll workers will be able to tell if a person voted their early ballot and will only issue a provisional if the record shows that the voter's ballot was already returned and verified
- · Check-in as outlined above is automated
- System will bring up the exact voter
- Eliminates people signing on the wrong line
- Voters less agitated by outdated processes that take time and are inconvenient
- Voter confidence is increased by automated processes
- Saves time
- Half the amount of logistics on Election Day with less locations & automated processes
- 83% less provisional ballot processing. Processing time after the election is over will be significantly shorter due to 83% decrease in provisional ballots. In most years, processing provisional ballots takes close to or at the deadline of 10 days after each general election. Due to the amount of time it takes to process provisional ballots, Pima County is almost always the last county to finalize results and one of the only counties to go right to the deadline.

Supervisors,

We all remember the images of women in full body coverings holding up ink-stained fingers. You didn't need to be supporter of the Iraq or Afghanistan Wars to be moved by those images... Images that spoke of the most basic of human needs... the need to be heard... that my voice matters!

We speak about the Right to Vote but in a free, self-governing society. We forget there is another component that goes with that Right... The Responsibility to Vote. In the US, voting has evolved over the last 246 years, but one thing has remained constant. In casting our ballots, we are reaffirming our process of voting. A process of choosing who will represent us in governing. The systems we use are supposed to be designed to maintain the Checks and Balances inherent in our Constitutional Republic. In the State of Arizona, the system is designed to maintain the Separation of Powers by having the Election process be shared by different Election officials.

As the Pima County Board of Supervisors your responsibility is clear. You are the folks designated to maintain the basic mechanics of the election process in Pima County. Through the Elections Department you administer the balloting process from end to end... from the printing of the ballot right on through final tabulation and publishing a canvas of the results. Your duty is to maintain the systems to allow for the full expression of the Right to Vote... but in your haste to be more efficient and speedier you are sacrificing your responsibilities and endangering the civic health of our community.

When a citizen votes, they don't just fill in the bubbles on the ballot. Able bodied citizens have a responsibility to publicly affirm the process. This does not mean we do away with the traditional reasons for casting an absentee ballot. If you are unable to get to a polling location in your neighborhood the law allows you to cast an absentee ballot. What we cannot forget is the reason why casting a ballot in person is so critical to the maintenance of our civic culture.

What other Right do citizens have that has a regular appointment to exercise their Constitutional Rights as when they vote? The public affirmation of voting is done in front of your neighbors and fellow citizens at the local, neighborhood level. In a representative form of government this means that the citizens of a given area come together and vote for the person that votes for laws on their behalf. They are voting for their neighborhood community representation. Doing so in their local precinct... together and witnessed by their fellow citizens is a necessity and has a healthy and reinforcing action to our civic culture. This community

action can only occur when voting happens in your local neighborhood precinct. It cannot be done by community wide Mail-in Voting nor by large Vote Centers.

We vote according to our individual thoughts and ideas about the ballot contests in the privacy of the voting booth. When we are done, we insert the ballot in the ballot box because this simple, public act does remind both the citizen and the government officials present that it is the citizen that is in charge. This action endorses our system of voting for our representatives and helps to maintain our civic culture. It reaffirms why it is necessary to come together as a local community to vote for OUR representatives... and that voting is publicly witnessed by our neighbors.

The use of a Vote Centers denies the citizens the opportunity to have their public affirmation of the voting process remain at the local level. While a Vote Center may be more efficient, it distances both the neighbors in a community from one another and dilutes the power of the public affirmation at the local level. In the end the only true beneficiary would seem to be the bureaucracy.

In your rush to make speed or convenience the goal, you will sacrifice the very personal reminder to our neighbors that we are voting for our local representatives. You will be further distancing the citizens from the government. This is a recipe for disaster.

Your job as the Board of Supervisors is to maintain not just the machinery of our elections but to guard against any loss of the strength of our voting systems. The first duty of government is to protect the Rights of the Citizens. This is enshrined in both the Arizona and US Constitutions. Like those burka clad women, the citizens of Pima County need their voices to be heard. Not just in this November's election... but in every election. But your haste would seem to make voting in Pima County more of a bureau cratic function and less a Right... You would in fact be saying our voices don't matter.



Dear Board of Supervisors,

I am writing to you regarding the vote tomorrow to reduce our 232 voting precincts to 100 vote centers and switching to a "print on demand" service. I would like to express concern that reducing polling places by more than 50% would actually make it harder for registered voters to locate a "new" location and significantly increase wait times, thus discouraging some voters to exercise their fundamental right to vote.

I would like you to address how a "print on demand" service is compliant with Arizona Revised Statutes (ARS) 16-508 and 16-509. I have typed them below for your reference.

16-508. Number of ballots furnished each polling place - There shall be furnished for each precinct in which an election is to be held a number of early ballots and printed ballots exceeding by at least one per cent the number of registered voters whose names appear on the precinct register of the precinct, city, town or district for which the ballots are printed.

16-509. Delivery of ballots to election officers - The board of supervisors, city or town clerk or governing body of a special district shall deliver, by mail or other reliable method, to each voting precinct or to the inspector of each election board as determined by the officer in charge of elections one package containing the required number of ballots, at least forty-eight hours before the hour for opening the polls on election day, unless prevented by some unavoidable delay or accident which shall be established by affidavit of election officers or bearers of ballots. The official ballots shall be sent in sealed packages with marks on the outside of the package clearly designating the polling place for which they are intended and the number of ballots enclosed. Upon delivery of the package to him, the inspector shall return receipts therefor to the person from whom received.

In summary, ARS 16-508 and 16-509 state that there must be enough ballots printed that exceed by at least one percent of the number of registered voters and delivered to each voting precinct at least 48 hours before the opening hour on election day. Therefore, wouldn't a "print on demand" service be in violation of ARS 16-508 and 16-509 due to actual ballots not being printed and delivered at least 48 hours before any election?

We the People of Pima County have a right to a secure and certifiable election, and we are watching to make sure our voting process remains secure, accessible, and compliant with our AZ laws.

Board of Supervisors and County Administrator Huckleberry:

It is not surprising that much thought has been put into the election process since the 2020 election, what is surprising is that our local election officials are considering further detrimental actions to dis-enfranchise the voters again. Reducing voting locations which extends travel to cast a ballot will result in extended wait times.

I have been a poll WORKER for Pima County Elections, in a Republican majority precinct that is always staffed with D (Democrat) and PND (party not declared) workers. In the 2020 primary & general election the only Republicans working at this polling location were myself and my friend (which I recruited for Marshall) in this majority REPUBLICAN PRECINCT staffing without proper party representation is not acceptable. I cannot imagine how you will staff these "voting centers" - PND (party not determined) is not a recognized party and as workers this class of voter should not outnumber the recognized party worker representation at the precinct polls.

- 1. Local precinct polling locations offer greater voter integrity and security. The poll workers should be from and know the community.

- 3. Oversight, with trained poll workers from recognized parties provide transparency in election processes which is imperative.
- 4. Based on experience, the ipod/electronic tablets have been used with hotspots in the polling locations to update Printed Poll Books at Precincts up to the day of the Election. Many issues were not addressed and required voters to vote as Provisional Ballots, not to mention internet access to voter data via hotspot is concerning already.
- 5. Electronic devices to control voter data is not transparency, as a Signature Room Observer I witnessed the digital signatures for early ballots. This process compared digital signatures of the voter, several I witnessed were nothing alike. When the Provisional Ballots and Election Day ballots were observed the Recorders office election workers used the handwritten poll books to review signatures. The handwritten poll books usually produced clearer handwritten signatures that could be verified more easily. These records provide transparency and can be verified without electronic means.

The public has been educated and are aware of the election issues and problems we face, now more than ever. You can hide behind plastic partitions and Zoom meetings but not without the oversight from the public. At some time, you will be held accountable for your actions by the voters in Pima County. ### Dear Supervisors:

I have been an Election Board member for 20 years worth of elections in Pima County and in other states. In 2020 I was an Inspector for the Primary and General Elections. I am very concerned about the Pima County Elections Department's and Recorder's Office's proposal to implement Voting Centers, Electronic Pollbooks and Ballot Printers.

Our Mission as Election Officials is to implement a free and fair election in which the citizens of Pima County can believe and can accept the results.

I am concerned this mission is in serious jeopardy. Roughly four months before the 2022 voting season begins, the Elections Department and the Recorder's Office want to:

- Create Voting Centers and reduce the number of Voting Locations from 232 to 100 in the entire county. This is a <u>57% reduction</u> and does not take into account the 30 new precincts that were recently proposed during the last BOS meeting. This would also REVERSE THE DECISION THAT THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TOOK LAST SEPTEMBER TO KEEP THE NUMBER OF PRECINCTS AT 249.
- Install new voting equipment in the Voting Centers including Federally uncertified Electronic Pollbooks (tablets with access to the county's Voter Rolls) from Apple that are connected to Amazon Web Services as well as ballot printing devices. They want to turn over the security of Pima County elections to 3rd party vendors AWS, Cisco and Tenex Software Solutions.
- 3. Change the rules of operation for voters and poll workers.

### ALL AT ONCE! BY JULY 6, 2022!

In my experience, Voter Confidence in our Elections is a big serious problem.

a. This Proposal does nothing to increase Pima County's Voters' confidence in our Elections. In fact it DECREASES them. Voters are extremely concerned about any system that is remotely connected

to other systems. ANY SYSTEM CAN FAIL OR BE HACKED. No vendor can guarantee 100% uptime. Pima County will need paper ballots and paper rosters as back up to keep the Election going.

