Title: Co9-07-27 NOSECK/DAVIS - CAMINO DOROTEA REZONING (Time Extension)

Introduction/Background:

The applicant requests a five-year time extension for a rezoning from RH (BZ) (Rural Homestead) (Buffer Overlay Zone) to SR-2 (BZ) (Suburban Ranch Estate) (Buffer Overlay Zone) (12.6 acres) and RH to SR-2 (38.46 acres) which was approved by the Board of Supervisors on August 18, 2008 and expired on August 8, 2013.

Discussion:

The applicant has not provided an explanation for the delay in completion of rezoning conditions, but the recession likely is a factor. However, progress has been made with the submittal of a tentative plat prior to the expiration date. A time extension to August 18, 2018 is sufficient to allow the plat review process to proceed to final plat approval after this date because the tentative plat was submitted prior to that date. Should the plat file be closed due to inactivity, then a second five-year time extension request will be necessary to extend the time to complete rezoning conditions. Staff supports the time extension based on continued conformance with the comprehensive plan density limits and policies, concurrency of infrastructure, and residential use appropriateness. The rezoning was approved for 15 residences with 80 percent of the site required to remain as natural open space to satisfy Conservation Lands System requirements. Reversion to RH zoning would allow 12 residences and would not guarantee as much open space preservation or the benefits of a subdivision plat.

Conclusion:

A time extension is warranted due to the historical economic recession. Concurrency of infrastructure exists. The rezoning remains compliant with the comprehensive plan. The recommended modified conditions update certain conditions to current standard language and policy treatment.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of a five-year rezoning time extension subject to conditions as modified.

Co9-07-27 NOSECK/DAVIS - CAMINO DOROTEA REZONING

Request of Lawyers Title of Arizona TR 18211-T, et al. for a five-year time extension for the above-referenced rezoning from RH (BZ) (Rural Homestead) (Buffer Overlay Zone) to SR-2 (BZ) (Suburban Ranch Estate) (Buffer Overlay Zone) (12.6 acres) and RH (Rural Homestead) to SR-2 (Suburban Ranch Estate) (38.46 acres). The subject site was rezoned in 2008. The site is located on the north side of Camino Dorotea alignment and at the southern terminus of the Coyote Creek Trail Easement, approximately 1,300 feet east of Camino Loma Alta. Staff recommends APPROVAL SUBJECT TO STANDARD AND SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends **APPROVAL** of a five-year time extension to August 18, 2013 as per the applicant's request for the original 51.06-acre rezoning from RH (Rural Homestead) to SR-2 (Suburban Ranch Estate) of which 12.06 acres is within the Buffer Overlay Zone, subject to original and modified standard and special conditions as follows:

- Submittal of a development plan if determined necessary by the appropriate County agencies.
- Recording of a covenant holding Pima County harmless in the event of flooding.
- 3. Recording of the necessary development related covenants as determined appropriate by the various County agencies.
- 4. Provision of development related assurances as required by the appropriate agencies.

5. Prior to the preparation of the development related covenants and any required dedication, a title report (current to within 60 days) evidencing ownership of the property shall be submitted to the Development Services Department, Document Services.

- 61. There shall be no further lot splitting or subdividing of residential development without the written approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- 72. Transportation conditions:

The property owner(s)/developer(s) shall include the reconfiguration of lot(s) and access through the adjoining subdivision as part of the subdivision for this rezoning and the access shall be common area.

83. Flood Control conditions:

- A. Drainage shall not be altered, disturbed or obstructed without the written approval of the Flood Control District.
- B. Building envelopes shall avoid floodplains, erosion hazard setbacks, and riparian habitat shall be shown on the plat for all lots containing floodplains, erosion hazard setbacks, and riparian habitat. Covenants running with the land restricting development outside building envelopes shall also be provided.
- C. A drainage report shall be submitted during the platting process for Flood Control District to determine 100-year water surface elevations for all lots and to analyze detention /retention requirements.
- D. The property owner(s)/developer(s) shall comply with detention/retention conditions and restrictions, or provide an in-lieu fee, as stated in the Floodplain Management Ordinance since the property lies within a balanced basin.
- E. The property owner(s)/developer(s) shall provide necessary on-site and off-site drainage improvements at no cost to Pima County and as required by the Pima County Regional Flood Control District.
- F. All-weather access shall be provided to all lots to meet concurrency requirements.
- G. A riparian mitigation plan shall be required for development in designated riparian areas.
- H. At the time of development the applicant will be required to commit to water conservation measures identified in the Site Analysis Requirements in effect at that time sufficient to obtain 15 points.
- 94. Wastewater Reclamation condition:

The owner(s)/developer(s) shall secure approval from the Pima County Department of Environmental Quality to use on-site wastewater treatment facilities within the rezoning area at the time a tentative plat, development plan or request for building permit is submitted for review.

