OFFER AGREEMENT

1. PURPOSE

This contract establishes a system-generated form Master Agreement ("MA") for Contractors to provide Pima County ("County") with Food Products for Pima County Adult Detention Complex on an "as required basis" by issue of Delivery Order ("DO") or Delivery Order Maximo ("DOM"). It is Pima County's intent to award multiple vendors.

The established MA will be issued to all Contractors awarded on this contract. County will order Good/Services from the Contractor on the contract offering best value to County. Should that Contractor be unable to provide the Good/Service at the time requested, County will then order the Good/Service from another Contractor available on the contract.

2. CONTRACT TERM, RENEWALS, EXTENSIONS and REVISIONS

The MA will document the commencement date of the contract and will be for a one (1) year period with four (4) oneyear renewal options that the parties may exercise as follows: County will issue contract extensions, renewals, or revisions to Contractor with a revised MA document. Contractor must object in writing to the proposed revisions, terms, conditions, scope modifications and/or specifications within ten (10) calendar days of issuance by County. If Contractor does not notify county of any objections within that timeframe, the revision(s) will be binding on the parties.

3. CONTRACTOR MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

The Contractor certifies that it is competent, willing, and responsible for performing the services or providing the products in accordance with the requirements of this contract.

4. PRODUCT OR SERVICE SPECIFICATIONS & SCOPE OF WORK

This contract establishes the requirements under which the Contractor will provide Food Products for Pima County Adult Detention Complex, in accordance herein.

4.1. General Specifications

4.1.1.Pima County's intent to award multiple vendors.

Title: Food Products for Pima County Adult Detention Complex

- 4.1.2 Contractor shall be financially responsible for obtaining all required licenses to comply with pertinent municipal, county, state, and federal laws, and assume liability for all applicable taxes including but not restricted to sales, and personal property. Contractor is responsible for obtaining all required permits.
- 4.1.3. Contractor must guarantee that all deliveries made to Pima County Adult Detention Complex are reserved as first (1st) stop status.
- 4.1.4. The large Wednesday loads, an electric pallet jack is preferred. Contractor must provide their own electric pallet jack.
- 4.1.5 All loads will be unloaded by supplier. Pallets must be standard 48"x40" and should not be stacked higher than 6ft. Failure to palletize and shrink-wrap loads can result in rejection of order and will need to make arrangements to re-deliver same or next day.
- 4.1.6.Items should be free of damage. Damaged items will be returned to the Contractor and replacement items will be delivered at no additional cost to the County. Damaged items will be immediately brought to the attention of the Contractor.
- 4.1.7. Contractor is responsible for all damaged items, except to the extent caused by County's negligence.
- 4.1.8.Contractor must provide invoice at time of delivery or pickup.
- 4.1.9.Contractor will not be held responsible for unforeseen delays caused beyond the Contractor's control, provided they provide prompt notice of delay as soon as Contractor has knowledge of said delays.
- 4.1.10. County will not pay for any additional changes, such as, to include but not limited to, fuel surcharges, environmental fees, trip charges, overtime, and delivery.

4.2. Item Specifications

- 4.2.1.Items ordered by the Sheriff Department will be handled by inmates and thus require special packaging suitable for correctional institutions.
- 4.2.2.Contractor and their suppliers must comply with all of the applicable United States Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) to assure safety and quality of all food products. All food products must be slaughtered, inspected, processed, handled, stored, packaged, labeled, and transported per all applicable state and federal regulations. Food products must be USDA grade specified. Food products not covered by USDA grades are to be of commercial quality. Contractor must comply with the applicable local agency's licensing regulations.
- 4.2.3.Regulations include, but are not limited to the following:
 - United States Code of Federal Regulations; Title 7, Agriculture and Title 21, Food and Drugs
 - United States Pure Food and Drug Acts Standards
 - Federal Food Quality Protection Act
 - USDA Standards, Grades, and Weight Classes.

All merchandise is to be first quality (top U.S. Grade per class) unless seconds are specifically requested by a County department.

- 4.2.4. Dry Food Product- A dry product that does NOT require freezing or refrigeration.
- 4.2.5 Damaged Items- Refers to an item that has sustained damage that would allow spillage from the original container, a loss or disfigurement of label that would hinder identification, contaminated package that would affect the content of that package or any other happening that would affect the quality and/or quantity of the original item. Swollen, rusted or dented cans are to be replaced at no charge or credited if the Contractor is notified within fourteen (14) days of the receipt of delivery. Items improperly packaged and stored during transport to maintain environmental temperature and prevent damage or thawing will not be accepted. No distress/damaged, stale, spoiled or merchandise deemed unfit for use will be accepted. Verification of grade and/or pack shall be provided upon request.

Products meeting these "damaged" specifications will be rejected by Pima County and refused and/or returned at the Contractor's expense.

4.2.6. Labels- Upon request by County representative, the Contractor will submit labels; nutritional analysis sheets, ingredient lists: prep/cooking instructions; and reports indicating meat/meat alternates; breads; fruits; and vegetables to document compliance with specifications. All food items will be properly labeled.

- 4.2.7. Net Container Quantity- The minimum net quality of all products in cans and jars will be in accord with the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act. The individual specifications for standard of fill for the products as prescribed in 21 CFR shall be applied.
- 4.2.8. Product Protection Guarantees- Contractors are expected to take immediate action to correct any situation in which product integrity is violated at no fault of the County.
- 4.2.9. Service Level- The Contractor shall fill all original at a monthly average of 98% or above on the scheduled delivery day. The remaining 2% shall be delivered within twenty-four (24) hours of the scheduled delivery day unless the County agrees that the product will be reordered.
- 4.2.10. **Standards of Identity-** All products must conform to U.S. minimum standards of identity as authorized by the Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act and the supporting regulations in 21 CFR- Food for Human Consumption.

All equipment must be models of current production, latest design, and technology, new and unused unless otherwise specified. The successful Proposer must provide manufacturer and Proposer documentation, including and not limited to the following not later than fourteen (14) days after request by County and at no additional cost: warranty; caution-informational warnings; recommended maintenance schedule and process; recommended spare parts list; operating, technical and maintenance manuals including drawings, if appropriate; product brochures; and safety data sheets (SDS).

5. SUSTAINABILITY

In accordance with Board of Supervisors Resolution 2007-84, Pima County values and highly encourages contractors to utilize sustainable practices. Please **CHECK** any of the following that your business incorporates:

Waste prevention/reduction or material recycling/reuse.

- Alternative energy/fuels (such as solar/wind energy; biodiesel; alternative fuels; hybrid vehicles) in your program's preparation, transportation, and demonstration.

6. OFFER ACCEPTANCE & ORDER RELEASES

County will accept offers and execute this contract by issuing an MA (recurring requirements) to be effective on the document's date of issue without further action by either party. The MA will include the term of the contract.

Pursuant to the executed MA, County departments requiring the goods or services described herein will issue a DO or DOM to the Contractor. County will furnish the DO or DOM to Contractor via facsimile, e-mail, or telephone. If County gives the order verbally, the County Department issuing the order will transmit a confirming order document to Contractor within five (5) workdays of the date it gives the verbal order.

Contractor must not supply materials or services that are not specified on the MA and are not documented or authorized by a DO or DOM at the time of provision. County accepts no responsibility for control of or payment for materials or services not documented by a County DO or DOM.

Contractor will establish, monitor, and manage an effective contract administration process that assures compliance with all requirements of this contract. In particular, Contractor will not provide goods or services in excess of the executed contract items, item quantity, item amount, or contract amount without prior written authorization by contract amendment that County has properly executed and issued. Any items Contractor provides in excess of those stated in the contract are at Contractor's own risk. Contractor will decline verbal requests to deliver items in excess of the contract

and will report all such requests in writing to County's Procurement Department within one (1) workday of the request. The report must include the name of the requesting individual and the nature of the request.

7. ACCEPTANCE OF GOODS & SERVICES

The County Department designated on the issued order DO or DOM will accept goods and services only in accordance with this contract. Such acceptance is a prerequisite to the commencement of payment terms.

8. COMPENSATION & PAYMENT

The MA will establish the contractual Not-to-Exceed Amount ("NTE Amount"). The NTE Amount represents the funding appropriated by County for this contract and cannot be altered without amendment. For this contract, the NTE Amount is shared between each Contractor awarded. The sum total of County payments to all Contractors cannot exceed the established NTE Amount, regardless of the independent total of each Contractor. Contractor will not accept orders or provide services or products that cumulatively exceed the contract amount.

8.1. Unit Prices

Contractor's unit prices must include all incidentals and associated costs required to comply with and satisfy all requirements of this contract, which includes the Offer Agreement and the Standard Terms and Conditions. County will make no payments for items not in the contract and Contractor will not invoice them.

Quantities in this solicitation are estimates only. County may increase or decrease quantities and amounts. County makes no guarantee regarding actual orders for items or quantities during the term of the contract. County is not responsible for Contractor inventory or order commitment.

Unless the parties otherwise agree in writing, all pricing will be F.O.B. Destination & Freight Prepaid Not Billed ("F.O.B. Destination"). Contractor will deliver and unload products or services at the destination(s) that the delivery article of this contract or accepted Order indicates. The offered Unit Price must include all freight costs.

Although an order may not fully include State and City sales tax, County will pay such taxes as are DIRECTLY applicable to County and Contractor invoices such taxes as a separate line item. Contractor must not include such taxes in the item unit price.

8.2. Price Warranty and Trade-In Allowance

Contractor will give County the benefit of any price reduction before actual time of shipment. Parties may negotiate a fair and equitable trade-in allowance value for County surplus property to be applied through either a discounted purchase price or account credit. The trade-in value must be stated on a written price quote prior to County making a purchase, or on a credit memo invoice for a prior purchase. Trade-In property will be itemized on the quote or invoice by description, model/part number, quantity, and guaranteed trade-in value. County will coordinate and document the delivery of surplus trade-in property to Contractor. Award of contract constitutes disposition authority to trade-in surplus property pursuant to Board of Supervisors' Policy D.29.11, Surplus Personal Property.

Contractor will provide detailed documentation in support of payment requests, which should be consistent with and not exceed County's DO, or DOM document.

Contractor will bill County within one (1) month after the date on which Contractor's right to payment accrues ("Payment Accrual Date") which, unless this contract specifically provides otherwise, is the date Contractor delivers goods, performs services, or incurs costs. Invoices must assign each billed amount to an appropriate line item of County's order and document each Payment Accrual Date. County may refuse to pay any amount that Contractor bills in which does not conform to County's PO, DO, or DOM document. County will refuse to pay

any amount that Contractor bills more than six (6) months after the Payment Accrual Date, pursuant to A.R.S. § 11-622(C).

8.3. Living Wage

All pricing will conform to Pima County's Living Wage ordinance if applicable, including required annual adjustments of the wage.

8.4. Additional Items and/or Services

This following section is for items that Contractor did not list or price above but are within the scope of this contract. Contractor may provide these items under this contract. Contractor will submit Master Price List (MPL) documents, compact disc (CD) or USB flash drive and file names or identify website address, identifying all other items offered pursuant to this contract. The MPL or website address specifically designed for County must include the vendor's/manufacturer's or retail price list and the discount percentage off utilized to get to include Discounted Unit Price being offered to County i.e. Manufacturer's List Price - (List price x Discount %) = Discounted Unit Price. The resulting Unit Prices must be of similar discount off List Prices for those items specifically included above. Item Unit Prices above will govern in case of conflict with the Master Price List.

The parties may negotiate and establish unit pricing in writing under the contract for items included in the scope of the contract that does not have previously listed unit pricing.

Standard Payment Term 8.5.

Net (30), effective from the date of valid invoice document and does not commence until the later of 1) the receiving County Department receives goods or services into County's payment system or 2) County Financial Operations receives and verifies Contractor's invoice.

Optional Early Payment Discount Term 8.6.

Pima County Administrative Procedure No. 22-35 Section 2.2.4 describes County's practice regarding discounts for early payment. Contractor offers the following discounts to those prices to be used for all orders issued pursuant to this contract. County will utilize the existing payment code that best matches that offered and does not exceed the offered discount percentage. Payment days cannot be less than ten (10) calendar days. Contractor will submit valid invoice document consistent with the associated DO or DOM to County's Finance Department at least seven (7) calendar days prior to the date on which the discounted payment is due. If desired, for any order issued pursuant with this contract, Contractor may offer early payment discounts that exceed this Early Payment Discount.

Optional Early Payment Discount:

8.7. Invoicing

Contractor will submit Request(s) for Payment or Invoices to the location and entity identified by County's DO or DOM document.

All Invoice documents will reference County's DO or DOM number under which the services or products were ordered. Contractor must utilize the item description, precise unit price, AND unit of measure included in County's order document for ALL Invoice line items. County may return invoices that include line items or unit prices that do not match those documented by County's order to Contractor unprocessed for correction.

Contractor will provide detailed documentation in support of payment requests, which should be consistent with and not exceed County's DO or DOM document. Contractor will bill County within one (1) month after the date on which Contractor's right to payment accrues ("Payment Accrual Date"), which, unless this contract specifically provides otherwise, is the date Contractor delivers goods, performs services, or incurs costs. Invoices must assign each billed amount to an appropriate line item of County's order and document each Payment Accrual Date. County may refuse to pay any amount that Contractor bills in which does not conform to County's DO or

DOM document. County will refuse to pay any amount that Contractor bills more than six (6) months after the Payment Accrual Date, pursuant to A.R.S. § 11-622(C).

9. VENDOR RECORD MAINTENANCE

Contractor must establish and maintain a complete Pima County Vendor record, which includes the provision of a properly completed and executed "Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification" document (Form W-9). The record must be registered with a valid and monitored email address for Contractor. In the event of any change that renders the information on that record inaccurate Contractor must update the record within ten (10) calendar days of the change and prior to the submission of any invoice or request for payment. Contractor must register through https://www.pima.gov/208/Vendor-Self-Service-System-VSS.

10. DELIVERY

"On-Time" delivery is an essential part of the consideration that Contractor is to provide to County under the contract. Contractor will make delivery in accordance with the Standard Terms and Conditions and to the location(s) on the DO or DOM document.

- The Pima Sheriff Department's Adult Detention Complex has a standard receiving dock for normal trucks, semitrailers as large as forty-eight (48) ft. in length.
- Unless requested by the Contractor, Food Service receiving hours are <u>strictly</u> 3:00 A.M. to 8:00 A.M. Monday through Friday (including holidays).
- Items must be palletized and shrink-wrapped. Other arrangements can be made for delivery, contact department for other delivery times and dates.

• If required to satisfy the guaranteed delivery interval, Contractor will utilize premium freight method at no additional cost to the County.

Contractor guarantees delivery of product or service in less than two (2) calendar days after issue date of order. If necessary to satisfy the guaranteed delivery time, Contractor will utilize premium freight method at no additional cost to County.

11. TAXES, FEES, EXPENSES

Pursuant to IRS Publication 510, County is exempt from federal excise taxes for goods. County is subject to State and City sales tax. County will pay no separate charges for delivery, drayage, express, parcel post, packing, insurance, license fees, permits, costs of bonds, surcharges, or bid preparation unless the contract expressly includes such charges, and the solicitation documents itemize them.

12. OTHER DOCUMENTS

Contractor and County are entering into this contract have relied upon information provided or referenced by Pima County Solicitation No. IFB-PO-2400046 including the IFB, Offer Agreement, Standard Terms and Conditions, Solicitation Amendments, Contractor's Bid Offer, documents submitted by Contractor or References to satisfy Minimum Qualifications and any other information and documents that Contractor has submitted in its response to County's Solicitation. The Contract incorporates these documents as though set forth in full herein, to the extent not inconsistent with the provisions of this contract.

13. INSURANCE

The Insurance Requirements herein are minimum requirements for this contract and in no way limit the indemnity covenants contained in this contract. Contractor's insurance shall be placed with companies licensed in the State of Arizona and the insureds shall have an "A.M. Best" rating of not less than A- VII, unless otherwise approved by County. County in no way warrants that the minimum insurer rating is sufficient to protect Contractor from potential insurer insolvency.

13.1. Minimum Scope and Limits of Insurance

Contractor will procure and maintain at its own expense, until all contractual obligations have been discharged, the insurance coverage with limits of liability not less than stated below. County in no way warrants that the minimum insurance limits contained herein are sufficient to protect Contractor from liabilities that arise out of the

performance of the work under this contract. If necessary, Contractor may obtain commercial umbrella or excess insurance to satisfy County's Insurance Requirements.

