Requested Board Meeting Date: February 20, 2018

Title: Presentation of the 2017 Pima County Small Business Commission Small Business of the Year Awards

Introduction/Background:

The Pima County Small Business Commission has presented the Pima County Small Business of the Year Awards since 2010. Nominations are received community-wide and the final selection of winners is made by the Commission. Awards are given to an urban small business, a rural small business and a non-profit small business. The urban award-winning businesses must be located within the city limits of Tucson. Rural award winners are selected from any incorporated or unincorporated community outside the City of Tucson. Non-profit award businesses must be registered as not for profit corporations and can be located anywhere in Pima County. All nominees must be physically located in Pima County and have 100 or less employees.

Discussion:

At its January 18, 2018 public meeting, the Pima County Small Business Commission selected Kool Air Manufacturing, LLC as the Urban award winner, Miura Contracting, LLC as the Rural award winner and the Pima Community College Small Business Development Center as the non-profit award winner.Each business will receive a plaque and a check for \$500.

Conclusion:

Pima County Economic Development believes the awards serve to bring recognition and positive publicity to small businesses in Pima County. Small Businesses are engines of the local economy, important job creators and serve a vital role in economic development in Pima County.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Pima County Board of Supervisors present the 2017 Pima County Small Business Commission Small Business of the Year Awards to Kool Air Manufacturing, Miura Contacting and the Pima Community College Small Business Development Center.

We help companies launch, grow and/or sustain. Our Center is funded by the SBA and match funds are provided along with facilities by Pima Community College. Our Mission is "To provide high quality, highimpact one-on-one counseling, resource assistance, and training to preserve and create small business jobs and revenue, and to facilitate capital formation throughout Arizona. We are part of a State Wide Network with 10 offices. Our PCC SBDC is the 2nd largest in the state. Our Vision Statement is "The AZSBDC Network is the 'go to' catalyst for facilitating job creation, capital formation and economic Your main business focus growth throughout Arizona". There are 4 of us. Three of us are counselors and one administrative assistant. We have generally 250 clients and see nearly 400 in the course of a year. Of these, we spend 5+ hours with about half because we really drill down and first understand the need or opportunity, then work with a plan to accomplish their goals. Services include: Financial Education, Cash Flow Analysis, Capital Access, Marketing, Strategy Development, Social Media and Web Communications, Import/Export Assistance, Government Contracting Support and Veteran Assistance. We provide long term, multi year assistance to as they get started, and then work with them for growth and success. Ellen Kirton Director has led the team for 6 years. During that time, Significant Accomplishments the team has been consistent and has been recognized for its top

results a number of times. In 2015, the Center was recognized as the

Center of Excellence for the state at the Annual SBA Awards Luncheon. In 2015, Ellen Kirton received a national recognition as the AZ State Star. This really was a team award. All 3 of us are certified within the National ASBDC network in counseling which involves 60+ hours of training every 2 years. Serving Veterans is very important to us and Ellen Kirton this year was awarded the first National Award as outstanding Instructor for 2017. This was personally signed by Linda McMahon, the SBA Administrator. Mrs. McMahon sits on the U.S. Cabinet for the President. 2017 economic impact for the team is remarkable. In terms of access to capital, we helped over 50 companies obtain primarily loans from as little as \$500 to well over \$1M and everything in-between. We helped businesses create 273 new jobs and in working with companies in jeopardy, helped them retain 27.5 jobs. We assisted in the start up of 37 businesses. We do not just go through the mechanics with them of starting a job, we stay working with them to help ensure their success. One new startup had \$250K+ in revenues in just half a year. Most outstanding is that we helped our clients collectively increase revenues over \$20M in 2017.

