Fiscal Year 2018/19 Recommendations by the Outside Agency Community Advisory
Committee to Fund Outside Agency Service Categories

Background

Pima County, through the Outside Agency Community Advisory Committee (OACAC), issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) to receive proposals from nonprofit agencies to provide community based services related to County service functions and obligations. 102 program applications were received for Fiscal Year 2018/19, totaling nearly \$4.9 million in requests.

The OACAC held several public meetings between January 2018 and April 2018 and spent 27 hours reviewing the applications.

The OACAC recommends 64 programs for funding for a total of \$2,375,345. Two new programs are recommended without funding. These are Southern Arizona Adaptive Sports for \$20,000 and PPEP Amado Opioid Program for \$37,000. I recommend these amounts be reserved in the Budget Stabilization Fund upon budget adoption for funding based on further review, analysis and successful negotiation of a service contract.

More detailed information regarding the OACAC is attached in Chief Deputy County Administrator Jan Lesher's May 14, 2018 memorandum.

Recommendation

I recommend the recommendations of the Outside Agency Community Advisory Committee be accepted and the programs recommended by them be funded, including three new program applications (the Arizona Conservation Corps, Desert Survivors and Tucson Clean and Beautiful) as well as the two unfunded programs (Southern Arizona Adaptive Sports and PPEP Amado Opioid Program).

Re: Fiscal Year 2018-19 Recommendations for Outside Agency Program Funding

The Outside Agency Community Advisory Committee (the Committee) is a panel of five members appointed by the Board of Supervisors to serve as its representatives and one member appointed by the County Administrator. The Community Development and Neighborhood Conservation Department (CDNC) staff this Committee.

The Committee is responsible to review and make recommendations on five of the six Outside Agency (OA) service categories:

- Community Services
- Emergency Food and Clothing
- Senior Support
- Support Services, Shelter and Domestic Violence
- Youth, Young and Adult

This year the Committee reviewed three new applications for the OA General Services category. The Committee has not reviewed funding requests for the other County departments that administer OA funds: Economic Development and Tourism, and Community Services Employment and Training.

In the fall of Fiscal Year (FY) 2017, CDNC issued a bi-annual Request for Proposal (RFP) via ZoomGrants, a web based grant management system. There were 102 program applications for funding in FY 2018-19, totaling \$4,916,078 in grant requests. The OA process involves open community meetings during which the Committee reviews each application by service category, presentations by each agency, with questions and answers from the Committee to the agency representatives.

The Committee assumed level funding for the OA FY 2018-19 budget from the prior fiscal year for the five service categories under its responsibility.

FY 2018-19 Recommendations

The Committee held seven open public meetings, totaling more than 27 hours between January and April at the Pima County Housing Center. The Grants Management staff made two presentations to the Committee regarding the status of current funded agencies. The CDNC staff provided overviews for each new agency based upon on-site reviews with agency representatives to determine capacity.

The Committee is recommending 64 programs in the five service categories for funding. A total of \$2,375,345 is recommended for the five service categories. Nineteen new programs submitted proposals for a requested \$727,807, with three programs receiving \$49,745 in recommended funding.

The Committee reviewed three program applications that are new to the OA process, and included in the General Services category. The Committee found these programs worthy of funding and recommend full funding with the understanding that existing County funds for FY2018-19 are budgeted from other sources.

AZ Conservation Corps \$ 100,000 Budget Stabilization Fund
Desert Survivors \$ 57,040 Budget Stabilization Fund

Tucson Clean and Beautiful \$ 40,896 NRPR

The Committee reviewed two program applications that are new to the OA process, and determined that, while these programs are worthy of funding, they do not fall within the description of the OA program. These programs do not have existing funding budgeted from other County departments. The Committee encourages consideration by the County Administrator to identify funding for these programs as well as an appropriate department within the County to administer the contracts for the following:

Southern Arizona Adaptive Sports \$20,000 Sports Equipment PPEP Amado Opioid Program \$37,000 Addiction Prevention

In October 2018, the Committee will meet to review the year-end reports for the FY2017-18 and the FY2018-19 contracting process, first quarterly reports and results from on-site program monitoring.

The Outside Agency Chair applauds Pima County's efforts in funding the Outside Agencies in these times of significant budget constraints. The eroding funding from other government sources have added a level of uncertainty and have placed increasing pressure on the effective operations of these valued programs. The OA process is community based and transparent; an extraordinary process. The Committee recognizes its responsibility for each member to evaluate the needs of Pima County and make these recommendations to the Board of Supervisors.

For FY 2018-19, there are 38 agencies providing 64 programs that requested OA funds through a competitive process. The OA funding leverages \$4,631,042 from state and local sources. The agencies continue to provide important services to help meet Pima County's needs, both rural and urban, from Ajo to Green Valley, from Catalina to Arivaca.
