*Project Title/Description:

Health Promotion and Disease Prevention Research Centers

*Purpose:

The purpose of *Unidos: Linking Individuals to Social Determinant and Community Health Services* is to address chronic disease and social conditions that contribute to health disparities among Latinos in Arizona. This project involves delivering education and resources to target communities through Community Health Workers (CHWs) who understand and represent community needs within and outside of traditional health systems.

Amendment #2 adds \$20,000 for Year 3 of the project.

*Procurement Method:

This Revenue Contract is a non-Procurement contract and not subject to Procurement rules.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

It is expected that this project will show that enhanced social support and networks will improve reported health over a six month period. The outcome of this research will be a scalable, sustainable Community-Clinical Linkages model that lowers chronic disease risk. Community Health Workers within the Pima County Health Department will accomplish these outcomes by working with El Rio Community Health Center to identify program participants. CHWs will work with participants to:

- 1) Support and connect participants to health promotion resources;
- 2) Provide individual and group-based support; and
- 3) Leverage community resources to help individuals address social determinants of health-related needs.

*Public Benefit:

Reduction of chronic disease and improved social conditions among Latino adults in Pima County.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

- 1. Participate in the Arizona Prevention Research Center (AzPRC) Community Action Board (CAB) Research Committee;
- 2. Work collaboratively with the CAB Research Committee and AzPRC research team to refine the Unidos community-clinical linkage model;
- 3. Employ CHWs to implement the community program;
- 4. Participate in CHW training related to the research intervention;
- 5. Collect survey data relevant to the community program being implemented by CHWs in the community; and
- 6. Participate in dissemination and scale up activities as appropriate.

*Retroactive:

Yes. The grant funding for Year 3 of the contract began September 30, 2021. However, the final agreement was not received from the University until February 22, 2022. If not approved, this program will not be able to complete the third and final year.



Incorporation: In addition to the federal laws, regulations, policies, and CDC General Terms and Conditions for Research awards at https://www.cdc.gov/grants/federalregulationspolicies/index.html, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) hereby incorporates Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) number **RFA-DP19-001**, **entitled Health Promotion and Disease Prevention Research Centers**, and application dated April 21, 2021, as may be amended, which are hereby made a part of this Research award hereinafter referred to as the Notice of Award (NOA).

Approved Funding: Funding in the amount of \$1,740,000 is approved for the Year 03 budget period, which is September 30, 2021 through September 29, 2022. All future year funding will be based on satisfactory programmatic progress and the availability of funds.

- Facilitate the exchange of information with other CDC programs so that public health efficiencies are reached and effectiveness findings are disseminated quickly between CDC and its awardees.
- Promote dissemination of promising practices, programs, interventions, and other research findings and products; and
- Assess the public health impact of the Core Research Project and assure translation of promising practices, policies, programs, interventions, and other research findings and products.

Additionally, an HHS/CDC agency Scientific Program Official will be responsible for the normal scientific and programmatic stewardship of the award.

The ERPOS Scientific Program Official will be:

- Named in the Notice of Award (NoA) as the Scientific Program Official to provide scientific oversight and assure overall scientific and programmatic stewardship of the award;
- Monitor performance against approved project objectives; and
- Assure assessment of the public health impact of the research conducted under this funding opportunity announcement.

Data Management Plan (SIP19-003): As identified in the NOFO, a data management plan is required. The recipient is required to submit a Data Management Plan to the Scientific Program Official noted in the Staff Contacts section of this NoA, no later than 30 days from the budget period start date due October 30, 2021.

Expanded Authority: The recipient is permitted expanded authorities in the administration of the award.

FUNDING RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS

Programmatic Restriction for new Co-Principle Investigator Refugio Sepulveda:

Human Subjects Restriction (SIP19-003): Research involving human subjects cannot begin until a copy of the IRB approval letter for each of the institution sites is submitted and a revised NoA releasing the restriction is issued, in writing, by the Grants Management Officer.

- A funding restriction in the amount of \$34,000 has been placed on this award pending IRB approvals.
- The restriction applies to the following budget items or budget categories salaries.

Recipients are advised that documentation for key personnel and other significant contributors involved in the design or conduct of research, that demonstrates completion of an education program in the protection of human subjects, may be required to be submitted concurrently. The recipient should contact the Scientific Program Official noted in the Staff Contacts section of this NoA for more information on Human Subjects Restriction release.

Certificate of Confidentiality: Institutions and investigators are responsible for determining whether research they conduct is subject to Section 301(d) of the Public Health Service (PHS) Act. Indirect Costs:

Indirect costs are based on the negotiated indirect cost rate agreement dated December 15, 2018. The rates in this agreement are to be used for remainder of the competitive segment in accordance with 45 CFR Part 75. Indirect cost/facilities and administration rates for subcontracts will be treated in the same manner as those for the remainder, if the subcontractor is covered by 45 CFR Part 75.
