Budget Narrative Modification/Realignment

Contractual: A total of \$1,504,022.18 is budgeted for subrecipient costs. Pima County entered five subrecipient agreements that include Goodwill Industries of Southern Arizona to provide business outreach services in the Pima County local workforce area, as well as coordinate OJT contracts and paid internships. Cochise Private Industry Council dba ARIZONA@WORK Southern Arizona (SEAZ) will continue its oversight and implementation of all H-1B One Workforce Grant activities in Cochise, Graham, and Greenlee Counties. Santa Cruz County (SCC) will oversee implementation in Santa Cruz County. Pima Community College (PCC) provides quality training in demand-industry sectors where at least eighty percent (80%) of enrolled participants will complete training.

Goodwill Industries will underwrite the costs of one Workplace Development Specialist at .50 FTE to support participant tracking and record keeping for the partnership and other outreach activities.

On a separate contract, Goodwill Industries develops on-the-job training activities with locally based employers for eligible participants. Pima County entered a contract for \$108,240.00 to ensure the timely reimbursement of participant wages to the OJT employer.

The budget includes a Career Support Specialist at 1.0 FTE for SCC and one Program Director at, and two at .50 FTE, to provide programmatic support in workforce partner communities, including recruitment, enrollment, and job placement services at completion of the training. The budget also includes a Program Director at .50 FTE to administer the program in one of the IFA workforce areas, and a second Program Director at 1.0 FTE to manage the program in Santa Cruz County.

The budget also includes one Career Support Specialist at 1.0 FTE and a second Career Support Specialist at .50 FTE provide oversight in Southeastern Arizona. These costs include fringe benefits for employees, as well as indirect costs for administration. The costs also include staff mileage to permit regional travel, to engage in outreach, recruitment, engagement, and program coordination with partners. It also includes limited office supplies and postage.

IFA Workforce Partners also cover the costs of tuition, training, testing, supplemental support services, and internships (other costs). PCC training will lead to the attainment of industry recognized credentials, a college degree, or enhanced skills. PCC will accept County vouchers for tuition and/or fees. PCC will offer college credit classes and programs, non-credit classes, clock hour career training programs and are limited to reimbursable activities specific to tuition and/or fees incurred by eligible grant participants.

The sub awardees, Goodwill Industries, Santa Cruz County, and Cochise Private Industry Council utilize the de minimis rate. Salary, Fringe, Mileage, Supplies are the direct costs used to calculate the indirect cost rate, as shown below. The table below also includes the other costs and services to be paid to subrecipients. PCC is the local area community college and will not have indirect costs associated with the contracted service.

PCC will be paid on a Unit Cost basis for tuition and/or fees per published or agreed upon reduced prices. Total payment, in the form of tuition and /or fee vouchers will not exceed \$510,000.00 over the grant life cycle. Projected yearly expenditures for budget item tuition and/or fee vouchers.

Other: A total of \$1,880,819.81 is budgeted in this category. The other line item includes the redistributed funds for participant training and tuition costs, \$1,559,069.82 an adjusted OJT/paid internships for a total of \$155,709.99; \$2,990.00 for cellular service; and \$6,550.00 for outreach/recruitment. As stated in the original budget narrative, training costs are based on average cost per participant.

Training costs are an average of various course offerings in the targeted occupations to receive credentials and higher education. For example, the cost to receive a Security+ Certified Network Specialist credential at New Horizons is \$9,999.50. The cost to receive a computer-numerical control machinists certificate from Pima Community College (PCC) is \$3,654/student. The cost of an A.A.S. in logistics from PCC is \$5,655, and the cost to receive an A.A.S. from PCC in structural repair is \$6,916.40/student. It is anticipated the expanded on-the-job training will lower overall training costs, as a proportion of costs will be absorbed by employer partners. Pima County will enroll a total of 137 additional participants to meet the grant goal. Pima County budgets approximately, \$10,286.71 per participant which includes tuition, training, training supplies, testing fees and employment assistance.

It is anticipated the expanded on-the-job training will lower overall training costs, as a proportion of costs will be absorbed by employer partners. It will also leverage existing WIOA funds.

d. Organizational, administrative, and fiscal capacity

1) Capacity of Lead Applicant, Partnership Structure, and Administrative Controls and Systems i. Lead applicant's capacity. The Lead applicant and fiscal agent, Pima County administers local, state, and federal workforce and human services contracts more than \$30 million; subcontracts with more than 20 community agencies, government entities, regional partners, and possess the financial, operational, and technical capacity for effective management. The primary contact for Pima County is Rhonda Piña, Community & Workforce Development Deputy Director. Deputy Director Piña provides directional oversight of the collaborative. Deputy Director Piña has a Business Management Bachelor of Science degree and over 29 years of experience. Pima County will designate one project coordinator to direct the overall project, and one staff support specialist to help with data collection and other activities for the project. Overseeing Pima County's efforts will be Pima County's Community & Workforce Development Department Director, Dan Sullivan, who has two decades' experience in workforce program administration and economic development. Other workforce providers will staff the project with a program director and career support specialists. The communications plan includes support from Pima County's Communication Office, coordinating with peers from the other communities within the region to develop key messages and campaigns, utilizing print, broadcast, and social media outlets. Other efforts will include providing program content accessible at workforce development One Stop Job Centers and websites. Collateral materials will also be developed to share with education/training partners and outreach to mandated partners, such as the Arizona Department of Economic Security, for potential referrals.

With the redistribution of subrecipient contractual obligations, Pima County will enroll a total of 137 additional participants to meet the grant goal. Pima County budgets approximately, \$10,286.71 per participant which includes tuition, training, training supplies, testing fees and employment assistance. Pima County currently has an H-1B team that includes a Program Coordinator, Community Workforce Specialist (case manager), and outreach personnel. Pima County personnel not paid by the grant allocate their time as leverage monthly and provide additional resources for outreach, recruitment and assistance with individuals enrolled in the grant. The existing infrastructure of training and contracts already in place are utilized along with shorter term training programs like Information Technology. Training providers include Pima Community College, University of Arizona, and New Horizons.

The overall grant projections and target outcomes and performance remain the same with the following breakdown:
