- > Public defense Services- projected to be \$2,607,687 over budget
- > Superior Court – projected to be \$597,899 over budget
- > Facilities Management – projected to be \$473,610 over budget
- > Human Resources – projected to be \$2,408,631
- > ITD- projected to be \$1,885,154
- > Transportation – projected to be \$2,197,567 over budget

Agenda Item #23: LexisNexis VitalChek Network, Inc., Amendment No. 1, to provide for ordering of vital records, extend contract term to 1/31/25 and amend contractual language, contract amount \$1,600,000.00 revenue.

Agenda Item #33: Arizona Department of Health and Human Services/Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Amendment No. 2, to provide for COVID-19 Health Disparities, extend grant term to 5/31/26 and amend grant language, no cost.
