### \*Project Title/Description:

**Emergency Services Network (ESN)** 

### \*Purpose:

Interfaith Community Services, a subrecipient, assists households with emergency utility and rental/mortgage financial assistance through case management services including eligibility determination for several funding sources, as well as referral and advocacy services to eligible, low-income households experiencing a temporary financial crisis in order to prevent homelessness and utility disconnection. Funding is ultimately used to ensure households become and remain self-sufficient.

US Department of Health and Human Services funds were approved at the August 15, 2022 Pima County Board of Supervisors' Meeting. Short Term Crisis Services/Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (STCS/TANF) funds are to be used for eligibility determination and case management services for households with minors facing eviction or foreclosure. STCS/TANF funds can also be used to pay the following: delinquent utility bills to prevent utility shut off and work related expenses such as vehicle, dental and eye related services as needed to secure or maintain employment. This determination can be used to write vouchers to landlords or mortgage companies from Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funds as well as STCS/TANF. Utility shut-off eligibility case management is conducted under LIHEAP. Based on review of the LIHEAP application, County guarantees payment and issues a voucher to the utility company.

This amendment will provide additional funding of \$422,219.25 for the period of July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023.

Pursuant to Pima County Procurement Code 11.12.020, Competitive sealed proposals, RFP No. CAA-ESN-2018-06 was conducted with delegated authority.

### \*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

Interfaith Community Services will provide emergency financial assistance to 334 eligible low-income households.

### \*Public Benefit:

The benefit of the program is that it will help in alleviating poverty, prevent homelessness, prevent utility shutoffs while promoting selfsufficiency to Pima County residents.

### \*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Monthly case management and service reports.

### \*Retroactive:

Yes, the County received the amendment for the July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 itemized Service Budget from AZ Department of Economic Security (ADES) on July 15, 2022. The subrecipient amendment could not be processed until the ADES amendment was approved by the Board. The grant amendment was approved at the 8/15/22 Board of Supervisors' meeting. There were additional delays due to budget issues. The negative impact of not approving this amendment is low-income families will not receive emergency utility and rental/mortgage financial assistance for an additional year.

## **GRANT FUNDED AGREEMENT – AMENDMENT EIGHT**

### 1. BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE.

- 1.1 **Background.** On June 19, 2018, Pima County ("County") and Interfaith Community Services ("Subrecipient"), entered into the above referenced contract to provide supportive services and emergency assistance to the eligible low-income families in Pima County.
- 1.2 **Purpose.** County through its Community Action Agency, as Grantee, is the recipient of State and Federal Grants for operating the local Emergency Services Network ("ESN") to provide emergency financial assistance for qualified households to prevent homelessness or utility disconnection. County is the Subrecipient of USHHS funds and is authorized to pass those funds along to other entities, including Subrecipient, for eligible services. County wishes to continue the ESN services provided by Subrecipient for an additional year.
- 2. TERM, EXTENSIONS and AMENDMENTS, SECTION 1.0. Pursuant to Paragraph 1.3, the term of the Agreement survives so long as Subrecipient has control of grant funds, including program

income. Whereas Subrecipient continues to have control of grant funds and program income and, pursuant to Paragraph 1.2, County exercises the last available extension option. The Commencement Date for this Amendment No. 8 is July 1, 2022. If the commencement date is before the signature date of the last party to execute this Agreement, the parties will, for all purposes, deem the Agreement to have been in effect as of the commencement date. This Contract will terminate on June 30, 2023.

3. COMPENSATION AND PAYMENT, SECTION 3.0. Paragraph 3.1 is amended to increase "the Maximum Allocated Amount" from \$1,267,595.25 to \$1,689,814.50. In addition, the table in Paragraph 3.2 is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

4. FORCED LABOR OF ETHNIC UYGHURS. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 35-394, if Subrecipient engages in for-profit activity and has 10 or more employees, Subrecipient certifies it is not currently using, and agrees for the duration of this Subaward to not use (1) the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China; (2) any goods or services produced by the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China; and (3) any subrecipients, subcontractors or suppliers that use the forced labor or any goods or services produced by the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China. If Subrecipient becomes aware during the term of the Subaward that the Company is not in compliance with A.R.S. § 35-394, Subrecipient must notify the County within five business days and provide a written certification to County regarding compliance within one hundred eighty days.

## 5. INSURANCE, SECTION 5 is amended as follows:

### 5.1 Insurance Coverages and Limits

5.1.1. <u>Professional Liability (E & O) Insurance</u> – This insurance is required for work from professionals whose coverage is excluded from the above CGL policy. The policy limits shall be not less than \$2,000,000 Each Claim and \$2,000,000 Annual Aggregate. The insurance shall cover professional misconduct or negligent acts of anyone performing any services under this contract.

## 5.2 Additional Coverage Requirements

5.2.1. <u>Claims Made Coverage:</u> If any part of the Required Insurance is written on a claimsmade basis, any policy retroactive date must precede the effective date of this Contract, and Contractor must maintain such coverage for a period of not less than three (3) years following Contract expiration, termination, or cancellation.
