Over the years I have found that we have the most voters in the morning when people are going to work and in the afternoon when people are heading home from work. During those two times we have people standing in line to vote. Picture Rocks has a lot of working class people who drive a long way to and from work. Reducing the number of polling places will make voters in Picture Rocks drive even farther and increase their waiting times, thus making it much harder for the working class people of Picture Rocks to vote. Centralized Voting Centers will definitely suppress the vote in Picture Rocks and other rural areas in Pima County. And like other rural low income areas of the county, the people of Picture Rocks have far less political influence than urban and suburban voters. Centralized Voting Centers will disenfranchise the people of Picture Rocks even further!

E-Pollbooks - There are so many concerns with E-Pollbooks. They are connected to the internet and therefore can be hacked. What happens if they crash or have a computer glitch? People get to wait inline even longer or, even worse, become disenfranchised. #### Russia's Not Your Friend

Russia's military intelligence agency, the Main Directorate of the General Staff (GU), is also known as the GRU. The United States has indicted GRU officers and designated the GRU for sanctions in response to Russia's invasion of Ukraine, **cybercrimes, and election interference**. Cyber-related offenses against the World Anti-Doping Agency and the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons, NotPetya malware attacks in 2017, various cyberattacks against the 2018 Olympics, and **interference in the 2016 U.S. election** are just a few of the crimes the GRU has been indicted for by the United States Department of Justice (DOJ). The GRU has been sanctioned under CRIIEEA; P.L. 115-44/H.R. 3364 Countering America's Adversaries Through Sanctions Act (CAATSA, Title II).

#### Don't Welcome Cyberattacks to Pima County

That is just a little background information for Pima County Recorder Gabriella Cazares-Kelly and Pima County interim Elections Director Mary Martinson.

## **in longer lines is not a good idea**

Cazares-Kelly states "With the e-poll book system, check in times will go from about three minutes to 30 seconds." Costco can't even print out my gas receipt that quickly, so you have my attention! However, Congress and the executive branch continue to try and figure out what to do about malicious Russian activities like cyberattacks, **election interference**, and disinformation while our election officials in Pima County want us to rely more on the internet. We know the DOJ knows this is a problem and Congress is trying to figure out what the GRU is capable of and why it conducts operations against elections in the United States, so why is Pima County so interested in inviting that trouble here?

### **Presidents Trump and Obama Knew...**

General Paul K. Nakasone, Commander U.S. Cyber Command and the National Security Agency, said, "as the most technically advanced potential adversary in cyberspace, **Russia is a full-scope cyber actor**, employing sophisticated cyber operations tactics, techniques, and procedures against U.S. and foreign military, diplomatic, and commercial targets, as well as science and technology sectors."

President Obama and President Trump invoked National Emergencies Act (NEA) and International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) authorities to declare national emergencies related to cyber-enabled malicious activities and **election interference**. President Obama issued Executive Order 13757 to establish sanctions against those engaged in "tampering with, altering, or causing a misappropriation of information with the purpose or effect of interfering with or undermining **election processes** or institutions." We aren't talking about Democrat or Republican here; both teams know the potential dangers of Russian influence in the elections.

### **Now, Let's Tell the Pima Co Board of Supervisors**

It's time for us to let the Board of Supervisors know that electronic poll books and voting centers are not for the voters of Pima County, and if they vote in support of either or both of these proposals, it will be their first step out the door. We don't need to do a cost-benefit analysis of the voting systems. We don't need to model the voter system; wait time, service time and deliver a queueing analysis. We don't need to tell you how disenfranchised voters will feel after the disinformation that will surround the change of polling places. We just need you to look at what your team—Presidents Obama and Biden—have already said. Listen to your team.

**Do NOT set Pima County up for a cyberattack or a breach of our VOTER DATA. President Obama warned you; the CIA warned you; the FBI warned you; the NSA warned you, and the Pima County Republican Party is sharing our concern with you.**

Board of Supervisors and County Administrator Huckleberry:

It is not surprising that much thought has been put into the election process since the 2020 election, what is surprising is that our local election officials are considering further detrimental actions to dis-enfranchise the voters again. Reducing voting locations which extends travel to cast a ballot will result in extended wait times.