- b. Most Pima County Voters are aware that Maricopa County conducted an election in 2020 with questionable results. They consolidated voting locations into Voting Centers and used Electronic Poll Books and Ballot Printers. Real problems were discovered as a result of the Maricopa County Audit in 2021. There are **37 Election Integrity Bills** currently in the State Legislature to fix many of these problems. Among them are bills mandating, statewide, MORE PRECINCTS, LESS TECHNOLOGY, HIGHER SECURITY, BETTER VOTER ROLL MAINTENANCE, AND, MORE SCRUTINY BY ELECTION OFFICIALS AND OBSERVERS.
- c. There are many moving parts to an Election on the actual Election Day. My experience working in the polls has shown me that there are MANY misunderstandings among Poll Workers of Election Laws as written in ARS 16 Arizona's Election Code.

### For example:

- What kind of Identification is required to vote?
- Who is allowed to deliver an Early Ballot or Ballots to the polling location? (only relatives and housemates, NOT curbside "runners")
- What happens if I make a mistake on my ballot?
- Why does the Precinct Roster say that this voter was mailed an Early Ballot when they NEVER HAVE ASKED FOR ONE? EVER.
- How many Democrats and Republicans are supposed to be on the Election Board at the Poll Location?
- Why can't a voter walk into a Poll wearing a candidate hat or talk about candidates? What do the Poll Workers do?
- Why can't Poll Workers NOT talk about politics or candidates in the Polls?
- Who can a Partisan Poll Watcher talk to in a Polling Location? (The Inspector)
- Who has the authority to challenge a voter and how is that done?

NONE OF THESE QUESTIONS ARE ADDRESSED BY TECHNOLOGY. ALL OF THEM HAVE TO DO WITH COMPETENCY AND KNOWING THE LAWS OF ARIZONA.

This involves flawless execution and competent training. In the 2020 Primary and General Elections, the Elections Department delivered Poll Worker training to Inspectors and Marshals in 20 minutes. I'm not exaggerating. The training for Clerks and Judges was on-line, not in person.

At the current time the Director of Elections has retired and the Assistant Director is leaving in April. The Recorder is new and has very little experience running the Recorder's Office or function. Who will be accountable for the implementation of a complete overhaul of Pima County's elections? Apple, Amazon, and TENEX?

With all the moving parts, if something following the election is in question, how will it be determined which part it was? The Voter Rolls? The EPollBooks?, the Poll Workers?, The Ballot Printers? The New Locations? The Network?

Where is the Project Plan and other technical plans for roll out, implementation, timing and back up in the event the project is late or technology fails? What about delivery of all the iPads and Printers? The printers are already obsolete. What is the plan for replacement?

### And, finally,

d. How does reducing voting locations by 57% engender trust from voters in our elected and appointed officials? On its face, the reduction in Voting Locations is making it less convenient for people to vote or to drop off their Early Ballots on Election Day. Finding the new locations and managing the logistics for at least half of our voters will be a hassle.

AN INTERESTING LITTLE FACTOID: One of the proposed conveniences of Voting Centers is that voters will be able to vote in ANY one of the 100 polling locations. The Proposal states that "thousands" of voters voted out of precinct and their votes didn't count. By their own admission, the Elections Department reported that in the 2020 General Election out of 665K registered voters, only 653 voters didn't vote in the correct precinct. Which Poll Worker let them vote? Were they told their vote probably wouldn't count?

In sum, in a time very much like the Bush v. Gore era - the era of the HAVA Act ironically - I believe there is tremendous risk in a complete redesign of our Election operation. Pima County right now is the envy of the Arizona State House with our small precincts, paper ballots and hands on attention. There are many other ways to make improvements. Just ask.

## **PIMA County Election Integrity\***

\*The charts found here are excerpts of the M. Lindell Presentation titled, Absolutely 9-0. These charts show the massive election fraud that occurred during the November 2020 Election in Pima County.

## **Overview**

- These charts show that there were at least 2 Chinese organizations that attacked our Pima County, AZ machines during the 2020 Presidential Election
  - Note: Charts 3 through 6 should be placed side by side and read from left to right
- After you've placed Charts 3 through 6 side-by-side, look closely at lines 3 and 7 on each of the charts
- Lines 3 and 7 show the Chinese organizations in Beijing and Shenzhen that attacked our Pima County, AZ machines during the 2020 Election. One attack was at 8:47 PM on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of November; the other attack occurred at 11:49 AM on the 4<sup>th</sup> of November.
  - The Chinese Internet Protocol (IP) addresses are identified as 202.112.126.88 and 202.46.50.146
  - Our Pima County machine IP Addresses are identified as 159.233.2.2 and 159.233.0.55
- Chart 6 shows that the attackers accessed the PIMA County, AZ machines by using "credentials".
   This means that the attacks had the User IDs and passwords of a person authorized to access the machines.
- Chart 6 also shows that the 2 Chinese attacks resulted in a decrement of Trump votes in the amounts of 33,066 (on 4 November at 11:49 AM) and 14,306 (on 3 November at 8:47 PM).
  - Note that the biggest decrement (33,066 votes) occurred on the morning after the election when the Arizona votes were still being tallied.
