Purpose:

RESOLUTION OF THE PIMA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN SUPPORT OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE ARIZONA GAME AND FISH DEPARTMENT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SHADE RAMADA AT THE SOUTHEAST REGIONAL PARK CLAY TARGET CENTER

The Board of Supervisors of Pima County, Arizona finds:

- 1. The Arizona Game and Fish Commission under A.R.S. § 17-231(B)(4) has authorized the establishment of a Shooting Range Development Policy providing financial assistance for the development of shooting ranges for public purposes.
- 2. The Arizona Game and Fish Department has responsibility for the administration of the policy and has established guidelines and procedures governing applications for funding assistance under the policy.
- 3. The Arizona Game and Fish Department's application procedures require the applicant's governing body to approve by resolution the submission of applications for shooting range assistance.
- 4. The Pima County Board of Supervisors, in accordance with A.R.S. §11-251, supports the application of Pima County to the Arizona Game and Fish Department for a Shooting Range Development Grant for construction of a shade ramada at the Southeast Regional Park Clay Target Center.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Pima County Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approves the filing of an application to the Arizona Game and Fish Department for a Shooting Range Development Grant for construction of a shade ramada at the Southeast Regional Park Clay Target Center.
- 2. Certifies that the project application is consistent and compatible with all adopted plans and programs for safe shooting range development.
- 3. Agrees that Pima County will comply with all procedures, guidelines and requirements of the Arizona Game and Fish Department as a part of the application process.
- 4. Acknowledges that the project scope and funding amount are subject to final approval by the Arizona Game and Fish Commission.

Leonard Ordway, Shooting Sports Program Manager for the Pima County Department of Natural Resources, Parks and Recreation, is hereby authorized and directed to act on behalf of Pima County with regard to this grant application by conducting negotiations with the Arizona Game and Fish Department and by executing and submitting documents, including but not limited to applications, agreements,

amendments, and other documents which may be necessary for the completion of the shooting range development project.

2017 AGFD Range Development Grant Application

Applicant:

Pima County - Natural Resources, Parks and Recreation Department

Project:

SE Regional Park Clay Target Center Shade Ramada

Project Description

Our project plan is to construct an approximate 30' x 30' ramada canopy to fully cover an existing concrete slab in front of the County's Clay Target Center small office building. The ramada will replace a very small covering in front of the office that currently only provides weather coverage for the cashier's window area. The existing concrete slab in front of the office provides adequate room for tables and seating by customers, but generally receives minimal extended seating use because there is no shade over it, and it does not afford the means for seated guests to remove themselves from the weather elements.

The new ramada will afford shooters as well as spectators a place to sit and relax between rounds or when waiting for or watching shooters. Because of the facility's use by youth group (BSA, 4H and SCTP) shooters, we often have non-shooting parents having no place to sit on property out of the sun. The new covered area will also allow small groups to have a place to gather and meet prior to shooting, after shooting, or in association with facility events. In general customer welfare and shooter safety will increase as they will have a covered shaded area and gathering spot to remove themselves from extended sun and/or bad weather exposure, and a nice place to sit down and rest between clay target rounds. A rested and relaxed shooter generally shoots better and is safer. This is especially important for the older shooters who frequent our shooting facility.

The County's Clay Target Center makes up part of the County's SE Regional Shooting complex, and is situated in the Vail-Corona de Tucson area adjoining the County Fairgrounds southeast of Tucson city proper. Visitors to the facility come from across the Tucson area with a majority coming from the southeastern Tucson basin. Population in and around the Tucson area is roughly three-quarters of a million people. During the winter months the facility sees its peak use; plus, it serves as a complimentary local practice facility for the Tucson Trap and Skeet Club Range located to the southwest of Tucson. Currently the Clay Target Center is receiving about 3,000 visitors per year, and is only open to public shooting for half days on weekends. Having an enhanced covered area for guests to sit and rest at will allow the County the opportunity to consider extended public shooting hours, especially during the cooler part of the year.

Clay target shooters of all experience levels as well their non-shooting guests will benefit from the project. Monthly our facility is used by BSA, 4H and SCTP Youth Trap and Skeet

Shooters who come from Pima, Cochise and Santa Cruz Counties, along with their coaches and parents. BSA holds their annual shotgun merit badge qualification at the facility, and 4H holds their annual Southeastern Arizona Trap and Skeet Shoot at the facility. Tucson area Senior Olympics Trap and Skeet Competition Events are conducted during January at the Clay Target Center. During the late summer and fall of the year we see an influx of hunters who come to renew and hone their shotgun shooting skills in preparation for migratory and upland bird seasons. Most recently our facility has begun to offer league shooting during the spring and late fall for both trap and skeet shooting, so with the new ramada covering we will have a place to conduct league meetings. And finally, small groups associated with local churches and companies have begun to use our facility for fun shoots and small charity events; again the new ramada will afford these small groups a meeting location.

