Dear Ms. Brigode,

I am writing on behalf of Vail Christian Church, owner of the above referenced tax parcels. Vail Christian acquired the above parcels on January 31, 2013. Subsequent to acquisition Vail Christian filed for an exemption of property tax under ARS 42-11109 and was denied citing two reasons. First, the property "Does not meet requirements of any subsection in Arizona Revised Statute Title 42 Chapter 11 Article 3 Exemptions". 42-11109 (A) clearly states that property used for or held primarily for religious worship, including land are exempt from taxation if the property is not used or held for profit. Vail Christian Church is a non-profit 501c(3) religious organization and has no profit generating centers within our church, thus the qualifications are met.

The second citation of the denial letter indicates the property "Does not meet ownership per lien date of January 1st". This is correct as we purchased the property on January 31, 2013. Despite numerous discussions with the county assessor's office I am not clear on why we are responsible for property taxes even though we are a qualifying organization, regardless of the date of purchase.

It should be noted that Vail Christian Church re-applied for exemption in 2014 and was granted full exemption, adding to our quandary as to why we are responsible for taxes during the 2013 tax year. To further complicate the matter the denial letter issued to Vail Christian Church, which I have attached here, appears to be a form letter which was improperly composed. Although I am listed in the address of the letter, the salutation addresses a Mr. Stacy, a name that is not associated with the business operations of Vail Christian Church. It is this incorrect salutation along with the first incorrect citation for denial that leads me to believe the assessor's office did not properly review our request for exemption.

On April 17, 2014 Vail Christian Church paid property taxes totaling \$11,718.19 on the 013D parcel and \$12,584.02 on the 013E parcel for the 2013 tax year. Pursuant to ARS 42-11109 (E), which entitles a qualifying organization to a refund of taxes paid if the request is made within one year of the taxes paid, Vail Christian Church is formally requesting a refund of the 2013 property taxes paid.

In attempt to be as efficient as possible with this request for a refund a representative of Vail Christian Church spoke with Mr. Ryan Call in the Pima County Assessor's office in hopes of identifying the proper

forms and procedures for such a request. Mr. Call indicated that contacting you directly is the only way to start the process.

Since no direction was provided to request this refund I would kindly ask for your response accepting this letter as a formal request for the refund of all property taxes paid for the 2013 tax year on Pima County Assessor's parcel numbers 141-02-013D and 141-02-013E totaling \$24,302.21.

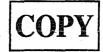

Dear Ms. Brigode,

In reference to the above listed parcels I am providing this letter of specific intent for use as a religious worship facility / location.

Vail Christian Church purchased the two parcels on January 31, 2013 with the intent to develop the raw land into a worship facility. In August 2012 Vail Christian engaged the services of an architect to prepare conceptual site plans related to possible configurations of the property. This engagement prior to owning the subject property provides solid evidence of our intent to develop and I have attached that concept site plan here.

Subsequent to closing escrow Vail Christian Church engaged Swaim and Associates as our architect of record. Swaim and Vail Christian have worked together to formulate official drawings for approximately 50,000 square feet of space and pull permits to develop the first phase which consists of approximately 20,000 square feet. I have enclosed a copy of those permits here.

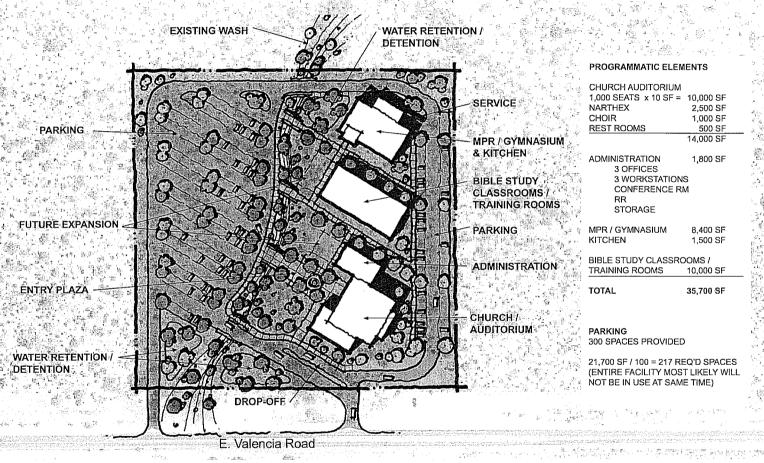
Since purchasing the site Vail Christian Church has utilized the location for monthly prayer meetings as well as occasional Sunday gatherings. The primary focus of use to date has been preparation for construction where, once phase one is completed in December 2015, Vail Christian will have invested over \$6,500,000 into the property. Vail Christian is expected to spend between \$12,000,000 and \$14,000,000 to fully develop the parcels.

