Title: Preparedness Month Proclamation

Introduction/Background:

Each year September is designated as National Preparedness Month in which there is a nationwide coordinated effort sponsored by the U.S Department of Homeland Security to encourage Americans to prepare for emergencies in their homes, businesses, and schools.

Discussion:

The Pima County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) requests the Board of Supervisors' proclaim September as **Preparedness Month** in Pima County in support of the national efforts.
