**Funding Source:** U.S. Department of Labor, Arizona Department of Economic Security funding for youth that has already been served in the WIA In-school program. WIA is being replaced by a new act.

**Purpose:** Provide Summer Youth Activities with subsidized work experience to One Stop youth participants to prepare them for the workforce, ensure participants have the skills needed to enter into the workplace and encourage them to stay in school or return to school. The contract is for five (5) months.

**Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:** Provide work experience to youth that will enhance entry into the workplace. 90% of participants will successfully complete at least 90% of work hours and attain at least 80% proficiency in the work readiness skills.

**Public Benefit**: Increases Pima County's economic development by helping to develop a trained and productive labor force that meets employer needs.