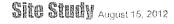

VAIL CHRISTIAN CHURCH BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1 NAME

The name of this corporation is Vail Christian Church

ARTICLE 2 PURPOSE

Section 1 Primary Purpose

The primary purpose for which this organization is formed is to glorify God by forming a local congregation that will carry out the great commission of the Lord Jesus Christ as revealed in the New Testament of the Word of God (Matthew 28:18-20 and Mark 16:15-16). This congregation will provide opportunity for Christ Followers to continue steadfastly in the apostles' teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread and prayers (Acts 2:42). It will also prepare them for works of service and multiplication (Ephesians 4:12).

Section 2 Secondary Purpose

A secondary purpose for the formation of this organization is to meet the legal requirements necessary for a church organization to own, acquire, and to dispose of real property. For this reason this congregation is incorporated according to the laws of the State of **Arizona** and these By-Laws are drawn to include regulation of the congregation as a corporation as well as to govern its chosen procedure in carrying out its work.

ARTICLE 3 STATEMENT OF FAITH AND ESSENTIAL BELIEFS

We believe that the Church is at the center of God's purpose for this age and that God's wisdom will be displayed to the entire universe through the Church to the praise of His glory. (Ephesians 3:1-13)

We believe that Christ's central purpose is building His Church, and ultimately His kingdom; and nothing can stand in His way, even Satan and all his forces. (Matthew 16:13-20)

We believe that the Church is the pillar and support of the truth and that this truth was delivered once and for all through the Apostles and that this deposit of truth ought to be preserved in all churches. (1 Timothy 3:14-16; 2 Timothy 1:13-14; 3:10, 11, 15; 1 Thessalonians 3:15; 2 Peter 3:1-2; Jude 3, 17)

We believe in the perpetual command of the Great Commission to take the gospel to the world. We believe that Christ's strategy for building His Church can be clearly identified in the book of Acts as a multiplication of churches—communities of Christ Followers committed to maturing in Christ and to furthering the gospel of Jesus Christ. (Matthew 28:19-20; Luke 24:44-49; Acts 1:8; Acts 13:1-4; 14:19-23; 20:28-32; 1 Timothy 3:14-16; Titus 1:5-9)

The Gospel Proclaimed by the Apostles: The Kerygma (Greek for "Proclamation")

We believe that this gospel, proclaimed by the Apostles, can be summarized as follows:

This gospel was prophesied beforehand in the Scriptures as part of God's unfolding plan to bless the families of the earth through the seed of David. It was given in the form of a New Covenant, promising forgiveness of sins, and placing God's Spirit within man.

This gospel was fulfilled in Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the seed of David, the King of Kings, born of the Holy Spirit. He came in the flesh, lived a sinless life, died, was buried and rose again on the third day according to the Scriptures, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

This Jesus will come again to judge the earth and set up the kingdom of God for all time. After abolishing all rule and authority, He will reign forever and ever. Those who hear this message and believe will receive forgiveness of sins. They will be given the Spirit of God as a pledge of their inheritance, as they eagerly await the Savior who will return for them. (Acts 2:14-22; 3:11-26; 10:23-48; Acts 9:1-43; 26:1-32; Acts 17:16-34; 1 Corinthians 15:1-11)

We believe that there is only one gospel of Jesus Christ. Each individual who places His faith in the person and work of Christ alone for forgiveness of his sins is at that moment forgiven of his sins once and for all time, is permanently a child of God, and is part of Christ's Church. (Ephesians 1:1-14; 2:1-10; Colossians 1:9-14; 1 Corinthians 12:12-13; 2 Corinthians 5:14-17; Romans 5 and 8)

