PRESENTATION/PROCLAMATION

Presentation proclaiming the first Friday in June, June 3, 2022, as Gun Violence Awareness Day in Pima County.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, every day more than 100 Americans are killed and more than 200 are wounded in gun violence, and on average there are more than 16,000 gun homicides every year; and

WHEREAS, Americans are 26 times more likely to die by gun homicide than people in other highincome countries; and

WHEREAS, Arizona has more than 1,100 gun deaths every year and our state has the 19th highest rate of gun deaths in the United States; and

WHEREAS, protecting public safety is the Board of Supervisors' highest responsibility; and

WHEREAS, support for the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding citizens goes hand in hand with keeping guns away from people that shouldn't have them; and

WHEREAS, gun-violence prevention is more important than ever as the pandemic continues to exacerbate gun violence after more than a year of increased gun sales; increased calls to suicide and domestic-violence hot lines; and an increase in city gun violence; and

WHEREAS, in January 2013, 15-year-old Hadiya Pendleton of Chicago was tragically shot and killed and on June 3, to recognize Pendleton's 25th birthday (she was born on June 2, 1997), people across the United States will recognize National Gun Violence Awareness Day and wear orange in tribute to Pendleton, other victims of gun violence and the loved ones of those victims; and

WHEREAS, the idea was inspired by a group of Pendleton's friends, who asked their classmates to commemorate her life by wearing orange. They chose this color because hunters wear orange to announce themselves to other hunters in the woods and orange is a color that symbolizes the value of human life; and

WHEREAS, anyone can join this campaign by pledging to wear orange on June 3 to help raise awareness about gun violence.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Pima County Board of Supervisors hereby proclaims Friday, June 3, 2022, to be:

"GUN VIOLENCE AWARENESS DAY IN PIMA COUNTY"

and encourages all citizens to support their communities' efforts to prevent the tragic effects of gun violence and to honor and value human lives.