13.1.1. Commercial General Liability (CGL)

Occurrence Form with limits of \$2,000,000 Each Occurrence and \$2,000,000 General Aggregate. Policy shall include cover for liability arising from premises, operations, independent contractors, personal injury, bodily injury, property damage, broad form contractual liability coverage, personal and advertising injury and products – completed operations.

13.1.2. Business Automobile Liability

Bodily Injury and Property Damage for any owned, leased, hired, and/or non-owned automobiles assigned to or used in the performance of this contract with a Combined Single Limit (CSL) of \$1,000,000 Each Accident.

13.1.3. Workers' Compensation (WC) and Employers' Liability

Statutory requirements and benefits for Workers' Compensation. In Arizona, WC coverage is compulsory for employers of one or more employees. Employers' Liability coverage with limits of \$1,000,000 each accident and \$1,000,000 each person - disease.

13.2. Additional Insurance Requirements

The policies shall include, or be endorsed to include, as required by this contract, the following provisions:

13.2.1. Claims-Made Insurance Coverage

If any part of the Required Insurance is written on a claims-made basis, any policy retroactive date must precede the effective date of this contract, and Contractor must maintain such coverage for a period of not less than three (3) years following contract expiration, termination, or cancellation.

13.2.2. Additional Insured Endorsement

The General Liability, Business Automobile policies must each be endorsed to include Pima County and all its related special districts, elected officials, officers, agents, employees, and volunteers (collectively "County and its Agents") as additional insureds with respect to vicarious liability arising out of the activities performed by or on behalf of the Contractor. The full policy limits and scope of protection must apply to County and its Agents as an additional insured, even if they exceed the Insurance Requirements.

13.2.3. Subrogation Endorsement

The General Liability, Business Automobile Liability, Workers' Compensation Policies shall each contain a waiver of subrogation endorsement in favor of County, and its departments, districts, officials, agents, and employees for losses arising from work performed by or on behalf of the Contractor.

13.2.4. Primary Insurance Endorsement

Contractor's policies shall stipulate that the insurance afforded Contractor shall be primary, and that any insurance carried by County, its agents, officials, or employees shall be excess and not contributory insurance. The Required Insurance policies may not obligate County to pay any portion of Contractor's deductible or Self Insurance Retention (SIR).

13.2.5. Insurance provided by Contractor shall not limit Contractor's liability assumed under the indemnification provisions of this Contract.

13.2.6. Subcontractors

Contractor must either (a) include all subcontractors as additional insureds under its Required Insurance policies, or (b) require each subcontractor to separately meet all Insurance Requirements and verify that each subcontractor has done so, Contractor must furnish, if requested by County, appropriate insurance certificates for each subcontractor. Contractor must obtain County's approval of any subcontractor request to modify the Insurance Requirements as to that subcontractor.

13.3. Notice of Cancellation

Each Required Insurance policy must provide, and certificates specify, that County will receive not less than thirty (30) days advance written notice of any policy cancellation, except 10-days prior notice is sufficient when the cancellation is for non-payment of a premium. Notice must be mailed, emailed, hand-delivered or sent via

facsimile transmission to County's Contracting Representative, and must include the project or contract number and project description.

13.4. Verification of Coverage

Contractor shall furnish County with certificates of insurance (valid ACORD form or equivalent approved by County) as required by this contract. An authorized representative of the insurer shall sign the certificates. Each certificate must include:

- County's tracking number for this contract, which is shown on the first page of the contract, and a
 project description, in the body of the Certificate;
- A notation of policy deductibles or SIRs relating to the specific policy; and
- Certificates must specify that the appropriate policies are endorsed to include additional insured and subrogation wavier endorsements for County and its Agents. Note: Contractors for larger projects must provide actual copies of the additional insured and subrogation endorsements.
- 13.4.1. All certificates and endorsements, as required by this contract, are to be received and approved by County before, and be in effect not less than 15 days prior to, commencement of work. A renewal certificate must be provided to County not less than 15 days prior to the policy's expiration date to include actual copies of the additional insured and waiver of subrogation endorsements. Failure to maintain the insurance coverages or policies as required by this contract, or to provide evidence of renewal, is a material breach of contract.
- 13.4.2. All certificates required by this contract shall be sent directly to the appropriate County Department. The Certificate of Insurance shall include County's project or contract number and project description on the certificate. County may require complete copies of all insurance policies required by this contract at any time.

13.5. Approval and Modifications

County's Risk Manager may approve a modification of the Insurance Requirements without the necessity of a formal contract amendment, but the approval must be in writing. County's failure to obtain a required insurance certificate or endorsement, County's failure to object to a non-complying insurance certificate or endorsement, or County's receipt of any other information from the Contractor, its insurance broker(s) and/or insurer(s), do not constitute a waiver of any of the Insurance Requirements.

14. PERFORMANCE BOND

Not applicable to this contract.

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PIMA COUNTY STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. WARRANTY

Contractor warrants goods or services to be satisfactory and free from defects. Contractor also warrants that all products and services provided under this contract are non-infringing.

2. PACKING

Contractor will make no extra charges for packaging or packing material. Contractor is responsible for safe packaging conforming to carrier's requirements.

3. DELIVERY

On-time delivery of goods and services is an essential part of the consideration that County will receive.

Contractor must provide a guaranteed delivery date, or interval period from order release date to delivery if the Price proposal document requires it. Upon receipt of notification of delivery delay, County may cancel the order or extend delivery times at no cost to County. Any extension of delivery times will not be valid unless an authorized representative of County extends it to Contractor in writing.

To mitigate or prevent damages from delayed delivery, County may require Contractor to deliver additional quantity utilizing express modes of transport, or overtime, all costs to be Contractor's responsibility. County may cancel any delinquent order, procure from an alternate source, or refuse receipt of or return delayed deliveries at no cost to County. County may cancel any order or refuse delivery upon default by Contractor concerning time, cost, or manner of delivery.

Contractor is not responsible for unforeseen delivery delays caused by fires, strikes, acts of God, or other causes beyond Contractor's control, provided that Contractor provides County immediate notice of delay.

4. SPECIFICATION CHANGES

County may make changes in the specifications, services, or terms and conditions of an order. If such changes cause an increase or decrease in the amount due under an order or in time required for performance, County will make an acceptable adjustment and will modify the order in writing. No verbal agreement for adjustment is acceptable.

Nothing in this clause reduces Contractor's' responsibility to proceed without delay in the delivery or performance of an order.

5. INSPECTION

County may inspect or test all goods and services at place of manufacture, destination, or both. County may require Contractor to furnish a bond or other indemnification to County against any and all loss, damage, costs, expenses, claims and liability for patent or copyright infringement.

11. INDEMNIFICATION

Contractor will indemnify, defend, and hold harmless County, its officers, employees, and agents from and against any and all suits, actions, legal administrative proceedings, claims or demands and costs, including attorney's fees arising out of any act, omission, fault or negligence by Contractor, its agents, employees or anyone under its direction or control or on its behalf in connection with performance of the contract and any MA, PO or associated orders. Contractor will indemnify, defend and hold County harmless from any claim of infringement arising from services provided under this contract or from the provision, license, transfer or use for their intended purpose of any products provided under this Contract.

12. UNFAIR COMPETITION AND OTHER LAWS

Responses must comply with Arizona trade and commerce laws (Title 44 A.R.S.) and all other applicable County, State, and Federal laws and regulations.

13. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

Contractor will comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, standards and Executive Orders, without limitation. In the event any services that Contractor provides under this contract require a license issued by the Arizona Registrar of Contractors ("ROC"), Contractor certifies that a Contractor licensed by ROC to perform those services in Arizona will provide such services. The laws and regulations of the State of Arizona govern the interpretation and construction of this contract, and the rights, performance and disputes of and between the parties. Any action relating to this Contract must be filed and maintained in a court of the State of Arizona in Pima County.

14. ASSIGNMENT

Contractor may not assign its rights to the contract, in whole or in part, without prior written approval of County. County may withhold approval at its sole discretion, provided that County will not unreasonably withhold such approval.