I have been a poll WORKER for Pima County Elections, in a Republican majority precinct that is always staffed with D (Democrat) and PND (party not declared) workers. In the 2020 primary & general election the only Republicans working at this polling location were myself and my friend (which I recruited for Marshall) in this majority REPUBLICAN PRECINCT staffing without proper party representation is not acceptable. I cannot imagine how you will staff these "voting centers" - PND (party not determined) is not a recognized party and as workers this class of voter should not outnumber the recognized party worker representation at the precinct polls.

I support local polling precinct voting locations for several reasons and **I urge you to Vote NO to Voting Centers and Electronic Poll Books!**

1. Local precinct polling locations offer greater voter integrity and security. The poll workers should be from and know the community.
2. Precinct polling locations offer convenience and in theory the voter can address questions or issues with trained poll workers to EMPOWER the voter.
3. Oversight, with trained poll workers from recognized parties provide transparency in election processes which is imperative.
4. Based on experience, the ipod/electronic tablets have been used with hotspots in the polling locations to update Printed Poll Books at Precincts up to the day of the Election. Many issues were not addressed and required voters to vote as Provisional Ballots, not to mention internet access to voter data via hotspot is concerning already.
5. Electronic devices to control voter data is not transparency, as a Signature Room Observer I witnessed the digital signatures for early ballots. This process compared digital signatures of the voter, several I witnessed were nothing alike. When the Provisional Ballots and Election Day ballots were observed the Records office election workers used the handwritten poll books to review signatures. The handwritten poll books usually produced clearer handwritten signatures that could be verified more easily. These records provide transparency and can be verified without electronic means.

The public has been educated and are aware of the election issues and problems we face, now more than ever. You can hide behind plastic partitions and Zoom meetings but not without the oversight from the public. At some time, you will be held accountable for your actions by the voters in Pima County. Steve Christy has been the only voice of reason and has tried to engage the board with intelligent argument for discourse, you would be wise to consider the information he has presented. The Pima County Board of Supervisors and the County Recorder should not meddle with elections in an election year ever again, the election process needs oversight and transparency from a local perspective. Dear Supervisors:

I have been an Election Board member for 20 years worth of elections in Pima County and in other states. In 2020 I was an Inspector for the Primary and General Elections. I am very concerned about the Pima County Elections Department's and Recorder's Office's proposal to implement Voting Centers, Electronic Pollbooks and Ballot Printers.

**Our Mission as Election Officials is to implement a free and fair election in which the citizens of Pima County can believe and can accept the results.**

I am concerned this mission is in serious jeopardy. Roughly four months before the 2022 voting season begins, the Elections Department and the Recorder's Office want to:

1. Create Voting Centers and reduce the number of Voting Locations from 232 to 100 in the entire county. This is a 57% reduction and does not take into account the 30 new precincts that were recently proposed during the last BOS meeting. This would also REVERSE THE DECISION THAT THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TOOK LAST SEPTEMBER TO KEEP THE NUMBER OF PRECINCTS AT 249.
2. Install new voting equipment in the Voting Centers including Federally uncertified Electronic Pollbooks (tablets with access to the county's Voter Rolls) from Apple that are connected to Amazon Web Services as well as ballot printing devices. They want to turn over the security of Pima County elections to 3rd party vendors AWS, Cisco and Tenex Software Solutions.
3. Change the rules of operation for voters and poll workers.

**ALL AT ONCE! BY JULY 6, 2022!**

In my experience, Voter Confidence in our Elections is a big serious problem.

a. This Proposal does nothing to increase Pima County's Voters' confidence in our Elections. In fact it DECREASES them. Voters are extremely concerned about any system that is remotely connected

to other systems. ANY SYSTEM CAN FAIL OR BE HACKED. No vendor can guarantee 100% uptime. Pima County will need paper ballots and paper rosters as back up to keep the Election going.

b. Most Pima County Voters are aware that Maricopa County conducted an election in 2020 with questionable results. They consolidated voting locations into Voting Centers and used Electronic Poll Books and Ballot Printers. Real problems were discovered as a result of the Maricopa County Audit in 2021. There are **37 Election Integrity Bills** currently in the State Legislature to fix many of these problems. Among them are bills mandating, statewide, MORE PRECINCTS, LESS TECHNOLOGY, HIGHER SECURITY, BETTER VOTER ROLL MAINTENANCE, AND, MORE SCRUTINY BY ELECTION OFFICIALS AND OBSERVERS.

c. There are many moving parts to an Election on the actual Election Day. My experience working in the polls has shown me that there are MANY misunderstandings among Poll Workers of Election Laws as written in ARS 16 - Arizona's Election Code.

