Alzheimer's, breast cancer, gastro-intestinal problems, and endocrine disruption causing diabetes, heart disease, infertility and thyroid disease.

Young and her allies are trying to convince the Marana Unified School District Governing Board to reconsider the "partnership" it approved with Monsanto. MUSD's support for FTZ status gave the school district a half-million dollar one-time payment in place of the \$3-1/2 million it would collect in taxes over the next five years. Pima Community College's Governing Board, described by county officials as "up in the air," actually voted 3-2 to deny Monsanto their support.

According to the Star's Tony Davis in a January 28 article, Supervisor Richard Elias, who has opposed the Monsanto deal, was surprised to find out that a BOS "no" vote would probably kill Monsanto's chances of FTZ status and a two-third property tax reduction. Newcomer Steve Christy, who has been favorable to the deal, also didn't know that opposition would close the door. FTZ status is determined by federal officials but rely on the positions of local elected bodies. The corporation is being close-mouthed on its plans should FTZ status be denied and hard lobbying is likely to be in play.

County officials have not answered another vital question: With Monsanto closing three similar facilities in North Carolina, Wisconsin and Connecticut, cutting 90 jobs, will the 20-30 promised full-time jobs in Pima County actually go to county residents?

February 21: Will the Board of Supervisor's meeting be "The Last Roundup" for Monsanto in Pima County? Will Supervisor Elias stand with constituents or cave in to corporate pressure? Is there a third possible vote to kill the deal and spare the people of the Avra Valley the potential grief it would bring? Stay tuned, or better yet, show up at the BOS meeting, 9 a.m. February 21, 130 W.

Thank you for your time in reading my email.

I am a biology student, with an interest in biochemistry and also sustainability/conservation. I am concerned with cross pollination, increased herbicide exposure and the monopolization of the agricultural market.

It is very easy for corn to cross pollinate. The native heirloom seeds growing near are permanently altered which results in deformity and infertility. Corn has been grown in the states before European settlers even knew of its existence. We have many native species of corn being grown here, specifically in the Tucson area. I hope that these ancient species can be preserved and embraced.

Glyphosate (Roundup) accumulates in the soil, is absorbed by the food we eat and is even found in honey! It is highly toxic and will have long term affects in the genetic composition of all exposed animals species. Humans will be most affected due to our higher consumption levels of plants and the animals that are fed the grains. It is a complex organic chemical that will never break down in the environment. It also is increasing weeds resistance to herbicides similarly to bacteria's resistance to antibiotics. It pollutes and poisons.

Monsanto has farmers all around the world in their legal death grip; controlling the production and repurchasing of seeds so that they only hold the key to the farmers output. Good people who raise their own crops independently have been sued by this corporation because of unavoidable and uncontrollable situations regarding cross pollination. Hard working farmers have lost everything in a swift swing by Monsanto's heavy patented hand. If anything does go awry, our state could not afford a lawsuit against this corporation. I doubt the state could even afford to defend a Tucson farmer who is forced to square up with a Monsanto patent infringement lawsuit.

The reality of our food production system is it is unstainable and spiraling out of control. We need more food and are desperate to grow the highest yields. Currently, our solution is that we need resistant crops and more pesticides. Yet we have weeds evolving in resistance, too. Forcing the application of more and more glyphosate over time. This compounding will have detrimental effects on our environments and inside our bodies. How can we possibly get control of this tailspin? Certainly adding more of the problem is not the solution.

This company does not deserve tax breaks. It deserves increased taxes and fines for the massive pollution by their toxic products, the tainting of native crops due to cross pollination.