15. CANCELLATION FOR CONFLICT OF INTEREST

This contract is subject to cancellation pursuant to A.R.S. §§38-506 and 38-511, the pertinent provisions of which are incorporated into this Contract by reference.

16. NON-DISCRIMINATION

Contractor agrees to comply with all provisions and requirements of Arizona Executive Order 2009-09 which is hereby incorporated into this contract as if set forth in full herein including flow down of all provisions and requirements to any subcontractors. During the performance of this contract, Contractor must not discriminate against any employee, client or any other individual in any way because of that person's age, race, creed, color, religion, sex, disability or national origin.

17. NON-APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS

County may cancel this contract if for any reason County's Board of Supervisors does not appropriate funds for the stated purpose of maintaining the contract. In the event of such cancellation, County has no further obligation, other than payment for services or goods that County has already received.

18. PUBLIC RECORDS

Disclosure. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 39-121 et seq., and A.R.S. § 34-603(H) in the case of construction or Architectural and Engineering services procured under A.R.S. Title 34, Chapter 6, all documents submitted in response to the solicitation resulting in award of this Contract, including, but not limited to, pricing schedules, product specifications, work plans, and any supporting documents, are public records. As such, those documents are subject to release and/or review by the general public upon request, including competitors.

<u>Records Marked Confidential; Notice and Protective Order</u>. If Contractor reasonably believes that some of those records contain proprietary, trade-secret or otherwise-confidential information, Contractor must prominently mark those records "CONFIDENTIAL." In the event a public-records request is submitted to County for records marked CONFIDENTIAL, County will notify Contractor of the request as soon as reasonably possible. County will release the records 10 business days after the date of that notice, unless Contractor has, within that period, secured an appropriate order from a court of competent jurisdiction, enjoining the release of the records. County will not, under any circumstances, be responsible for securing such an order, nor will County be in any way financially responsible for any costs associated with securing such an order.

Contractor agrees to waive confidentiality of any price terms.

19. CUSTOM TOOLING, DOCUMENTATION AND TRANSITIONAL SUPPORT

Costs to develop all tooling and documentation, such as and not limited to dies, molds, jigs, fixtures, artwork, film, patterns, digital files, work instructions, drawings, etc. necessary to provide the contracted services or products and unique to the services or products supplied to County are included in the agreed upon Unit Price unless the contract specifically states otherwise. Such tools and documentation are the property of County and will be marked, as is practical, as the "Property of Pima County" and County so requests, Contractor will deliver a copy of the tooling and documentation to County within twenty (20) days of acceptance by County of the first article sample, or not later than ten (10) days of termination of the contract associated with their development, without additional cost to County. Contractor also agrees to act in good faith to facilitate the transition of work to a subsequent Contractor if and as reasonably requested by County at no additional cost. Should exceptional circumstances be present that may justify an additional charge, Contractor may submit said justification and proposed cost and negotiate an agreement acceptable to both Contractor and County, but Contractor may not withhold any requested tooling, document or support as described above that would delay the orderly, efficient and prompt transition of work. 20. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

21. NON-EXCLUSIVE AGREEMENT

Contractor understands that this Contract is nonexclusive and is for the sole convenience of County. County may obtain like services from other sources for any reason.

22. TERMINATION

County may terminate any contract and any MA, PO, Delivery Order, DOM or issued NORFA, in whole or in part, at any time for any reason or no reason, without penalty or recourse, when in the best interests of County. Upon receipt of written notice, Contractor will immediately cease all work as directed by the notice, notify all subcontractors of the effective date of termination, and take appropriate actions to minimize further costs to County. In the event of termination under this paragraph, all documents, data, and reports prepared by Contractor under the contract become the property of County and Contractor must promptly deliver them to County. Contractor is entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for work in progress, work completed, and materials accepted by County before the effective date of the termination.

23. ORDER OF PRECEDENCE - CONFLICTING DOCUMENTS

In the event of inconsistencies between contract documents, the following is the order of precedence, superior to subordinate, that will apply to resolve the inconsistency: MA or PO; DO or DOM; Offer Agreement; these standard terms and conditions; any Contractor terms (Terms of Sale; End User Licenses Agreement; Service Agreement; etc.) attached to an MA, PO, DO or DOM, if applicable; any other solicitation documents.

24. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Contractor is an independent Contractor. Contractor and Contractor officer's agents or employees are not considered employees of County and are not entitled to receive any employment-related fringe benefits under County's Merit System. Contractor is responsible for paying all federal, state and local taxes associated with the compensation received pursuant to this Contract and will indemnify and hold County harmless from any and all liability which County may incur because of Contractor's failure to pay such taxes.

25. BOOK AND RECORDS

Contractor will keep and maintain proper and complete books, records and accounts, which will be open at all reasonable times for inspection and audit by duly authorized representatives of County. In addition, Contractor will retain all records relating to this contract at least five (5) years after its termination or cancellation or, if later, until any related pending proceeding or litigation has been closed.

26. COUNTEPARTS

The parties may execute the MA or PO that County awards pursuant to this solicitation in any number of counterparts, and each counterpart is considered an original, and together such counterparts constitute one and the same instrument. For the purposes of the MA and PO, the signed proposal of Contractor and the signed acceptance of County are each an original and together constitute a binding MA, if all other requirements for execution are present.

27. AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT

Contractor warrants its right and power to enter into the MA or PO. If any court or administrative agency determines that County does not have authority to enter into the MA or PO, County is not liable to Contractor or any third party by reason of such determination or by reason of the MA or PO.

28. FULL AND COMPLETE PERFORMANCE

The failure of either party to insist on one or more instances upon the full and complete performance with any of the terms or conditions of the contract and any MA, PO, DO or DOM to be performed on the part of the other, or to take any action permitted as a result thereof, is not a waiver or relinquishment of the right to insist upon full and complete performance of the same, or any other covenant or condition, either in the past or in the future. The acceptance by either party of sums less than may be due and owing it at any time is not an accord and satisfaction.

29. SUBCONTRACTORS

Contractor is fully responsible for all acts and omissions of any subcontractor and of persons directly or indirectly employed by any subcontractor, and of persons for whose acts Contractor may be liable to the same extent that Contractor is responsible for the acts and omissions of persons that it directly employs. Nothing in this contract creates any obligation on the part of County to pay or see to the payment of any money due any subcontractor, except as may be required by law.

30. SEVERABILITY

Each provision of this contract stands alone, and any provision of this contract that a court finds to be prohibited by law is ineffective to the extent of such prohibition without invalidating the remainder of this contract.

31. LEGAL ARIZONA WORKERS ACT COMPLIANCE

For the procurement of services in the State of Arizona, Contractor hereby warrants that it will at all times during the term of this contract comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to Contractor's employment of its employees, and with the requirements of A.R.S. § 23-214 (A) (together the "State and Federal Immigration Laws"). Contractor will further ensure that each subcontractor who performs any work for Contractor under this contract likewise complies with the State and Federal Immigration Laws.

County has the right at any time to inspect the books and records of Contractor and any subcontractor in order to verify such party's compliance with the State and Federal Immigration Laws.

Any breach of Contractor's or any subcontractor's warranty of compliance with the State and Federal Immigration Laws, or of any other provision of this section, is a material breach of this Contract subjecting Contractor to penalties up to and including suspension or termination of this Contract. If the breach is by a subcontractor, and the subcontract is suspended or terminated as a result, Contractor will take such steps as may be necessary to either self-perform the services that would have been provided under the subcontract or retain a replacement subcontractor as soon as possible so as not to delay project completion.

Contractor will advise each subcontractor of County's rights, and the subcontractor's obligations, under this Section by including a provision in each subcontract substantially in the following form:

"Subcontractor hereby warrants that it will at all times during the term of this contract comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to Subcontractor's employees, and with the requirements of A.R.S. § 23-214 (A). Subcontractor further agrees that County may inspect the Subcontractor's books and records to ensure that Subcontractor is in compliance with these requirements. Any breach of this paragraph by Subcontractor is a material breach of this contract subjecting Subcontractor to penalties up to and including suspension or termination of this contract."

Any additional costs attributable directly or indirectly to remedial action under this Section is the responsibility of Contractor. In the event that remedial action under this Section results in delay to one or more tasks on the critical path of Contractor's approved construction or critical milestones schedule, such period of delay will be excusable delay for which Contractor is entitled to an extension of time, but not costs.