**For example:**

- What kind of Identification is required to vote?
- Who is allowed to deliver an Early Ballot or Ballots to the polling location? (only relatives and housemates, NOT curbside "runners")
- What happens if I make a mistake on my ballot?
- Why does the Precinct Roster say that this voter was mailed an Early Ballot when they NEVER HAVE ASKED FOR ONE? EVER.
- How many Democrats and Republicans are supposed to be on the Election Board at the Poll Location?
- Why can't a voter walk into a Poll wearing a candidate hat or talk about candidates? What do the Poll Workers do?
- Why can't Poll Workers NOT talk about politics or candidates in the Polls?
- Who can a Partisan Poll Watcher talk to in a Polling Location? (The Inspector)
- Who has the authority to challenge a voter and how is that done?

**NONE OF THESE QUESTIONS ARE ADDRESSED BY TECHNOLOGY. ALL OF THEM HAVE TO DO WITH COMPETENCY AND KNOWING THE LAWS OF ARIZONA.**

This involves flawless execution and competent training. In the 2020 Primary and General Elections, the Elections Department delivered Poll Worker training to Inspectors and Marshals in 20 minutes. I'm not exaggerating. The training for Clerks and Judges was on-line, not in person.

At the current time the Director of Elections has retired and the Assistant Director is leaving in April. The Recorder is new and has very little experience running the Recorder's Office or function. Who will be accountable for the implementation of a complete overhaul of Pima County's elections? Apple, Amazon, and TENEX?

With all the moving parts, if something following the election is in question, how will it be determined which part it was? The Voter Rolls? The EPollBooks?, the Poll Workers?, The Ballot Printers? The New Locations? The Network?

Where is the Project Plan and other technical plans for roll out, implementation, timing and back up in the event the project is late or technology fails? What about delivery of all the iPads and Printers? The printers are already obsolete. What is the plan for replacement?

**And, finally,**

d. How does reducing voting locations by 57% engender trust from voters in our elected and appointed officials? On its face, the reduction in Voting Locations is making it less convenient for people to vote or to drop off their Early Ballots on Election Day. Finding the new locations and managing the logistics for at least half of our voters will be a hassle.

**AN INTERESTING LITTLE FACTOID:** One of the proposed conveniences of Voting Centers is that voters will be able to vote in ANY one of the 100 polling locations. The Proposal states that "thousands" of voters voted out of precinct and their votes didn't count. By their own admission, the Elections Department reported that in the 2020 General Election out of 665K registered voters, only 653 voters didn't vote in the correct precinct. Which Poll Worker let them vote? Were they told their vote probably wouldn't count?

**In sum,** in a time very much like the Bush v. Gore era - the era of the HAVA Act ironically - I believe there is tremendous risk in a complete redesign of our Election operation. Pima County right now is the envy of the Arizona State House with our small precincts, paper ballots and hands on attention. There are many other ways to make improvements. Just ask.

# Overview

- **These charts show that there were at least 2 Chinese organizations that attacked our Pima County, AZ machines during the 2020 Presidential Election**
  - Note: Charts 3 through 6 should be placed side by side and read from left to right
- **After you've placed Charts 3 through 6 side-by-side, look closely at lines 3 and 7 on each of the charts**
- **Lines 3 and 7 show the Chinese organizations in Beijing and Shenzhen that attacked our Pima County, AZ machines during the 2020 Election. One attack was at 8:47 PM on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of November; the other attack occurred at 11:49 AM on the 4<sup>th</sup> of November.**
  - The Chinese Internet Protocol (IP) addresses are identified as 202.112.126.88 and 202.46.50.146
  - Our Pima County machine IP Addresses are identified as 159.233.2.2 and 159.233.0.55
- **Chart 6 shows that the attackers accessed the PIMA County, AZ machines by using "credentials". This means that the attacks had the User IDs and passwords of a person authorized to access the machines.**
- **Chart 6 also shows that the 2 Chinese attacks resulted in a decrement of Trump votes in the amounts of 33,066 (on 4 November at 11:49 AM) and 14,306 (on 3 November at 8:47 PM).**
  - Note that the biggest decrement (33,066 votes) occurred on the morning after the election when the Arizona votes were still being tallied.