We believe that the Church of Jesus Christ is made up of those who have accepted the message of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Those who have responded to the gospel of Jesus Christ need to be baptized, signifying their identification with Jesus and with His believing community, His Church. (Matthew 28:19-20; Acts 10:44-48; Romans 6:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:12-13)

We believe that once one has identified with Christ and His Church through baptism, special care should be exercised to see that the baptized Christ Follower becomes a vital, functioning member of a body of Christ—a local church. (Matthew 28:19-20; Acts 10:44-48; 1 Corinthians 12:1-31)

We believe that each Christ Follower should celebrate the Lord's Supper regularly with the church. This will serve as a way of remembering his identity with Christ, as one whose sins are forgiven and in a covenant relationship, and as a way of remembering his identity with Christ's body, the Church, as one who is to live in fellowship with the church. (1 Corinthians 11:17-34)

The Apostles Doctrine: The Didache (Greek for "The Teaching")

We believe that God revealed His plan for the churches in the epistles, and that the Apostles expected the churches to follow their instructions. (Ephesians 3:1-13; 1 Thessalonians 4:1-2; 2 Thessalonians 2:15; 3:6; 1 Timothy 3:14-16; 2 Timothy 1:13-14; 2:2; 3:9-10; Jude 3, 17)

We believe that this teaching can be summarized as follows: Each Christ Follower is instructed to lay aside his old life, renew His mind in the teaching, and conform his new life to the will of God. (Ephesians 4:22-24; Romans 12:1-2)

A set of virtues, which are only possible through God's resources, are to characterize each Christ follower. (Galatians 5:22-33; Colossians 3:12; 2 Peter 1:1-11) Individual households must be ordered properly, consistent with God's created design for man and for the Church. (Ephesians 5:22-6:9; Colossians 3:18-4:1; 1 Peter 3:1-7)

God's household, the church—the pillar and support of the truth—must be properly ordered according to sound doctrine received from the Apostles, especially Paul. (1 Timothy 3:14-16; Titus 1:5-2:15; 2 Thessalonians 2:15; 3:6; Ephesians 3:1-13; Colossians 1:24-29)

Each Christ Follower must be committed to do his part, both generally in one-another ministry and specifically in the use of his gifts in the building up of the church. (Romans 12:3-16; 1 Corinthians 12:4-6)

A pattern of relationships within the church must be observed—characterized by love, brotherhood, mutual acceptance and respect—in which each is to diligently pursue unity in the bond of peace. (Romans 12:9-15; 14:1-7; Philippians 1:27-2:4; Ephesians 4:1-6)

A pattern of relationships in the world must be observed—characterized by respect for government, employers, and other authorities, and love and good deeds toward neighbors and those in need. (Romans 13:1-7; Titus 2:14; 3:1,14) Individuals must lead responsible and sober lives—working hard, providing for their own,

making the most of the time (because the days are evil), and keeping on the alert for Satan and his strategies in their lives. (Ephesians 5:1-22; 6:10-18; 1 Thessalonians 4:9-12; 2 Thessalonians 3:6-15; 1 Peter 5:6-11)

We believe that all matters concerning the life and beliefs of the churches are to be settled by the Word of God. Though the church is to be guarded and protected by elders and men gifted as pastors and teachers, all are subject to the authority of the biblical text. (1 Timothy 4:1-16; 6:3-5; 2 Timothy 2:14-15; 3:16; 4:1-4; Titus 1:5-16; 2:1, 15; 2 Peter 3:14-18; Jude 3, 17)

The Godhead - There is one God, who eternally exists in three persons—Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Each is equal in divine nature and perfect in every way. (Deut. 6:4; Matt. 28:19; I Cor. 8:6, John 10:30; Acts 5:3-4).

God the Father - God is a personal spirit. God has revealed himself through His Word, nature, man's conscience, prophets and His Son. While some of his attributes are comprehended (e.g. his love, justice, and compassion), other attributes are incomprehensible (e.g. his eternality, omnipresence, omnipotence and omniscience). The Father is the creator of the universe and has purposed all events in history according to his eternal plan. (John 4:24; Rom. 1:20; 2:15; Il Peter 1:21; John 1:8; Eph. 1:11).