32. CONTROL OF DATA PROVIDED BY COUNTY

For those projects and contracts where County has provided data to enable the Contractor to provide contracted services or products, unless County otherwise specifies and agrees in writing, Contractor will treat, control and limit access to said information as confidential and will under no circumstances release any data provided by County during the term of this contract and thereafter, including but not limited to personal identifying information as defined by A.R.S. § 44-1373, and Contractor is further prohibited from selling such data directly or through a third party. Upon termination or completion of the contract, Contractor will either return all such data to County or will destroy such data and confirm destruction in writing in a timely manner not to exceed sixty (60) calendar days.

33. ISRAEL BOYCOTT CERTIFICATION

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 35-393.01, if Contractor engages in for-profit activity and has ten (10) or more employees, and if this Contract has a value of \$100,000.00 or more, Contractor certifies it is not currently engaged in, and agrees for the duration of this Contract to not engage in, a boycott of goods or services from Israel. This certification does not apply to a boycott prohibited by 50 U.S.C. § 4842 or a regulation issued pursuant to 50 U.S.C. § 4842.

34. FORCED LABOR OF ETHNIC UYGHURS

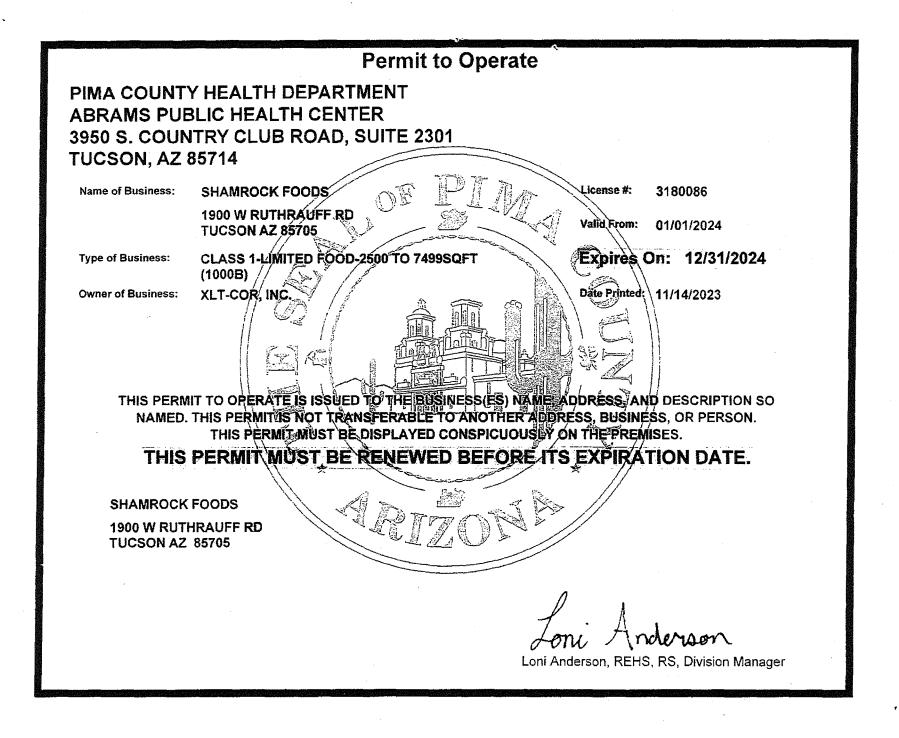

It is Pima County's intent to award multiple vendors.

The established MA will be issued to all Contractors awarded on this contract. County will order Good/Services from the Contractor on the contract offering best value to County. Should that Contractor be unable to provide the Good/Service at the time requested, County will then order the Good/Service from another Contractor available on the contract.

2. CONTRACT TERM, RENEWALS, EXTENSIONS and REVISIONS

The MA will document the commencement date of the contract and will be for a one (1) year period with four (4) oneyear renewal options that the parties may exercise as follows: County will issue contract extensions, renewals, or revisions to Contractor with a revised MA document. Contractor must object in writing to the proposed revisions, terms, conditions, scope modifications and/or specifications within ten (10) calendar days of issuance by County. If Contractor does not notify county of any objections within that timeframe, the revision(s) will be binding on the parties.

3. CONTRACTOR MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

4. PRODUCT OR SERVICE SPECIFICATIONS & SCOPE OF WORK

This contract establishes the requirements under which the Contractor will provide Food Products for Pima County Adult Detention Complex, in accordance herein.

4.1. General Specifications

4.1.1.Pima County's intent to award multiple vendors.

Title: Food Products for Pima County Adult Detention Complex

- 4.1.2.Contractor shall be financially responsible for obtaining all required licenses to comply with pertinent municipal, county, state, and federal laws, and assume liability for all applicable taxes including but not restricted to sales, and personal property. Contractor is responsible for obtaining all required permits.
- 4.1.3.Contractor must guarantee that all deliveries made to Pima County Adult Detention Complex are reserved as first (1st) stop status.
- 4.1.4.The large Wednesday loads, an electric pallet jack is preferred. Contractor must provide their own electric pallet jack.
- 4.1.5.All loads will be unloaded by supplier. Pallets must be standard 48"x40" and should not be stacked higher than 6ft. Failure to palletize and shrink-wrap loads can result in rejection of order and will need to make arrangements to re-deliver same or next day.
- 4.1.6.Items should be free of damage. Damaged items will be returned to the Contractor and replacement items will be delivered at no additional cost to the County. Damaged items will be immediately brought to the attention of the Contractor.
- 4.1.7. Contractor is responsible for all damaged items, except to the extent caused by County's negligence.
- 4.1.8.Contractor must provide invoice at time of delivery or pickup.
- 4.1.9.Contractor will not be held responsible for unforeseen delays caused beyond the Contractor's control, provided they provide prompt notice of delay as soon as Contractor has knowledge of said delays.
- 4.1.10. County will not pay for any additional changes, such as, to include but not limited to, fuel surcharges, environmental fees, trip charges, overtime, and delivery.

4.2. Item Specifications

- 4.2.1.Items ordered by the Sheriff Department will be handled by inmates and thus require special packaging suitable for correctional institutions.
- 4.2.2.Contractor and their suppliers must comply with all of the applicable United States Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) to assure safety and quality of all food products. All food products must be slaughtered, inspected, processed, handled, stored, packaged, labeled, and transported per all applicable state and federal regulations. Food products must be USDA grade specified. Food products not covered by USDA grades are to be of commercial quality. Contractor must comply with the applicable local agency's licensing regulations.
- 4.2.3.Regulations include, but are not limited to the following:
 - United States Code of Federal Regulations; Title 7, Agriculture and Title 21, Food and Drugs
 - United States Pure Food and Drug Acts Standards
 - Federal Food Quality Protection Act
 - USDA Standards, Grades, and Weight Classes.

All merchandise is to be first quality (top U.S. Grade per class) unless seconds are specifically requested by a County department.

4.2.4. Dry Food Product- A dry product that does NOT require freezing or refrigeration.

4.2.5. Damaged Items- Refers to an item that has sustained damage that would allow spillage from the original container, a loss or disfigurement of label that would hinder identification, contaminated package that would affect the content of that package or any other happening that would affect the quality and/or quantity of the original item. Swollen, rusted or dented cans are to be replaced at no charge or credited if the Contractor is notified within fourteen (14) days of the receipt of delivery. Items improperly packaged and stored during transport to maintain environmental temperature and prevent damage or thawing will not be accepted. No distress/damaged, stale, spoiled or merchandise deemed unfit for use will be accepted. Verification of grade and/or pack shall be provided upon request.

Products meeting these "damaged" specifications will be rejected by Pima County and refused and/or returned at the Contractor's expense.

4.2.6.Labels- Upon request by County representative, the Contractor will submit labels; nutritional analysis sheets, ingredient lists: prep/cooking instructions; and reports indicating meat/meat alternates; breads; fruits; and vegetables to document compliance with specifications. All food items will be properly labeled.