- 405. Environmental Quality conditions:
 - A. All proposed residential lots shall have a minimum area of 43,560 square feet. A maximum of one-half of adjacent rights-of-way or easements may be used in the calculation of the area. The adjacent rights-of-way or easements shall be suitable to absorb effluent; and all other design requirements must be satisfied.
 - B. At time of Tentative Plat review the applicant shall demonstrate that the lots, as proposed, can accommodate a home site, a primary and reserve on-site wastewater disposal area, while meeting all required setbacks. The size of the primary and reserve areas shall be determined by on-site soil evaluations and/or percolation testing and shall be designed to accommodate a hypothetical four (4) bedroom home, unless the applicant requests limiting the size of the proposed new residence.
 - C. At time of Tentative Plat review percolation tests and boring logs shall be conducted to accurately depict soil conditions as follows: There shall be a minimum of one percolation test and one ten-foot boring log per acre, or one percolation test and one boring log per lot for lots larger than one acre.

416. Cultural Resources conditions:

- A. Prior to ground modifying activities, an on-the-ground archaeological and historic resources survey shall be conducted on the subject property, and submitted to Pima County for review.
- B. A cultural resources mitigation plan for any identified archaeological and historic sites on the subject property shall be submitted to Pima County at the time of, or prior to, the submittal of any tentative plan or development plan. All work shall be conducted by an archaeologist permitted by the Arizona State Museum, or a registered architect, as appropriate.
- C. Following rezoning approval, any subsequent development requiring a Type II grading permit will be reviewed for compliance with Pima County's cultural resources requirements under Chapter 18.81 of the Pima County Zoning Code.
- 127. Natural Resources, Parks and Recreation condition:
 The property owner(s)/developer(s) shall provide a 25-foot "Public Non-Motorized Trail Easement" as shown on the Preliminary Development Plan.
- 43.8. Environmental Planning conditions:
 - A. The owner(s)/developer(s) shall attain compliance with the CLS by setting aside a minimum of eighty (80) percent of the rezoning site as natural open space.
 - B. The potential building areas and grading limits on each lot, as shown on the preliminary development plan shall be recorded on the subdivision plat.
 - C. All areas graded for septic systems shall be re-vegetated with shallow-rooted native Sonoran desert vegetation (e.g., cacti, sub-shrubs, ground covers) at the completion of installation.
 - D. With the exception for road crossings, all grading shall avoid washes, riparian areas and areas with slopes of 15 percent or greater.

E. The following shall be incorporated into Private Subdivision Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs) that govern Homeowners' Associations (HOAs) and the actions of private property owner(s) within the Subdivision:

- 1. Maintenance of Common Area by Association: the HOA shall be responsible for the removal of invasive non-native plant species from Common Areas, including but not limited to those listed below.
- 2. Maintenance of Lots by Owner(s): obligations of Owner(s) shall include keeping private lots free of invasive non-native plant species including but not limited to those listed below:

- In the event the subject property is annexed, the property owner(s)/developer(s) shall adhere to all applicable rezoning conditions, including, but not limited to, development conditions which require financial contributions to, or construction of infrastructure, including without limitation, transportation, flood control, or sewer facilities.
- The property owner(s) shall execute and record—the following disclaimer regarding Proposition 207 rights. "Property Owner acknowledges that neither the rezoning of the Property nor the conditions of rezoning give Property Owner any rights, claims or causes of action under the Private Property Rights Protection Act (Arizona Revised Statutes Title 12, chapter 8, article 2.1). To the extent that the rezoning or conditions of rezoning may be construed to give Property Owner any rights or claims under the Private Property Rights Protection Act, Property Owner hereby waives any and all such rights and/or claims pursuant to A.R.S. § 12-1134(!)."

The owner(s)/developer(s) shall execute and record a document acceptable to the Pima County Community Development and Neighborhood Conservation Department indicating that the owner(s)/developer(s) shall contribute to the affordable housing trust fund as adopted by the Pima County Board of Supervisors on December 13, 2005, before a certificate of compliance is issued.

4711. Adherence to the preliminary development plan as approved at public hearing (EXHIBIT B).

Formerly standard condition #'s 1-5 are recommended for deletion based on a staff policy change to reduce redundant requirements and ease processes. Pertaining to condition #1, a development plan would be required if a development proposal requires one per code. A residential subdivision plat will be recorded for this rezoning site. Pertaining to condition #'s 2, 3, and 5, staff no longer recommends standard conditions which require recorded covenants. In addition, pertaining to condition #2, recorded subdivision plats typically include a standard hold harmless clause pertaining to flooding. Pertaining to condition #4, assurances are standard with approved subdivision plats.