Jesus Christ - Jesus Christ is the second member of the Trinity and the perfect image of the invisible God. He is God's uniquely begotten Son, conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of a virgin. When he was born on the earth, he became fully man while continuing to be fully God. He lived a perfect life and died on the cross as our substitute to pay the penalty for the sins of the world. He was buried and rose from the dead on the third day. He ascended back into heaven where He currently is interceding for us as our high priest. (Col. 1:15; Phil. 2:5-8; Matt. 1:18-25; I Pet. 2:24; Heb. 4:14-15; John 1:1,14,18).

Holy Spirit - The Holy Spirit is the third member of the Trinity. He came forth from the Father and the Son to convict the world of sin, righteousness and judgment. He baptizes and seals, regenerates, sanctifies and empowers Christ Followers and is our abiding helper, guide, teacher and source of power to help us live a godly life. (John 3:8; 14:16; 15:26; 16:7-17; Eph. 4:30;5:18).

Mankind - Man was created in the image of God, both male and female reflecting God's likeness. Adam, representative of the human race, fell into sin, suffered spiritual death and greatly marred the image of God in man. All mankind has subsequently inherited a sin nature and the consequences of sin. (Gen. 1:26-27; Rom. 3:10-18,23; 6:23; Eph. 2:1).

Salvation - Because of man's guilty state, he was incapable of atoning for his sin. God's love prompted Him to send Jesus to the earth to die for the sins of the world, offering man forgiveness and salvation solely through faith in Jesus as a free gift. Redemption is based on the grace of God and the work of Christ on our behalf. (John 3:16; 5:24; 10:28; 14:6; Eph. 2:8-9; Acts 4:12; 16:31, Heb. 7:25, 1 John 5:13).

Angels - Angels originally were created by God as sinless beings. Some rebelled against God and are now fallen. The leader of these fallen angels is Satan, who is the enemy and accuser of man. Unfallen angels are ministering spirits, serving God and His purposes. (Col. 1:16; Jude 6; Rev. 12:9; Eph. 6:11-12; II Cor. 4:4; Heb. 1:14).

The Bible - The Bible is a divinely inspired revelation of God, which came through the agency of man, preserving both a divine and human origin. It is inerrant in the original manuscripts and authoritative on matters of faith and practice. (II Tim. 3:16-17; II Peter 1:21; John 10:35).

ARTICLE 5 ELDERS (ELDER COUNCIL)

Section 1 Selection

Elders shall be appointed by the Elder Council except during the time of establishment where they will be first appointed by the Lead Pastor.

Section 2 Responsibilities

The Elder Council is the final authority for this corporation.

Some shall:

Function as the Church Board of Directors of the corporation;

All Shall:

Be the spiritual leaders of the congregation, including the resolution of any disputes;

Meet with and counsel members of the congregation, as appropriate;

Select and hire a Lead Pastor;

Execute and enforce the By-Laws of this corporation;

Ensure that the vision and the ends of the Church are being fulfilled through the **Governance Document**;

Section 6 Removal from Office

Whenever the Elders determine that an Elder should be removed from his ministry as an Elder, they shall notify the Lead Pastor before a meeting to vote to do so. A vote of two thirds from the Elder Council must confirm removal of an Elder.

Section 7 Filling of Vacancies

If an Elder resigns or is removed from office, the Lead Pastor may appoint another individual to serve as an Elder until a vote can be taken by the Elder Council as long as that individual meets the qualifications set forth in Section 3, Article 5.

Section 8 Leadership Team

During any period in which there are less than two Elders, the Lead Pastor shall appoint a leadership team to serve as the Church Board until two or more Elders have been elected by the leadership team.

Call To Order: John Thompson called the meeting to order at 12:30pm and noted that all voting members of the Elder Council are present and that all business transacted and/or approved must be via consensus opinion (unanimous).