Schedule of Deliverables:

July 2017 - Awarding and acceptance of Grant from AGFD

July-September 2017 - Contractor completing final plans and engineering to obtain

Permit(s); final plans submitted to AGFD for approval

October 2017 – Quarterly report to AGFD

October-November - Project construction by contractor and painting by County

staff and volunteers

December 2017 - Project completion and inspection by AGFD

January 2018 – Final project report to AGFD

Funding:

If the grant is approved for 50% of the construction costs, the County plans to pay for the final project planning / engineering / permitting, and the remaining 50% of the construction costs using our Natural Resources, Park and Recreation Department FY2018 budgeted operation and maintenance funds. Any subsequent enhancement to the ramada that is deemed necessary will be covered by our Shooting Sports Program budgeted operation and maintenance funds. The project as presented in attached proposal and draft concept plans will meet the necessary customer welfare needs, and enhance current weekend and by agreement operations at the Clay Target Center. Plus, the design allows for future enhancement or adjustment of the ramada to address operation expansion in the future.

Without the grant for 50% of the construction costs of the ramada, it is unlikely that this project will be completed in the foreseeable County budget future.

Information and Outreach for the Completed Project:

The County plans to place a sign with logos (AGFD and Pima County – NRPR) on or near the new ramada covering acknowledging and thanking the AGFD for the project. An article with photos and logos will be completed after the project is complete and disseminated externally to the public, as well as internally to County employees, using the County's electronic newsletter processes. And finally, as part of any public gathering and presentation that is done in association with the ramada, staff will verbally thank and acknowledge AGFD for the project, and express the value to the shooting public of the AGFD Range Development Grant process.

Community Support:

The need for an enlarged and enhanced covered resting and meeting area in association with the small office at our Clay Target Center is one of the most common comments that we get from both external and internal customers. So in general all customers using the facility now and in the future would support this project. Attached you will find formal letters from local 4H, BSA and SCTP leadership expressing the need and support for this project and the grant awarding by AGFD.

Project Plan

Please refer to attached project proposal and draft concept plans from an outside contractor that the County could use for the project. Upon grant award the County will pay for and have the selected contractor complete final and formal engineered plans, and acquire building permit for the project. All will be submitted to AGFD for final approval and construction authorization.

Reasonable Public Access and Fees

Hours and Days of Operation for the Clay Target Center are as follows:

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7:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m.; May 1 - October 31 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.; November 1 - April 30
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Saturday and Sunday; Closed on all Pima County holidays

At the Clay Target Center there is no membership fee, but rather a per round of trap or skeet target range fees as follows:

Daily Range Fees:

General Public - Day Pass: \$8 per 25-target round

General Public Discount Multi-Use Pass: \$140 per 20 25-target rounds (7 per 25-target round)

College Level SCTP: \$6 per 25-target round

Organize Youth - SCTP, 4H and BSA: \$3 per 25-target round

For groups and special events outside of normal public shooting times, a special use agreement is setup for the group and they generally shoot at the reduced Discount Multi-Use Pass of \$140 per 20 25-target rounds (or \$7 per 25-target round).

Master Plan

The Clay Target Center is situated in proximity and association with the County's Shooting and Archery Ranges to the west, with all three together making up the Pima County SE Regional Shooting Complex situated on 3/4 Section of County owned land. The complex is situated in association with the County Fairgrounds and Motorsports Park to the southeast of Tucson. Please refer to attached master plan over view picture.

The Clay Target Center is new in design, constructed per NRA standards, and opened in 2013. The range is staffed and supervised by NRA trained County Rangemasters. It has six fields - three are for trap shooting, and the other three fields are combination fields for shooting either trap or skeet. Trap machines are from Pat Trap and skeet machines are from Mattarelli, with the system being controlled via Duematic hardware and software. Trap machines can either be activated manually or via Canterbury voice release system; the skeet machines are activated manually. Additionally, there are a parking lot, small office/cashier building with front cashier window area shade, small field shade ramadas with bench seating, uncovered concrete picnic tables, restroom facility, target storage container and a patterning board area.

