 - e. Estimated Expenses (Show all major areas, labor, cost of goods, etc.)
 - f. Proposed Capital Improvements you intend to make prior to racing to the Rillito Race Track facilities directly related to racing
 - g. Show sufficient capital resources available to open and operate the race meet.

4) How do you plan on marketing the racing meet for the 2015 season?

I have attached a conceptual sketch of the Rillito Racetrack proposed modifications for your review. The County will make every attempt to coordinate construction to allow racing to commence during the dates as approved in the agreement. However, all parties involved will need to work closely to create a safe environment for all park users during the meet.

MICHAEL A. WEISS

Michael A. Weiss is President and CEO of Weiss Ideas LLC, which was established to provide professional services for business ventures including, but not limited to, racing, entertainment, business consulting, promotions, and management.

Michael has diligently served the racing industry over the past couple decades. After working in many capacities at various racing venues, he saw his visions fulfilled by taking a small thoroughbred track and making it one of the most recognized in the country. In 1987, Michael was appointed as the Director of Racing at Beulah Park Race Track in Grove City, Ohio. From September 1996 to September 2010, Michael served as Executive Vice President and General Manager, overseeing the entire operation. He became nationally recognized as one of the industry's most innovative marketing and promotions coordinators. His marketing innovations include creating the Beulah Twins, the Fortune Six bet (now the Gulfstream Rainbow 6), and optimizing relationships within the industry to increase export by over 200%.

Michael also succeeded in making Beulah Park a destination and entertainment facility, bringing in hundreds of thousands of people during its "dark days" on the annual calendar. He secured and managed the contract negotiations and sponsorships for all events, such as the AMA Professional Motorcycle Races, the world's largest mud volleyball tournament, as well as procuring Grove City's Blast at Beulah (July 4th), Balloons and Tunes (Hot-Air Balloon Festival), concerts, and many more. His demonstrated skill in handling the advertising, publicity and community relationships..

Upon its creation in 2001, Michael became the Executive Vice President and General Manager of AmericaTab. He oversaw complete operations of this ADW (Advance Deposit Wagering) company. He handled all contract negotiations with other tracks, betting facilities and Inter and Intra-state regulatory bodies. His knowledge and association with racing industry officials all over the world provided him with the ability to become the driving force in making AmericaTab one of the largest telephone and internet account wagering businesses in the world, growing from \$3.5 million in 2001 to over a Quarter Billion Dollars in 2007. In June of 2007, AmericaTab was purchased by Churchill Downs and is now under the Twinspires.com brand.

While working at Beulah Park, Michael was also the **Director of Racing** at the new Birmingham Race Course from 1991 until 1993. He was involved in the re-opening and re-development of the thoroughbred and quarter horse program. Prior racing official experience includes positions at Thistledown Racetrack, Hialeah Park, Gulfstream Park, and Monmouth Park in capacities such as Assistant Starter, Horse Identifier, Clocker, Placing Judge, Paddock Judge and Stable Superintendent.

Recent ventures include working with the North Dakota Racing Commission as manager of the North Dakota Horse Park. In 2012 Live racing returned after a long absence and Mike is instrumental in the reopening of a very successful live race meet.

Since 2011 - two years of working with Avatar Ventures (darkhorsebet.com) they have seen account wagering growth from approx. 20 to 80 million dollars in handle a year.

Racetrack Television Network uses Mike on new business development projects.

- In 1991, Michael was the first Director of Racing in the nation to use Equibase Past Performances and was one of the first to use the 7&7 program, where two tracks work together to form one race program.
- Michael worked to acquire and develop the NHC Qualify on-line version of the daily racing form NTRA handicapping challenge for Beulah Park to host.
- Representing the mid-west racetracks, he was appointed to the Equibase Board of Directors in 2001 and continued in that capacity for 10 years and upon leaving was given an award of merit. During his tenure, he represented Beulah Park on the Board of the TRA (thoroughbred racing association).
- In December 2006, the University of Arizona awarded Michael the John Goodman Alumni Award for outstanding contribution to the racing industry.
- 2007- 2010 Michael was **President of the Southern Co-Op**, heading a group of 20 racetracks that work together in a buying cooperative.
- Michael served as a regular speaker, not only at the Joe Hirsch Speaker Series, but also at many racing industry meetings, including the TRA Simulcast Conference, and the University of Arizona - Symposium on Racing.

Since 2011 - two years of working with Avatar Ventures (darkhorsebet.com) they have seen account wagering growth from approx. 20 to 80 million dollars in handle a year.