Land Purchase Discussion

Andrew leads discussion on the current status of the proposed land purchase:

- Mission Investment Fund approves the finance for the 10 acre parcel north of Valencia at Frost Drive (9455 9485)
 - o \$725K total cost
 - o \$145K down payment
 - o \$580K principal
 - o 5.5% interest rate with 25 year amortization with balloon at 5 years
- Church Development Fund (CDF) terms are not competitive with the MIF financing
 - o >7.5% rate and 20 year amortization
- Site Usage Study for 50% utilization completed
 - Architectural concepts indicated 50% utilization (worst case) could easily accommodate church facility with our needs.
 - o Future zoning variances are an option but will not be required.
- All other studies completed and show a clear path forward
 - o Pima County agrees to work easement for moving bike trailhead w/ State of Arizona
 - o Riparian and floodplain studies completed and new classification of small drainage is not prohibitive to the planned church facility
 - o A sewage pumping facility may be required depending on final grade and other facility factors not seen as a barrier to proceeding
 - o Appraisal completed: \$745K

Land Purchase / Loan Approval

- A motion was made by Mike and seconded by David to approve the purchase of the 10 acre parcel at 9455 – 9485 E. Valencia Road for the development of a worship facility (church) for Vail Christian Church.
 - o The motion was unanimously approved.
- A motion was made by Thom and seconded by David to approve entering into a \$580,000 financing transaction with the terms presented earlier in the meeting with the Mission Investment

Fund. Further, Ben and Andrew acting together may sign and execute all necessary documentation required to enter the transaction.

o The motion was unanimously approved.

1. Organization

Vail Christian Church (the Church) was organized in 2005. It is an independent Christian church located in Vail, Arizona. The Church is a nonprofit organization. We exist as a church to be the center of God's purpose for this age. God's wisdom will be displayed to the entire universe through the Church therefore Christ's central purpose is building His Church, and ultimately His Kingdom. We are to be the pillar and support of this truth. The Church is supported primarily through contributions from the congregation.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Church have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and accordingly reflect all significant receivables, payables and other liabilities.

Financial Statement Presentation

The Church reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets (unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets) based upon the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

- <u>Unrestricted net assets</u> Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.
- <u>Temporarily restricted net assets</u> Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that
 may or will be met either by actions of the Church and/or the passage of time. When a
 restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net
 assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from
 restrictions.
- Permanently restricted net assets Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that
 they be maintained permanently by the Church. Generally, the donors of these assets
 permit the Church to use all or part of the income earned on any related investments for
 general or specific purposes. There are currently no permanently restricted net assets.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include all monies in banks and highly liquid investments with maturities of less than three months. The carrying value of cash and cash equivalents approximates fair market value because of the short maturities of those financial instruments.

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost or donated value. The cost of maintenance, repairs, and minor renewals is charged to expense in the year incurred. Expenditures which increase the useful lives of assets are capitalized and depreciated. Costs and related allowance for depreciation of properties sold or otherwise retired are eliminated from the

asset and accumulated depreciation accounts. Gain or loss on dispositions is recorded at the time of disposition.

Depreciation and amortization for financial reporting purposes is computed using the straight-line and accelerated methods over the following estimated useful lives:

Revenue Recognition

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions.

All donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a purpose restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Contributed Services

The Church receives a substantial amount of services donated by its members in carrying out the Church's ministry. No amounts have been reflected in the financial statements for those services since they do not meet the criteria for recognition under generally accepted accounting principles.

Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing the various programs and activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

Income Taxes

The Church is exempt from federal and state income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and Arizona Revenue and Taxation Code Section 10-2545.A

1. Organization

Vail Christian Church (the Church) was organized in 2005. It is an independent Christian church located in Vail, Arizona. The Church is a nonprofit organization. We exist as a church to be the center of God's purpose for this age. God's wisdom will be displayed to the entire universe through the Church therefore Christ's central purpose is building His Church, and ultimately His Kingdom. We are to be the pillar and support of this truth. The Church is supported primarily through contributions from the congregation.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Church have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and accordingly reflect all significant receivables, payables and other liabilities.

Financial Statement Presentation

The Church reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets (unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets) based upon the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

- <u>Unrestricted net assets</u> Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.
- <u>Temporarily restricted net assets</u> Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that
 may or will be met either by actions of the Church and/or the passage of time. When a
 restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net
 assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from
 restrictions.
- <u>Permanently restricted net assets</u> Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that
 they be maintained permanently by the Church. Generally, the donors of these assets
 permit the Church to use all or part of the income earned on any related investments for
 general or specific purposes. There are currently no permanently restricted net assets.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include all monies in banks and highly liquid investments with maturities of less than three months. The carrying value of cash and cash equivalents approximates fair market value because of the short maturities of those financial instruments.