The Rifle/Pistol Range is situated across Harrison Road to the west of the Clay Target Center. The Shooting Range is relatively new, built to NRA standards and opened in 2004. The main public portion of the Shooting Range offers 18 covered shooting positions from 5 to 50 yards for small bore and handgun, and 12 covered shooting positions for rifle/big bore at 100 and 200 yards. Additionally, there is a separate Education Range that provides 30 covered shooting positions from 5 to 50 yards primarily for small bore and handgun. Target

frames are provided. The range is open to the public on Thursday through Sunday, and by reservation; it is staffed and supervised by NRA trained County Rangemasters. Additionally, there are a parking lot, education center with administrative offices (230-person occupancy), small office/cashier building, rangemaster office, shop area, equipment storage bay, 5 minimobile type storage containers and restroom facility.

The Archery Range is also situated across Harrison Road to the west of the Clay Target Center and north of the Rifle/Pistol Range. The Archery Range is new in design and construction and opened in 2013. The range offers 30 distance marked shooting positions from 10 yards to 100 yards, and with Pacific Bow Butt stacked targets as a backstop for each shooting lane. Targets are provided on the bow butts. The entire range is surrounded by earthen berms. The range is open to the public on Thursday through Sunday, and by reservation; it is staffed and supervised by NRA trained County Rangemasters. Additionally, there are a parking lot, small shade ramadas with bench seating and restroom facility. For beginner archery training the education center noted above for the shooting range is setup with 10 indoor 20 yard shooting positions with Hips Archery Targets and safety curtain.

Location Map

Please refer to attached Pima County map depicting the project location in the County, and the attached aerial view of the Clay Target Center depicting the location of the project at the facility. As noted above the Clay Target Center is one part of the County's SE Regional Park Shooting Complex, and the shooting range complex is one component of the County's SE Regional Park and Fairgrounds Complex. The shooting range complex is either surrounded by County owned land or expansive open desert State Land. No proximal development is underway or planned in the foreseeable future for the open desert State Land situated to the west and north of the County owned land on which the shooting complex sits.

Public Benefit Information

The entire SE Regional Park Shooting Complex was created, developed and is currently operated to provide an array of safe and responsible public shooting experiences in association with excellent customer service by County Staff. Program focus is on public shooting and to provide an atmosphere and experience to encourage young and new shooters, while at the same time providing for experienced shooters. The facility is staffed by NRA credentialed rangemasters supported by a diverse cadre of about 60 active volunteers.

In 2015 the Pima County shooting complex had approximately 22,000 visitors - 18,000 for the Shooting Range, 3,000 for the Clay Target Center and 1,000 for the Archery Range. Events included weekly open public shooting, monthly Hunter Education classes/field days in association with Arizona Game & Fish Department personnel and volunteers, monthly 4H practice and annual shoot involving all three ranges, regular BSA merit badge training and qualifications involving all three ranges, regular Clay Target Center use by Scholastic Clay Target Program athletes (youth and college level) for practice and training, Trap and Skeet League, Annual Senior Olympic Shotgun/Pistol/Rifle competitions, and charity fundraising events by local businesses. Beginning in September 2016 the BSA and University of AZ Scholastic Action Pistol Program groups began using our Shooting Range facility. And finally, we have an annual Volunteer Celebration at the County Shooting Complex in February wherein we host all of our volunteers and their families allowing them to use the ranges free of charge in return for the about 6,000 hours of time per year that the volunteers donate to the County Shooting Sports Program.

Our Education Building and Range supports training and qualification for Arizona Game and Fish Department officers, local law enforcement officers, local security organizations, a local Arizona Ranger group, local chapter of The Well-Armed Women, and contract firearms training vendors. And finally as a well-respected member of our local community a couple of businesses (and ACE Hardware and a local gun shop) provide discounts to shooters who purchase shooting accessories and ammunition from them to use at our range facilities.

Every year since our facility has opened and subsequently expanded, customer use has grown. We are respected for providing a safe, responsible and affordable facility to shoot at. And every improvement that we have made (including the planned ramada) has been focused to benefit and improve customer experience and welfare at our shooting complex.

Our team consists of approximately 50 youth, ages 9 through 18, and 15 volunteer coaches.

I am writing to you in support of the Pima County Southeast Clay Target Center, and their application for a range development grant from the Arizona Game and Fish Department to assist in funding a project to build a shade Ramada extension to the existing Clay Target Center office building at their facility. This facility, run by the Pima County Natural Resources, Parks and Recreation Department, is one of only a few clay target ranges available for youth groups in our area. Our team, as well as several others from Southern Arizona, already utilize this facility for team practices, instruction, coaching and volunteer training. 






Attachment 3. Master Plan - Shooting Complex Aerial Overview Picture