New condition #3H pertains to water conservation measures that will mitigate water demand from the development and is recommended as an update based on new water policy for site analysis rezonings adopted as part of the Pima Prospers Comprehensive Plan Update.

Condition #10 pertaining to the Proposition 207 rights disclaimer is recommended for modification such that it does not have to be recorded and to update the reference to the A.R.S. section.

Condition #16 pertaining to contributions to the affordable housing trust fund is recommended for deletion due to a change in County policy related to monetary exactions.

The recommended changes to conditions do not constitute a substantial change which would require review by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

STAFF REPORT

Staff supports the rezoning time extension based on continued conformance with the comprehensive plan density limits and policies, concurrency of infrastructure, and residential use appropriateness. Progress toward satisfying rezoning conditions has also been made with the submittal of tentative plat (P18TP00017). The 51.06-acre rezoning was approved for 15 single family residences (0.3 residences per acre) with 80 percent of the site required to remain as natural open space to satisfy Conservation Lands System natural open space policy requirements. The development will essentially be an extension of the larger, but similar, non-mass grade Coyote Creek subdivision development and will take access through that subdivision. The rezoning nets only a slight density increase from the original RH zoning and has lower planned and zoned density than the Coyote Creek subdivision which borders to the south and east. The site is located in the Rincon Valley, north of Old Spanish Trail and east of Camino Loma Alta.

The five-year time extension to August 18, 2018 is sufficient to allow the plat review process to proceed to approval of a final plat after this date because the tentative plat was submitted for review prior to that date. Should the plat file be closed due to inactivity toward its finalization, then a second five-year time extension request will be necessary to extend the time to complete rezoning conditions. The allowance for the plat to be finalized (and associated rezoning conditions to be met) after August 18, 2018 represents a policy of time flexibility given the good faith effort to complete conditions represented by the tentative plat submittal before the new expiration date.

The applicant does not provide a reason for the delay in satisfying conditions prior to the original August 18, 2013 expiration date, but the historic recession and its link and impact to housing development has been a common theme in recent time extension requests for other rezoning cases. The rezoning was approved on August 18, 2008 toward the beginning of the recession. There are also vacant lots still available for development within the referenced Coyote Creek subdivision which was recorded on March 31, 2000. A letter dated February 11, 2013 was sent to the applicant warning of the pending time expiration.

Reversion to RH zoning with closure of the rezoning would allow a maximum of 12 residences (rather than 15) and other permitted non-residential uses. It would also not guarantee the benefits of a subdivision plat. Open space associated with the natural water courses and some steeper slopes could be assumed, but not approaching 80 percent of the site as is currently required. Also, the development standards pertaining to the Buffer Overlay Zone would apply to less than three acres of the site compared to 12.6 acres with the rezoning; and applicable comprehensive plan special area policies for the Rincon Valley (S-15 attached), which will be met with the rezoning as proposed, would not be applicable. Closure of the rezoning would not preclude the possibility of a future SR-2 rezoning.

There is concurrency of infrastructure per agencies that have reported. The residences will use onsite sewage disposal (septic) systems. Vail School District and Saguaro Water Company did not respond to a request for comments. There is an agreement between the school district and the applicant to provide \$2,000 per lot of increased density allowed by the rezoning, i.e. three lots.

Physical conditions on the site appear to be the same as when the rezoning was approved. The site contains natural vegetation, disturbed only by a dirt road along the south boundary (Camino Dorotea alignment) and some trails. Area rural and residential zoning remain the same, but there has been some additional development, especially of lots to the south within the Coyote Creek subdivision. A 1998 rezoning application (Co9-98-38) for lot splitting of 4.39 acres to CR-1 (Single Residence) located 1/8-mile to the west of the subject site on the east side of Camino Loma Alta was denied.

TRANSPORTATION REPORT

The Transportation condition is valid and we are not recommending any change to it. The applicant has sent in a conceptual design on how they intend to meet this condition.

FLOOD CONTROL REPORT

The site is less than one mile from the Rincon Creek Shallow Groundwater Dependent Ecosystem and a supplier of Potable and Renewable Water has not been identified. However no increase in demand is associated with this rezoning, and the Pima Prospers Water Policy performance standard of 15 points is therefore appropriate per the Site Analysis Requirements. In conclusion the District has no objection subject to the existing conditions and the following additional condition (#3.G above):

At the time of development the applicant will be required to commit to water conservation measures identified in the Site Analysis Requirements in effect at that time sufficient to obtain 15 points.

