





# What is the purpose of the Major Routes and Scenic Routes Plan?

- Establishes major and scenic routes
- Designates future right-of-way widths for major streets
- Enables County to reserve roadway right-of-way as development occurs by requiring setbacks
- Does <u>not</u> establish roadway types, sizes, or designs
- Limits development heights along scenic routes
- Has not recently been substantially updated

# **Proposed Changes**

- 11 New Routes
- 53 Deleted Routes
- 2 Realigned Routes
- 4 Increased Right-of-way
- 105 Reduced Right-of-way
- 20 Scenic, Major to Scenic, Non-Major
- Classify Arterial (hi, med, low) or Collector




Twin Buttes Road, from 60 ft to 90 ft







