Pima County Juvenile Court Center Family Counseling Program

## \*Introduction/Background:

Pima County Juvenile Court Center receives funds from the AZ Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) on an annual basis to provide family counseling services to families that are court-involved in order to help strengthen family relationships and prevent juvenile delinquency. Counseling services specifically address family discord, dysfunction, domestic violence, addictions, substance abuse, mental illness, grief, loss, divorce, blended families, poor parenting skills, neglect, abuse, and trauma related issues.

#### \*Discussion:

The goal for FY 2023 is the serve 35 youth & families. Families will be referred to evidence-based services including Multisystemic Therapy (MST), Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy (CBT), and individual and family therapy. Youth and families are screened for services by PCJCC Probation Placement Committee which includes a Psychologist and probation staff from multiple levels of probation supervision. Once referred, the Placement Committee Supervisor tracks attendance and participation in services.

#### \*Conclusion:

This program helps to reduce family conflict, reduce family referrals for delinquent behavior, and increase the use of services less costly than residential and inpatient care.

#### \*Recommendation:

Recommend/approve the use of \$15,245.00 of Pima County funds currently in the PCJCC budget for a match to draw down AOC funds for the Family Counseling program.

The Board of Supervisors of Pima County, Arizona finds:			
1. A.R.S. sections 8-261 through 8-265 provide for the establishment and administration of voluntary Family Counseling Programs to be administered by the juvenile division of the superior court.			
2. The purpose of the Programs is to provide counseling services to families in order to help strengthen family relationships and prevent juvenile delinquency.			
3. In fiscal year 2020-2021 the Programs provided services to 28 youth and/or families in Pima County.			
4. Pursuant to A.R.S. section 8-264(A), Pima County may elect to participate in the Programs for fiscal year 2022-2023 by resolution of the Pima County Board of Supervisors.