WASTEWATER RECLAMATION REPORT

The Planning Section of the Pima County Regional Wastewater Reclamation Department (PCRWRD) has reviewed the above referenced request for a rezoning time extension. The 50-acre subject site was conditionally rezoned from RH (Rural Homestead) to SR-2 (Suburban Ranch Estate) in 2008. The time extension is sought for the entire rezoning which remains undeveloped. The SR-2 rezoning is proposed for 15 residential lots. The site is located on the north side of Camino Dorotea alignment approximately 1,300 fee east of Camino Loma Alta.

The proposed rezoning area is outside of the area currently served by Pima County's public sewer system. There are no existing or proposed public sewers that can be reached by gravity within 1,600 feet of the property boundaries. The rezoning area will be served by private on-site sewage disposal systems.

The PCRWRD has no objection to the referenced request for a five-year time of the rezoning. The existing wastewater conditions in rezoning Ordinance 2008-114 adopted on December 2, 2008 by the Board of Supervisors do not require any revision.

ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING REPORT

The Office of Sustainability & Conservation – Cultural Resources has no objection to the requested rezoning time extension. A condition is in place to fully meet the Conservation Land System's 4:1 set aside obligation.

NATURAL RESOURCES, PARKS AND RECREATION REPORT

The Development Services Department, on behalf of the Natural Resources, Parks and Recreation Department, has no objection to this request and recommends no change to the condition for the trail easement.

CULTURAL RESOURCES REPORT

The Office of Sustainability & Conservation – Cultural Resources has no objection to the requested rezoning time extension. Existing rezoning conditions pertaining to cultural resources are not recommended for change.

UNITED STATES FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE REPORT

Staff has not received a response to a request for comments.

WATER DISTRICT REPORT

Saguaro Water Company has not responded to a request for comments.

SCHOOL DISTRICT REPORT

Vail Unified School District has not responded to a request for comments.

FIRE DISTRICT REPORT

See attached comments from Rincon Valley Fire District. The district does not have any objections.

Land Use Proposal

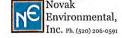

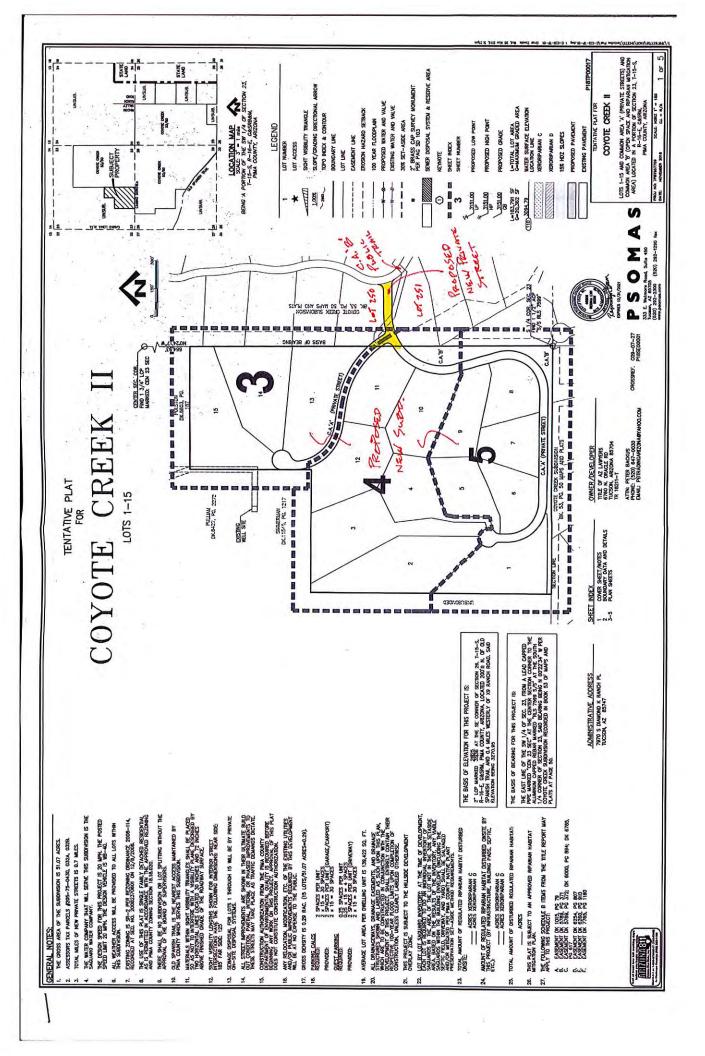