- In 1991, Michael was the first Director of Racing in the nation to use Equibase Past Performances and was one of the first to use the 7&7 program, where two tracks work together to form one race program.

3) Provide a financial business plan for the 2015 season that shows the following:

a. Projected number of racing days -

We will propose to the Arizona Department of Racing twenty (20) live race days for the Rillito Spring Meet, and 4 live race days for the Fall Pima County Fair Racing Meet.

See Racing Calendar included in this proposal.

b. Estimated attendance -

Our proforma is based on 5,000 paid attendees per live race day. The crowds at Rillito are amazing, but statistics show that only approximately 45% of attendees pay admission. We believe that the crowds can be increased and maintained by:

- Reduction in general admission to \$2.00 collected from 85% of attendees
- Increased pre-season and ongoing marketing efforts
- Reaching out to the community through charities and demographic specific days.
- Added attractions such as concerts and festivals
- Accessing the infield between races on race days

c. Admission Rates:

GENERAL ADMISSION -

Free General Admission – Free General Admission will be offered to children under the age of twelve, Military Personnel, and Arizona Department of Racing License holders.

\$2.00 Daily General Admission — A two-dollar admission is more in line with tracks nationwide. General Admission gains access to the first floor of the Grandstand, the spectator area surrounding the Grandstand, and access to the infield.

\$30.00 General Admission Season Pass - A season pass offers a 25% discount for the 20-race day season.

GRANDSTAND ADMISSION -

\$5.00 Grandstand Seating – In addition to covering the access gained by General Admission, a Grandstand Seating ticket gains access to Grandstand Open Seating.

\$75.00 Grandstand Seating Season Pass – A season pass offers a 25% discount for the 20-race day season.

\$80.00 Reserved Grandstand Seating* – includes one Grandstand Seating Pass.

\$475.00 Reserved Grandstand Window Boxes* – includes four Grandstand Seating Passes. No waiter service provided.

\$20.00 Daily Grandstand Window Boxes - Tables leased for a single race day do not include Grandstand Admission.

CLUBHOUSE ADMISSION -

\$10.00 Daily Clubhouse Admission Pass — Clubhouse Admission gains access to the Clubhouse, Finish-Line Grandstand area, and any non-reserved table seating.

\$150.00 Clubhouse Admission Season Pass – A season pass offers a 25% discount for the 20-race day season.

\$500.00 Reserved Clubhouse Patio Table* - Includes four Daily Clubhouse Admission Passes, one Preferred Parking Pass. Waiter service provided.

\$650.00 Reserved Clubhouse Table* \$700 if video monitor is provided. - Includes four Daily Clubhouse Admission Passes, one Preferred Parking Pass. Waiter service provided.

\$800.00 Reserved Clubhouse Window/Premium Table* \$850 if video monitor is provided. - Includes four Daily Clubhouse Admission Passes, one Preferred Parking Pass. Waiter service provided.

\$850.00 New Reserved Finish-Line Boxes* \$900 if video monitor is provided. - Includes six Daily Clubhouse Admission Passes, two Preferred Parking Passes. Waiter service provided.

\$25.00 Daily Clubhouse or Patio Table – Tables leased for a single race day do not include Clubhouse Admission or Parking Pass

\$40.00 Daily Clubhouse Window/Premium Table – Tables leased for a single race day do not include Clubhouse Admission or Parking Pass

\$40.00 Daily Finish-Line Boxes - Boxes leased for a single race day do not include Clubhouse Admission or Parking Pass.

* Reserved Box, Table, and Seating Re-Sale Policy – The Track policy will be that Reserved Box, Table, or Seat Holders will have the option of notifying Hospitality no later than the day before a given race day that they will not be utilizing their reserved box, table or seat for that race day. Upon notification, Track Hospitality will add their box, table, or seat into the daily rental inventory and offered at the daily rates posted above. 50% of the daily rental will be returned to the holder of the reserved box, seat or table and 50% retained by the Track.

This multi-tiered admissions and seating options are new features not previously offered at Rillito, and based on sampling statistics these programs are expected to generate substantial interest, advanced revenue, and increased attendance.

d. Projected Revenue (Show all primary sources, gate, food and beverage, etc.)

Proposed Revenue Enhancements include:

- Expanded number of Racing Days
- Tighter Gate Admission controls.
- Greater outreach education of the attendees as to the hows and whys of parimutuel wagering.
- Expanded offerings in concessions for food and beverage, as well as increased points of sale, and tighter inventory controls.
- Reintroduction of Simulcast wagering during the meet.
- Added entertainment opportunities including non-racing related events and festivals during the meet.