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost or donated value. The cost of maintenance, repairs, and minor renewals is charged to expense in the year incurred. Expenditures which increase the useful lives of assets are capitalized and depreciated. Costs and related allowance for depreciation of properties sold or otherwise retired are eliminated from the

3. <u>Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, Continued</u> asset and accumulated depreciation accounts. Gain or loss on dispositions is recorded at the time of disposition.

Depreciation and amortization for financial reporting purposes is computed using the straight-line and accelerated methods over the following estimated useful lives:

Revenue Recognition

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions.

All donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a purpose restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Contributed Services

The Church receives a substantial amount of services donated by its members in carrying out the Church's ministry. No amounts have been reflected in the financial statements for those services since they do not meet the criteria for recognition under generally accepted accounting principles.

Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing the various programs and activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

Income Taxes

The Church is exempt from federal and state income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and Arizona Revenue and Taxation Code Section 10-2545.A

Upon dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors, after satisfaction of related debts, shall dispose of all remaining assets to another nonprofit organization, under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, chosen under the Directors' determination and qualifying as a currently supported mission of the Church.

In January 2013 the Church purchased an approximate 10 acre parcel of land for future development. Total purchase price was \$735,794 which includes \$10,794 in closing costs. Development costs associated with the parcel are recognized as Construction in Progress. No physical construction has begun as of the date of this statement.

Employees are allowed to make tax-deferred contributions, within IRS guidelines. Churches are exempt from discrimination rules. The expense to the church for the year, through June 30, 2014, is \$4,200.

14. Operating lease

The church leases equipment under an operating agreement. Total lease expense for the year, through June 30, 2014 was \$10,773.

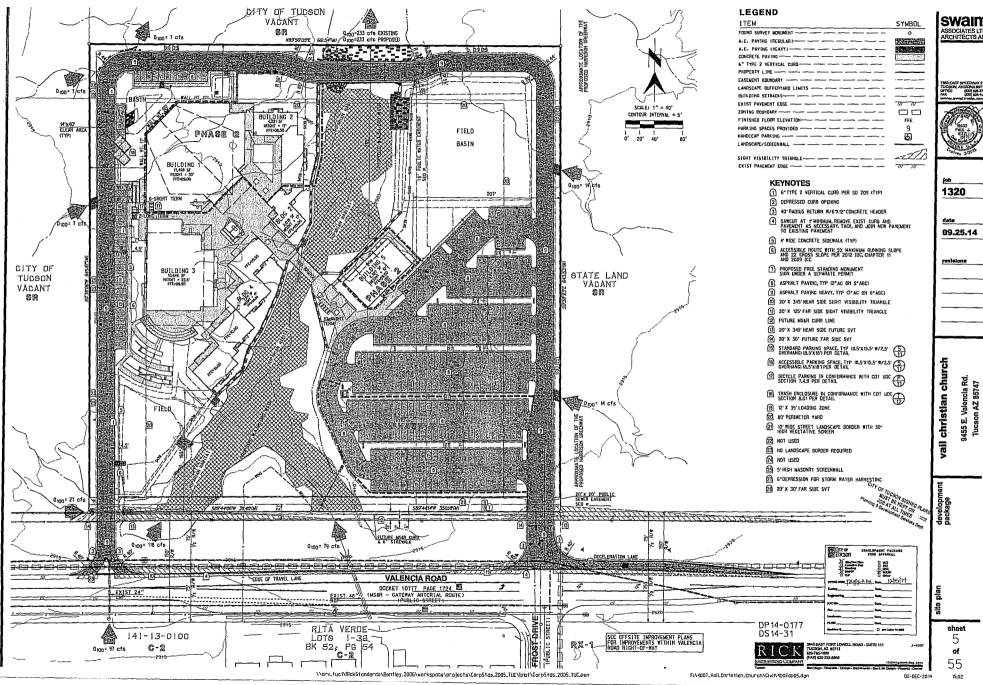
