### **PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS, hospice is a program designed to offer person-centered and comprehensive end-of-life care, ensuring patients dignity, choice and quality of life; and

WHEREAS, the hospice model employs an interdisciplinary, team-oriented approach to treatment, including expert medical care, quality symptom control, and comprehensive pain management; and

WHEREAS, beyond physical treatment, hospice attends to patients' emotional, spiritual and family needs, and provides family services such as respite care; and

WHEREAS, a growing body of peer-reviewed research indicates that timely access to hospice and palliative care can decrease hospitalizations and emergency room visits, and improve the quality of life for patients and family caregivers; and

WHEREAS, hospice and palliative care organizations are advocates and educators about advance care planning to help individuals make decisions about the care they want: and

WHEREAS, every year thousands of people who have life-limiting illness, and their families, receive care from hospice programs in Pima County, including that of Casa de la Luz Hospice, which has served more than 20,000 over its 20 years of operations.
