But a cell tower in the adjoining parking lot will destroy with a Capital D the entrance to our subdivision and the views of ??? adjoining homes. This letter is in regards to the proposed cellular tower at the San Ignacio Heights Golf Course / HOA or Golf yard maintenance yard. I am a resident of San Ignacio Heights HOA. I am thoroughly discussed with all aspects of this proposal. The military has a description for how this effort was presented and carried out. You can call me if there is a lack of knowledge in terminology. Initially there was the lack of notification to residents beyond one thousand feet. This impacts all of Green Valley HOA'S. A widely organized announcement coming from GVC, prior to consideration should have been carried out. There should have been multiple sites chosen for consideration adhering to the proper **Ordinance**, which seems to be totally ignored. I greatly fault the GVC Council for its involvement from the initial stage. The council is supposed to look after its members and not card blanch a Utilities proposal to place a unsightly tower in the entrance way to a HOA housing development. Those who have paid additional fees for view lots, will have their houses devalued.

I attended both meetings at which time the President of the GVC stated that a committee was being set up to consider future site locations. Dah!! do you think? I think the GVC should reconsider its initial and then re-thought proposal to allow this installation to go through and do the committing now, and establish some guide lines. Just flying a minuscule drone after proposing to launch a balloon to appease residents of site obstruction was another, detrimental military description.

There also seems to be some disagreement or misrepresentation of the elevation of both sites. A discrepancy of 95ft. oppose to 56ft. Clarification of each point in true final elevation needs to be presented. Instead the difference between **structures** actual height is being touted. Elevation between sites needs to be addressed in sea level.

There is also the matter of rezoning. What affect will this have on property values

and the houses included in the rezoning. Would there be a need to rezone the maintenance site also, if that site is selected.

I don't want a cell tower positioned at the entrance to our HOA. Please consider the above and act accordingly.