This is a "team sport". The expression "it takes a village" is true of how we work together. All of us have different expertise areas and that is a real advantage in helping our clients because sometimes we dual-counsel clients. From a culture standpoint, our team knows that everyone is a critical component of the team. We continually share, coordinate and support each other. As Director, I feel it is my responsibility to participate on a statewide level and look to have our team meet statewide initiatives, goals and core values. Then, I share that with the team and as a group we then put together our strategic

plan to accomplish the goals. Because of this, we are well respected both by the State Network, our clients and the county we serve. We work closely with all communities located in the county to identify their specific needs. We then match these with trainings and outreach efforts to meet those needs, as can be seen in our economic impact numbers. We are all inspired to create economic impact. We support each other, we are supported by our State Network, and by Pima Community College. It is an ideal environment to do the work that has so many rewards for those we serve.

As an example of our impact, with the Town of Sahuarita, we held a round table with 25 businesses. The "one thing" needing focus was that there was not a place for small businesses to meet with their clients. From that meeting, the Sahuarita Biz Hub was born. Unused space was re-purposed to create multiple business meeting spaces. We now also have a number of trainings at that same location. Revenue

Impact_on_Pima_County growth numbers for our Pima County clients are substantive. Economic growth, which we help companies achieve, brings impact to the county in increased spending and tax generation. We are helping more companies purchase properties. This is the first time since the recession, that we have seen this level of growth leading to increased hiring, purchase of equipment, and real estate acquisition. We assist clients in making sound economic decisions where they were once reluctant to expand. By forming a workforce development committee, academia and business now work together to help fill the skilled workforce gap. SBDC focuses on moving companies to the next level and business expansion. Pima County has a great deal of real property available to accommodate these expansions. SBDC helps guide businesses with the evaluation of the prospective expansion, which can be valuable. We also cross-refer to the County so they can be fully informed of economic incentives offered by the County. Often, the SBDC is a "business matchmaker".

We are involved in the following: Director serves on boards such as the BBB, Women's Financial Group, Make A Wish. Collaborations include providing business technical training in the county to members such as Local First AZ, AZ Technology Council, Town of Sahuarita, etc. We are proud of our veteran efforts at DM AFB and the AZ Air Guard. We teach for the Boots to Business for those military interested in starting a business. We also participate in their Capstone program. We host a VA Matchmaking procurement event to bring business owners together with VA and County procurement officers. Karen Burns presents at Eller College, the Law School, and a voting member of Business Development Finance Corporation. We

Community_Involvement Intended of Dusiness Development 1 mance Corporation: we participate each year in the Procurement Fair at Kino Sports Park hosted by the County and DM AFB. We serve as judges for Shark Tank presentations including, Young Entrepreneur Academy, EDGE program at Sahuarita, and the STEM Challenge at PCC. In recent years, Ellen Kirton has presented at the Small Business Commission. We collaborate with the Veterans Dept at PCC, the AZ At Work Veteran Center, and other veteran organizations. Our major veteran event is the Annual Veterans Conference, where we host up to 200 attendees for a full day filled with "inspire and inform" speakers, presentations, and including a catered lunch. The event is fully sponsored and provided at no charge to the participants. It is both humbling and yet exciting to be considered for this award. The work we are privileged to do every day (and every one of us are

"giving back" having come from successful careers and now serving our clients) truly makes a difference. When I think of a company that was ready to close with more than 15 employees, and SBDC worked over the course of 6 months to turn the company around from a 6 figure loss to a 6 figure profit, that is true economic impact! When we help a veteran-owned company obtain a loan of \$250K and that allows them to buy equipment, and in their first year, they achieve \$1.5M in

revenues, that is economic impact! The impact continues as the business continues to grow, remain profitable, and expand their workforce. When we advise a company that has hit a "brick wall" and they are open to honest conversation; and as a result, they not only move forward, but excel, that is economic impact! These are examples of why the SBDC is held in such high esteem and continues to be a valuable asset to Pima County. The business community is wellserved by the SBDC team. Truly, our recognition as a Business of the Year is a combination of the many businesses we work with, their
