*Project Title/Description:

Fiscal Agent Pima County/Emergency Food and Shelter to Families and Individuals encountered by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)

*Purpose:

Catholic Community Services of Southern Arizona, Inc. provides services as a Pima County subrecipient of federal awards funds (FEMA Emergency Food and Shelter Humanitarian Funds). Services are only for those U.S. southern border asylum seekers released by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security agencies. Services include food and shelter at the Casa Alitas Welcome Center (CAWC) or at overflow hotels which includes individuals who cannot be housed in congregate settings due to COVID-19 spacing restrictions. Other services include the facilitation of transportation and travel supplies.

*Procurement Method:

This Subrecipient Agreement is a non-Procurement contract and not subject to Procurement rules.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

Reimbursement of eligible expenditures including staffing at CAWC and hotels; and food and shelter at CAWC.

*Public Benefit:

These services keep U.S. southern border asylum seekers released in Pima County by U.S. Department of Homeland Secuirty agencies off the streets, thereby ensuring their safety and the safety of the community. These services also provide a humane and efficient process to help asylum seekers reach their sponsor families in other parts of the U.S. as quickly as possible.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Daily logs of migrants served, daily logs of meals served, and spreadsheet reflecting actual expenses incurred.

*Retroactive:

Yes, the funding covers eligible expenses incurred July 1, 2022 - December 31, 2022. Agreement negotiations have been on-going since May 2022.

FEDERAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE SUBAWARD AMENDMENT TWO

1. Background and Purpose.

1.1. Background. On June 22, 2021, Pima County ("County") and Catholic Community Services of Southern Arizona, Inc. ("Subrecipient"), entered into the above-referenced Agreement ("Agreement") to provide emergency food and shelter for both COVID-19 positive and COVID-19 negative families and individuals encountered by DHS. County, as Grantee, received federal grant funding from the EFSP Supplemental Funding Program to provide services to asylum seekers. In addition, the Pima County Emergency Food and Shelter Program Local Board identified Pima County Grants Management & Innovation (GMI) as the Fiscal Agent for the jurisdiction. The EFSP Supplemental Funds program has been extended through December 31, 2022.

- 1.2. The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2022, Pub. L. No. 117-103 was signed into law on March 15, 2022. The Act provides \$150 million for the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP) to provide humanitarian relief to families and individuals encountered by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). FEMA awarded the funds to the National Board on April 15, 2022. The program's existing grant funds delivery-structure and public-private partnership makes it a viable means for providing funds quickly to organizations providing humanitarian relief to families and individuals encountered by DHS.
- 1.3. Purpose. The parties want to increase Subrecipient's funding for costs of providing emergency food and shelter to asylum seekers when they are released from U.S. Border Patrol custody and receive services at the Casa Alitas Welcome Center or at hotels/motels for overflow from Casa Alitas and for individuals who cannot be housed in traditional congregate settings due to COVID-19 spacing restrictions. These services keep legally-present, homeless, immigrant families off the streets and help them to reach their relatives or sponsors within the United States, which will improve community safety, and enhance the general and economic welfare of the inhabitants of the County and the City.
- 2. Term. This Amendment No. 2 commences on July 1, 2022 and will terminate on December 31, 2022. If the commencement date of the Term is before the signature date of the last party to execute this amendment, the parties will, for all purposes, deem the Agreement to have been in effect as of the commencement date.
- 3. Scope of Services.

4. Compensation and Payment.

- 4.1. The NTE Amount in Section 4.1 of the Agreement (06/22/2021) is increased so that County may reimburse Subrecipient up to \$2,253,177.00 for food, shelter and staffing including any sales taxes.
- 4.2. Subsection 4.9 is restated as follows:
 - 4.9. Funding for this Agreement comes from the Emergency Food and Shelter National Program (EFSP). County will only reimburse Subrecipient's costs if County continues to receive EFSP Supplemental Funding via advance or reimbursement. County may deny payment of services if County deems the cost ineligible or rejects the cost due to lack of additional EFSP Supplemental Funding.
- **5. Counterparts.** This Amendment No. 2 may be executed in counterparts, each of which, when taken together, will constitute one original contract.
