### \*Project Title/Description:

Tucson/Pima County Problem Solving Court Initiative

### \*Purpose:

Since March of 2020, at the start of the COVID pandemic, the CMPS court Program, was originally off to a strong start, and was dramatically impacted. COVID was the impetus for a multitude of issues that affected the processes, staffing, referral and induction of participants, and training of team members for CMPS court. Over the past few months, the CMPS Court Program has recovered, now fully staffed, training was recently offered again, and has ramped up referrals and inductions into the court. This is a 12-month no-cost extension with an end date of December 31, 2022 and there are no additional funds being added to the original award amount of \$747,591 and the carryover amount is \$205,876.36.

### \*Procurement Method:

Not Applicable.

### \*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

The Pima County Attorney's Office seeks funding to adapt currently existing (and independent) Mental Health Courts (MHC) into one misdemeanor consolidated problem solving court that will address both mental illness and co-occurring disorders.

### \*Public Benefit:

Utilized Program funding to support prosecution objectives and reduce costs for this program to Pima County tax payers.

### \*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Quarterly financial reports and semi annual programmatic reports.

### \*Retroactive:

Yes. PCAO was notified on December 7, 2021 of the no-cost extension. Other approval processes caused delays in preparing documents for the board meeting. If not approved the BJA Grant will not be able to continue funding Crisis Intervention Training, the new consolidated misdemeanor problem solving court, and Compass Court.

Re. Letter of Request for No-Cost Extension 2018-MO-BX-0016

Ms. Love,

The purpose of this letter of request is to secure a 12-month, no-cost extension for the above listed grant from the current end date of 12/31/2021 to 12/31/2022.

Since March of 2020, at the start of the COVID pandemic, the CMPS Court Program, which was originally off to a strong start, was dramatically impacted. COVID was the impetus for a multitude of issues that affected the processes, staffing, referral and induction of participants, and training of team members for CMPS Court. Because of this, many of the goals/deliverables for this grant were also impacted including the number of participants served, the number of participants successfully completing the program, the CIT training for law enforcement and the procurement and implementation of the risk/needs assessment.

Over the past few months, our CMPS Court program has recovered. We are fully staffed, the CIT training was recently offered again, CMPS team members have received training including the NADCP conference and a virtual LE learning site visit, and we have dramatically ramped up referrals and inductions into the Court. However, in order to fully realize the potential of the program funded through this BJA grant and meet all program deliverables, we would like to extend our grant through December of 2022.

We estimate that by the end of the current grant year (December 31, 2021) we will have approximately \$271,920 remaining from the approved 3-year grant total of \$747,591.

The goals for this 12-month extension period will include completing the approved grant projects: utilizing the screening/assessment tool and our newly structured and refined referral process to induct more participants from more jurisdictions, bringing the court case load up to its full capacity of 50 individuals, successfully discharging at least 10 participants in this next year, and continuing to offer additional training opportunities for our team members.

Attached is a timeline/list of activities and associated deliverables for the requested 12-month extension.