- 4.2.7. Net Container Quantity- The minimum net quality of all products in cans and jars will be in accord with the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act. The individual specifications for standard of fill for the products as prescribed in 21 CFR shall be applied.
- 4.2.8.Product Protection Guarantees- Contractors are expected to take immediate action to correct any situation in which product integrity is violated at no fault of the County.
- 4.2.9. Service Level- The Contractor shall fill all original at a monthly average of 98% or above on the scheduled delivery day. The remaining 2% shall be delivered within twenty-four (24) hours of the scheduled delivery day unless the County agrees that the product will be reordered.
- 4.2.10. **Standards of Identity-** All products must conform to U.S. minimum standards of identity as authorized by the Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act and the supporting regulations in 21 CFR- Food for Human Consumption.

All equipment must be models of current production, latest design, and technology, new and unused unless otherwise specified. The successful Proposer must provide manufacturer and Proposer documentation, including and not limited to the following not later than fourteen (14) days after request by County and at no additional cost: warranty; caution-informational warnings; recommended maintenance schedule and process; recommended spare parts list; operating, technical and maintenance manuals including drawings, if appropriate; product brochures; and safety data sheets (SDS).

performance of the work under this contract. If necessary, Contractor may obtain commercial umbrella or excess insurance to satisfy County's Insurance Requirements.

13.1.1. Commercial General Liability (CGL)

Occurrence Form with limits of \$2,000,000 Each Occurrence and \$2,000,000 General Aggregate. Policy shall include cover for liability arising from premises, operations, independent contractors, personal injury, bodily injury, property damage, broad form contractual liability coverage, personal and advertising injury and products – completed operations.

13.1.2. Business Automobile Liability

Bodily Injury and Property Damage for any owned, leased, hired, and/or non-owned automobiles assigned to or used in the performance of this contract with a Combined Single Limit (CSL) of \$1,000,000 Each Accident.

13.1.3. Workers' Compensation (WC) and Employers' Liability

Statutory requirements and benefits for Workers' Compensation. In Arizona, WC coverage is compulsory for employers of one or more employees. Employers' Liability coverage with limits of \$1,000,000 each accident and \$1,000,000 each person - disease.

13.2. Additional Insurance Requirements

The policies shall include, or be endorsed to include, as required by this contract, the following provisions:

13.2.1. Claims-Made Insurance Coverage

If any part of the Required Insurance is written on a claims-made basis, any policy retroactive date must precede the effective date of this contract, and Contractor must maintain such coverage for a period of not less than three (3) years following contract expiration, termination, or cancellation.

13.2.2. Additional Insured Endorsement

The General Liability, Business Automobile policies must each be endorsed to include Pima County and all its related special districts, elected officials, officers, agents, employees, and volunteers (collectively "County and its Agents") as additional insureds with respect to vicarious liability arising out of the activities performed by or on behalf of the Contractor. The full policy limits and scope of protection must apply to County and its Agents as an additional insured, even if they exceed the Insurance Requirements.

13.2.3. Subrogation Endorsement

The General Liability, Business Automobile Liability, Workers' Compensation Policies shall each contain a waiver of subrogation endorsement in favor of County, and its departments, districts, officials, agents, and employees for losses arising from work performed by or on behalf of the Contractor.

13.2.4. Primary Insurance Endorsement

Contractor's policies shall stipulate that the insurance afforded Contractor shall be primary, and that any insurance carried by County, its agents, officials, or employees shall be excess and not contributory insurance. The Required Insurance policies may not obligate County to pay any portion of Contractor's deductible or Self Insurance Retention (SIR).

13.2.5. Insurance provided by Contractor shall not limit Contractor's liability assumed under the indemnification provisions of this Contract.

13.2.6. Subcontractors

Contractor must either (a) include all subcontractors as additional insureds under its Required Insurance policies, or (b) require each subcontractor to separately meet all Insurance Requirements and verify that each subcontractor has done so, Contractor must furnish, if requested by County, appropriate insurance certificates for each subcontractor. Contractor must obtain County's approval of any subcontractor request to modify the Insurance Requirements as to that subcontractor.

13.3. Notice of Cancellation

Each Required Insurance policy must provide, and certificates specify, that County will receive not less than thirty (30) days advance written notice of any policy cancellation, except 10-days prior notice is sufficient when the cancellation is for non-payment of a premium. Notice must be mailed, emailed, hand-delivered or sent via

facsimile transmission to County's Contracting Representative, and must include the project or contract number and project description.

13.4. Verification of Coverage

Contractor shall furnish County with certificates of insurance (valid ACORD form or equivalent approved by County) as required by this contract. An authorized representative of the insurer shall sign the certificates. Each certificate must include:

- County's tracking number for this contract, which is shown on the first page of the contract, and a
 project description, in the body of the Certificate;
- A notation of policy deductibles or SIRs relating to the specific policy; and
- Certificates must specify that the appropriate policies are endorsed to include additional insured and subrogation wavier endorsements for County and its Agents. Note: Contractors for larger projects must provide actual copies of the additional insured and subrogation endorsements.
- **13.4.1.** All certificates and endorsements, as required by this contract, are to be received and approved by County before, and be in effect not less than 15 days prior to, commencement of work. A renewal certificate must be provided to County not less than 15 days prior to the policy's expiration date to include actual copies of the additional insured and waiver of subrogation endorsements. Failure to maintain the insurance coverages or policies as required by this contract, or to provide evidence of renewal, is a material breach of contract.
- **13.4.2.** All certificates required by this contract shall be sent directly to the appropriate County Department. The Certificate of Insurance shall include County's project or contract number and project description on the certificate. County may require complete copies of all insurance policies required by this contract at any time.

13.5. Approval and Modifications

County's Risk Manager may approve a modification of the Insurance Requirements without the necessity of a formal contract amendment, but the approval must be in writing. County's failure to obtain a required insurance certificate or endorsement, County's failure to object to a non-complying insurance certificate or endorsement, or County's receipt of any other information from the Contractor, its insurance broker(s) and/or insurer(s), do not constitute a waiver of any of the Insurance Requirements.

14. PERFORMANCE BOND

Not applicable to this contract.

PIMA COUNTY STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. WARRANTY

Contractor warrants goods or services to be satisfactory and free from defects. Contractor also warrants that all products and services provided under this contract are non-infringing.

2. PACKING

Contractor will make no extra charges for packaging or packing material. Contractor is responsible for safe packaging conforming to carrier's requirements.

3. DELIVERY

On-time delivery of goods and services is an essential part of the consideration that County will receive.

Contractor must provide a guaranteed delivery date, or interval period from order release date to delivery if the Price proposal document requires it. Upon receipt of notification of delivery delay, County may cancel the order or extend delivery times at no cost to County. Any extension of delivery times will not be valid unless an authorized representative of County extends it to Contractor in writing.

To mitigate or prevent damages from delayed delivery, County may require Contractor to deliver additional quantity utilizing express modes of transport, or overtime, all costs to be Contractor's responsibility. County may cancel any delinquent order, procure from an alternate source, or refuse receipt of or return delayed deliveries at no cost to County. County may cancel any order or refuse delivery upon default by Contractor concerning time, cost, or manner of delivery.

Contractor is not responsible for unforeseen delivery delays caused by fires, strikes, acts of God, or other causes beyond Contractor's control, provided that Contractor provides County immediate notice of delay.

4. SPECIFICATION CHANGES

County may make changes in the specifications, services, or terms and conditions of an order. If such changes cause an increase or decrease in the amount due under an order or in time required for performance, County will make an acceptable adjustment and will modify the order in writing. No verbal agreement for adjustment is acceptable.

5. INSPECTION

County may require Contractor to furnish a bond or other indemnification to County against any and all loss, damage, costs, expenses, claims and liability for patent or copyright infringement.

11. INDEMNIFICATION

Contractor will indemnify, defend, and hold harmless County, its officers, employees, and agents from and against any and all suits, actions, legal administrative proceedings, claims or demands and costs, including attorney's fees arising out of any act, omission, fault or negligence by Contractor, its agents, employees or anyone under its direction or control or on its behalf in connection with performance of the contract and any MA, PO or associated orders. 12. UNFAIR COMPETITION AND OTHER LAWS

Responses must comply with Arizona trade and commerce laws (Title 44 A.R.S.) and all other applicable County, State, and Federal laws and regulations.

13. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

Contractor will comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, standards and Executive Orders, without limitation. In the event any services that Contractor provides under this contract require a license issued by the Arizona Registrar of Contractors ("ROC"), Contractor certifies that a Contractor licensed by ROC to perform those services in Arizona will provide such services. The laws and regulations of the State of Arizona govern the interpretation and construction of this contract, and the rights, performance and disputes of and between the parties. Any action relating to this Contract must be filed and maintained in a court of the State of Arizona in Pima County.

14. ASSIGNMENT

Contractor may not assign its rights to the contract, in whole or in part, without prior written approval of County. County may withhold approval at its sole discretion, provided that County will not unreasonably withhold such approval.

15. CANCELLATION FOR CONFLICT OF INTEREST

This contract is subject to cancellation pursuant to A.R.S. §§38-506 and 38-511, the pertinent provisions of which are incorporated into this Contract by reference.

16. NON-DISCRIMINATION

Contractor agrees to comply with all provisions and requirements of Arizona Executive Order 2009-09 which is hereby incorporated into this contract as if set forth in full herein including flow down of all provisions and requirements to any subcontractors. During the performance of this contract, Contractor must not discriminate against any employee, client or any other individual in any way because of that person's age, race, creed, color, religion, sex, disability or national origin.

17. NON-APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS

County may cancel this contract if for any reason County's Board of Supervisors does not appropriate funds for the stated purpose of maintaining the contract. In the event of such cancellation, County has no further obligation, other than payment for services or goods that County has already received.

18. PUBLIC RECORDS

<u>Disclosure</u>. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 39-121 et seq., and A.R.S. § 34-603(H) in the case of construction or Architectural and Engineering services procured under A.R.S. Title 34, Chapter 6, all documents submitted in response to the solicitation resulting in award of this Contract, including, but not limited to, pricing schedules, product specifications, work plans, and any supporting documents, are public records. As such, those documents are subject to release and/or review by the general public upon request, including competitors.

<u>Records Marked Confidential; Notice and Protective Order</u>. If Contractor reasonably believes that some of those records contain proprietary, trade-secret or otherwise-confidential information, Contractor must prominently mark those records "CONFIDENTIAL." In the event a public-records request is submitted to County for records marked CONFIDENTIAL, County will notify Contractor of the request as soon as reasonably possible. County will release the records 10 business days after the date of that notice, unless Contractor has, within that period, secured an appropriate order from a court of competent jurisdiction, enjoining the release of the records. County will not, under any circumstances, be responsible for securing such an order, nor will County be in any way financially responsible for any costs associated with securing such an order.

Contractor agrees to waive confidentiality of any price terms.

19. CUSTOM TOOLING, DOCUMENTATION AND TRANSITIONAL SUPPORT

Costs to develop all tooling and documentation, such as and not limited to dies, molds, jigs, fixtures, artwork, film, patterns, digital files, work instructions, drawings, etc. necessary to provide the contracted services or products and unique to the services or products supplied to County are included in the agreed upon Unit Price unless the contract specifically states otherwise. Such tools and documentation are the property of County and will be marked, as is practical, as the "Property of Pima County" and County so requests, Contractor will deliver a copy of the tooling and documentation to County within twenty (20) days of acceptance by County of the first article sample, or not later than ten (10) days of termination of the contract associated with their development, without additional cost to County. Contractor also agrees to act in good faith to facilitate the transition of work to a subsequent Contractor if and as reasonably requested by County at no additional cost. Should exceptional circumstances be present that may justify an additional charge, Contractor may submit said justification and proposed cost and negotiate an agreement acceptable to both Contractor and County, but Contractor may not withhold any requested tooling, document or support as described above that would delay the orderly, efficient and prompt transition of work. Should conduct by Contractor result in additional costs to County, Contractor will reimburse County for said actual and incremental costs provided that County has given Contractor reasonable time to respond to County's requests for support.

20. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

Contractor will comply with all applicable provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (public law 101-336, 42 USC 12101-12213) and all applicable federal regulations under the act, including 28 CFR parts 35 and 36.

21. NON-EXCLUSIVE AGREEMENT

Contractor understands that this Contract is nonexclusive and is for the sole convenience of County. County may obtain like services from other sources for any reason.

22. TERMINATION

County may terminate any contract and any MA, PO, Delivery Order, DOM or issued NORFA, in whole or in part, at any time for any reason or no reason, without penalty or recourse, when in the best interests of County. Upon receipt of written notice, Contractor will immediately cease all work as directed by the notice, notify all subcontractors of the effective date of termination, and take appropriate actions to minimize further costs to County. In the event of termination under this paragraph, all documents, data, and reports prepared by Contractor under the contract become the property of County and Contractor must promptly deliver them to County. Contractor is entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for work in progress, work completed, and materials accepted by County before the effective date of the termination.

23. ORDER OF PRECEDENCE – CONFLICTING DOCUMENTS

In the event of Inconsistencies between contract documents, the following is the order of precedence, superior to subordinate, that will apply to resolve the inconsistency: MA or PO; DO or DOM; Offer Agreement; these standard terms and conditions; any Contractor terms (Terms of Sale; End User Licenses Agreement; Service Agreement; etc.) attached to an MA, PO, DO or DOM, if applicable; any other solicitation documents.

24. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Contractor is an independent Contractor. Contractor and Contractor officer's agents or employees are not considered employees of County and are not entitled to receive any employment-related fringe benefits under County's Merit System. Contractor is responsible for paying all federal, state and local taxes associated with the compensation received pursuant to this Contract and will indemnify and hold County harmless from any and all liability which County may incur because of Contractor's failure to pay such taxes.

25. BOOK AND RECORDS

Contractor will keep and maintain proper and complete books, records and accounts, which will be open at all reasonable times for inspection and audit by duly authorized representatives of County. In addition, Contractor will retain all records relating to this contract at least five (5) years after its termination or cancellation or, if later, until any related pending proceeding or litigation has been closed.

26. COUNTEPARTS

The parties may execute the MA or PO that County awards pursuant to this solicitation in any number of counterparts, and each counterpart is considered an original, and together such counterparts constitute one and the same instrument. For the purposes of the MA and PO, the signed proposal of Contractor and the signed acceptance of County are each an original and together constitute a binding MA, if all other requirements for execution are present.

27. AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT

Contractor warrants its right and power to enter into the MA or PO. If any court or administrative agency determines that County does not have authority to enter into the MA or PO, County is not liable to Contractor or any third party by reason of such determination or by reason of the MA or PO.

28. FULL AND COMPLETE PERFORMANCE

The failure of either party to insist on one or more instances upon the full and complete performance with any of the terms or conditions of the contract and any MA, PO, DO or DOM to be performed on the part of the other, or to take any action permitted as a result thereof, is not a waiver or relinquishment of the right to insist upon full and complete performance of the same, or any other covenant or condition, either in the past or in the future. The acceptance by either party of sums less than may be due and owing it at any time is not an accord and satisfaction.

29. SUBCONTRACTORS

Contractor is fully responsible for all acts and omissions of any subcontractor and of persons directly or indirectly employed by any subcontractor, and of persons for whose acts Contractor may be liable to the same extent that Contractor is responsible for the acts and omissions of persons that it directly employs. Nothing in this contract creates any obligation on the part of County to pay or see to the payment of any money due any subcontractor, except as may be required by law.

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30. SEVERABILITY

Each provision of this contract stands alone, and any provision of this contract that a court finds to be prohibited by law is ineffective to the extent of such prohibition without invalidating the remainder of this contract.

31. LEGAL ARIZONA WORKERS ACT COMPLIANCE

For the procurement of services in the State of Arizona, Contractor hereby warrants that it will at all times during the term of this contract comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to Contractor's employment of its employees, and with the requirements of A.R.S. § 23-214 (A) (together the "State and Federal Immigration Laws"). Contractor will further ensure that each subcontractor who performs any work for Contractor under this contract likewise complies with the State and Federal Immigration Laws.

County has the right at any time to inspect the books and records of Contractor and any subcontractor in order to verify such party's compliance with the State and Federal Immigration Laws.

Any breach of Contractor's or any subcontractor's warranty of compliance with the State and Federal Immigration Laws, or of any other provision of this section, is a material breach of this Contract subjecting Contractor to penalties up to and including suspension or termination of this Contract. If the breach is by a subcontractor, and the subcontract is suspended or terminated as a result, Contractor will take such steps as may be necessary to either self-perform the services that would have been provided under the subcontract or retain a replacement subcontractor as soon as possible so as not to delay project completion.

