Grant Award: Pima County Sample Cultural Resource Survey Project

*Purpose:

Since the voter-approved bonds of 1997 and 2004, Pima County has acquired in fee title lands dedicated for open space conservation and MSCP mitigation. This also includes well-known archaeological sites that were acquired for archaeological preservation and interpretation. To further protect lands acquired for open space, the Pima County Board of Supervisors and Regional Flood Control District Board approved restrictive covenants on 91,466 acres of County and District-owned land on October 18, 2016 to protect the open space lands. These covenants require the County to monitor, inspect, and report on the condition of County open space lands. For the purposes of archaeological and historic site preservation, primary objectives are the inventory documentation and monitoring of cultural resources and assessing threats –both from environmental and human agents-- to better manage cultural resources on preserves and open space lands.

Very little of these open space lands has been field surveyed for cultural resources, and this grant funded project will entail a cultural resources sample field survey and threat assessment effort in an effort to begin the inventory of site locations.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

OSC applied for the 2018-2019 Certified Local Government Pass-Through Grant to support inventory and documentation of cultural resources on certain County-owned conservation lands in order to identify the distribution and diversity of cultural resources, as well as to assess existing and future threats to these resources. Other primary goals of these inventories include: A) Identify areas of significant scientific potential that may serve to add to our understanding of prehistoric/ historic lifeways through time

B) Identify areas in danger of destruction through erosion and natural processes

- C) Identify areas for modeling a more refined chronological understanding of landscapes/watersheds
- D) Identify areas with Tribal significance (traditional cultural places)
- E) Identify areas that may have neglected historic-period resources

*Public Benefit:

Voter support of the conservation of the County's open space lands is evidenced by the 2004 voter-approved bonds that led to the acquisition of roughly 100,000 acres of land. The current project aims to provide critical information related the County's stewardship and management responsibilities for inventorying and preserving these cultural landscapes for current and future generations.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Work completion by September 30, 2019; Remain within budget; synthesis of recovered information into development of cultural resources management plans for County conservation properties.

Pima County supports this application by our Office of Sustainability and Conservation (OSC) for Certified Local Government (CLG) Historic Preservation Grant funds, that will be used for cultural resources inventory of 1,150 acres of County-owned conservation lands on Sopori Ranch.

Pima County has participated in land conservation efforts for many years and has implemented an award-winning cultural resources and historic preservation program since the 1980s. Following the adoption of the Sonoran Desert Conservation Plan and with voter-approved open space bonds in 1997 and 2004, Pima County now has acquired nearly 100,000 acres of fee-owned lands and ranch lands dedicated to natural and cultural landscape conservation.

Because so little cultural resource survey has been done in these rural areas, OSC is now working to inventory these newly acquired properties, in order to identify the diversity and distribution of cultural and historic sites, assess existing and future threats to these properties, and to develop and implement management plans and strategies to ensure the long-term conservation of our region's cultural heritage.

Pima County is therefore, requesting \$20,000 in CLG grant funds to support this inventory effort, and we will overmatch the required 40 percent match with additional funds and inkind County staff time. 2018 CERTIFIED LOCAL GOVERNMENT GRANT APPLICATION

Project Description:

Since the voter-approved bonds of 1997 and 2004, Pima County has acquired in fee title approximately 100,000 acres of lands that are dedicated for open space conservation. This also includes well-known archaeological sites identified in the Sonoran Desert Conservation Plan (SDCP) that were acquired for archaeological preservation and interpretation. To further protect lands acquired for open space, the Pima County and Regional Flood Control District Board of Supervisors approved restrictive covenants on 91,466 acres of County-owned land on October 18, 2016. These restrictive covenants protect the open space lands from the types of development that would be incompatible with the purposes for which the lands were acquired. The Arizona Land and Water Trust (ALWT) is the third party beneficiary for the restrictive covenants.

As part of the responsibilities for managing these conservation lands and restrictive covenants, Pima County's Office of Sustainability and Conservation (OSC) is required to monitor, inspect, and report on any violations of the restrictive covenants on these open space lands. For the purposes of site preservation one of the primary OSC goals is to identify cultural resources on conservation lands and to monitor the physical integrity and condition of these sites and assess threats —both from environmental and human agents-- to better manage cultural resources on archaeological preserves and open space lands.

OSC is applying for the 2018 Certified Local Government Pass-Through Grant to support proactive inventory of cultural resources on certain County-owned conservation lands in order to identify the distribution and diversity of cultural resources, as well as to assess existing and future threats to these resources. Other primary goals of these inventories include:

- A) Identify areas of significant scientific potential that may serve to add to our understanding of prehistoric/historic lifeways through time;
- B) Identify areas in danger of destruction through erosion and natural processes;
- C) Identify areas for modeling a more refined chronological and spatial understanding of human settlement at the landscapes/watershed level;
- D) Identify areas with Tribal significance (traditional cultural places);
- E) Identify areas that may have neglected historic period resources.

Relationship of the Project to the CLG's Work Priorities:

Pima County has participated in conservation efforts since the 1980s, and has implemented an award winning cultural resources and historic preservation program that guides all County projects. OSC has assisted in identifying cultural landscapes that have since been acquired for the sole purpose of conservation.

The local cultural resources and historic preservation program is now emphasizing a proactive approach to inventorying these newly acquired properties in order to identify the diversity and distribution of cultural resource properties, as well as to assess existing and future threats to these properties.

Since that time, impacts to archaeological and historic sites have been considered and mitigated in the planning and construction of County public works projects and in land use decisions approved by the County such as new subdivisions and commercial development affected by our Grading Ordinance and land use policies. To ensure the consistent application of policy and its implementation, Pima County established a position in 1988 to review these development projects, and further established a long-term working relationship with the State Historic Preservation Office in ensuring the protection of our cultural and historic properties.

In developing the Pima County Sonoran Desert Conservation Plan (SDCP), the preservation of our cultural heritage was included as a critical element in our vision to conserve and protect our natural and cultural landscape, and more than 200 Priority Cultural Resources have been identified for protection in the Pima County Comprehensive Land Use Plan. In the 1997 and 2004 bond elections, voters approved nearly \$30 million in historic preservation bonds, which facilitated the acquisition and preservation of a diversity of archaeological and historical sites throughout Pima County, such as Colossal Cave, the Coyote Mountains archaeological site complex, Canoa Ranch, Tumamoc Hill, the Performing Arts Center in Tucson, and the Ajo Curley School, among others.

Each of these publically-supported initiatives has identified historic preservation as a fundamental component of County policy. The current project is the first step in initiating a proactive approach to cultural resources management that is supported by Pima County Administration. While there remains a delicate balance between development and historic preservation, County policy makers continue to demonstrate their support for the preservation of our collective cultural heritage.
