- Re: FY 2013-14 Recommendations for Funding

The Outside Agency Community Advisory Committee is a panel of five members appointed by the Board of Supervisors to serve as their representatives, and one member appointed by the County Administrator. The Committee is charged with recommending funding allocations for many community agencies seeking financial support from Pima County. The Committee reviews funding requests from agencies that submit applications for five of the six service categories. The Committee does not make recommendations for the General Services category nor does the Committee review funding requests for the Economic Development and Tourism and Community Services Employment and Training departments.

# FY 2013-14 Recommendations

The Outside Agency Community Advisory Committee held public meetings during the months of March and April at the Pima County Housing Center. The Committee was specifically interested in those agencies that were new to the Outside Agency process or those agencies for which staff reported program performance or contract compliance issues. All currently funded agencies are being recommended for a second year of level funding with the exception of the following 10 programs listed in this chart.

# Pg. 2 FY 2013-14 Outside Agency Committee Recommendations

Four agencies funded in the current fiscal year are not being recommended for funding While these programs are worthy and provide quality services, concerns were discussed by the Committee with the agency representatives in a public forum and it was determined that those funds could be used for more immediate needs that are a high priority.

The agencies continue to provide important services to help meet Pima County's needs, both rural and urban, from Ajo to Green Valley, from Catalina to Arivaca. Fifty-eight programs are being recommended to the Board of Supervisors for funding to serve more than 250,000 individuals. The Outside Agency program will fund more then \$1.8 million dollars in salaries distributed across 190 jobs throughout the County, both full and part-time positions. These non-profit agencies are a tremendous source of economic strength in our community, representing a combined \$165 million in total organizational budgets.

I applaud the County Administrator and Board of Supervisors for your efforts in funding the Outside Agencies even in these times of significant budget constraints. The Outside Agency process is community based and transparent; a truly extraordinary program. The Committee recognizes the responsibility that is given to each member to evaluate the needs of Pima County and make these recommendations to the Board of Supervisors. Each year it is evident that the quality of these programs and services has a profound impact throughout Pima County.

I am proud of the Committee's quality work, their time investment and commitment to this process. A list of all funding recommendations for FY 2013-14 is included as an attachment