Contractor will advise each subcontractor of County's rights, and the subcontractor's obligations, under this Section by including a provision in each subcontract substantially in the following form:

"Subcontractor hereby warrants that it will at all times during the term of this contract comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to Subcontractor's employees, and with the requirements of A.R.S. § 23-214 (A). Subcontractor further agrees that County may inspect the Subcontractor's books and records to ensure that Subcontractor is in compliance with these requirements. Any breach of this paragraph by Subcontractor is a material breach of this contract subjecting Subcontractor to penalties up to and including suspension or termination of this contract."

Any additional costs attributable directly or indirectly to remedial action under this Section is the responsibility of Contractor. In the event that remedial action under this Section results in delay to one or more tasks on the critical path of Contractor's approved construction or critical milestones schedule, such period of delay will be excusable delay for which Contractor is entitled to an extension of time, but not costs.

32. CONTROL OF DATA PROVIDED BY COUNTY

For those projects and contracts where County has provided data to enable the Contractor to provide contracted services or products, unless County otherwise specifies and agrees in writing, Contractor will treat, control and limit access to said information as confidential and will under no circumstances release any data provided by County during the term of this contract and thereafter, including but not limited to personal identifying information as defined by A.R.S. § 44-1373, and Contractor is further prohibited from selling such data directly or through a third party. Upon termination or completion of the contract, Contractor will either return all such data to County or will destroy such data and confirm destruction in writing in a timely manner not to exceed sixty (60) calendar days.

33. ISRAEL BOYCOTT CERTIFICATION

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 35-393.01, if Contractor engages in for-profit activity and has ten (10) or more employees, and if this Contract has a value of \$100,000.00 or more, Contractor certifies it is not currently engaged in, and agrees for the duration of this Contract to not engage in, a boycott of goods or services from Israel. Since the inception of COVID, PCSD has had to deal with constant menu changes due to the market and still due to this day. We are flexible. Generally PCSD's Jail Menu consists of four (4) cycles, and we maintain an excel spreadsheet (order guide) that lists the average weekly usage of its menu based on Pima Co. Adult Detention Complex's population. This information is shared with our vendors on a weekly basis so they can get a better understanding of our usage. Unfortunately our population is in constant flux and can range anywhere from 1600 to 1900 inmates at any given time. PCSD goal is to minimize waste; all of our cycles tend to have 75% of the same product on its menu to alleviate this issue especially with our lack of food storage, staff, and to insure perishable items are used before expiration. Utilizing 75% of the same food allows flexibility for both parties.

Q. 6) If there is opportunity for a longer delivery window that will allow us to bid with the deepest savings we can provide to you?

A. 6) Generally orders are placed on Monday's and specific food items are delivered on specific days to allow proper food rotation and to allow its vendors the ability for flexibility. These orders are for the following calendar week and (menu cycle).

41-1001.01. Regulatory bill of rights; small businesses

- A. To ensure fair and open regulation by state agencies, a person:
 - 1. Is eligible for reimbursement of fees and other expenses if the person prevails by adjudication on the merits against an agency in a court proceeding regarding an agency decision as provided in section 12-348.
 - 2. Is eligible for reimbursement of the person's costs and fees if the person prevails against any agency in an administrative hearing as provided in section 41-1007.
 - 3. Is entitled to have an agency not charge the person a fee unless the fee for the specific activity is expressly authorized as provided in section 41-1008.
 - 4. Is entitled to receive the information and notice regarding inspections and audits prescribed in section 41-1009.
 - 5. May review the full text or summary of all rulemaking activity, the summary of substantive policy statements and the full text of executive orders in the register as provided in article 2 of this chapter.
 - 6. May participate in the rulemaking process as provided in articles 3, 4, 4.1 and 5 of this chapter, including:
 - a) Providing written comments or testimony on proposed rules to an agency as provided in section 41-1023 and having the agency adequately address those comments as provided in section 41-1052, subsection D, including comments or testimony concerning the information contained in the economic, small business and consumer impact statement.
 - b)Filing an early review petition with the governor's regulatory review council as provided in article 5 of this chapter.
 - c) Providing written comments or testimony on rules to the governor's regulatory review council during the mandatory sixty-day comment period as provided in article 5 of this chapter.
 - 7. Is entitled to have an agency not base a licensing decision in whole or in part on licensing conditions or requirements that are not specifically authorized by statute, rule or state tribal gaming compact as provided in section 41-1030, subsection B.
 - 8. Is entitled to have an agency not make a rule under a specific grant of rulemaking authority that exceeds the subject matter areas listed in the specific statute or not make a rule under a general grant of rulemaking authority to supplement a more specific grant of rulemaking authority as provided in section 41-1030, subsection C.
 - 9. May allege that an existing agency practice or substantive policy statement constitutes a rule and have that agency practice or substantive policy statement declared void because the practice or substantive policy statement constitutes a rule as provided in section 41-1033.
 - 10. May file a complaint with the administrative rules oversight committee concerning:
 a) A rule's, practice's or substantive policy statement's lack of conformity with statute or legislative intent as provided in section 41-1047.
 b) An existing statute, rule, practice alleged to constitute a rule or substantive policy statement that is alleged to be duplicative or onerous as provided in section
 - b)An existing statute, rule, practice alleged to constitute a rule or substantive policy statement that is alleged to be duplicative or onerous as provided in section 41-1048.
 - 11. May have the person's administrative hearing on contested cases and appealable agency actions heard by an independent administrative law judge as provided in articles 6 and 10 of this chapter.
 - 12. May have administrative hearings governed by uniform administrative appeal procedures as provided in articles 6 and 10 of this chapter and may appeal a final administrative decision by filing a notice of appeal pursuant to title 12, chapter 7, article 6.
 - 13. May have an agency approve or deny the person's license application within a predetermined period of time as provided in article 7.1 of this chapter.
 - 14. Is entitled to receive written notice from an agency on denial of a license application;
 - a) That justifies the denial with references to the statutes or rules on which the denial is based as provided in section 41-1076.
 - b)That explains the applicant's right to appeal the denial as provided in section 41-1076.
 - 15. Is entitled to receive information regarding the license application process before or at the time the person obtains an application for a license as provided in sections 41-1001.02 and 41-1079.
 - 16. May receive public notice and participate in the adoption or amendment of agreements to delegate agency functions, powers or duties to political subdivisions as provided in section 41-1026.01 and article 8 of this chapter.
 - 17. May inspect all rules and substantive policy statements of an agency, including a directory of documents, in the office of the agency director as provided in section 41-1091.
 - 18. May file a complaint with the office of the ombudsman citizens' aide to investigate administrative acts of agencies as provided in chapter 8, article 5 of this title.
 - 19. Unless specifically authorized by statute, may expect state agencies to avoid duplication of other laws that do not enhance regulatory clarity and to avoid dual permitting to the extent practicable as prescribed in section 41-1002.
 - 20. May have the person's administrative hearing on contested cases pursuant to title 23, chapter 2 or 4 heard by an independent administrative law judge as prescribed by title 23, chapter 2 or 4.
 - 21. Pursuant to section 41-1009, subsection E, may correct deficiencies identified during an inspection unless otherwise provided by law.
- B. The enumeration of the rights listed in subsection A of this section does not grant any additional rights that are not prescribed in the sections referenced in subsection A of this section.
- C. Each state agency that conducts audits, inspections or other regulatory enforcement actions pursuant to section 41-1009 shall create and clearly post on the agency's website a small business bill of rights. The agency shall create the small business bill of rights by selecting the applicable rights prescribed in this section and section 41-1009 and any other agency-specific statutes and rules. The agency shall provide a written document of the small business bill of rights to the authorized on-site representative of the regulated small business. In addition to the rights listed in this section and section 41-1009, the agency notice of the small business bill of rights shall include the process by which a small business may file a complaint with the agency employees who are designated to assist members of the public or regulated community pursuant to section 41-1006. The notice must provide the contact information of the agency's designated employees. The agency notice must also state that if the regulated person has already made a reasonable effort with the agency to resolve the problem and still has not been successful, the regulated person may contact the office of ombudsman-citizens aide.
