### Re: Federal Fiscal Year 2018 Operation Stonegarden

Attached is a tabulated list of all Operation Stonegarden (OPSG) funding recipients in the State (Attachment 1). Please note that the Department of Public Safety and Pima County has received approximately \$490,000, the Pinal County Sheriff's Department has received approximately \$2.1 million and the Tucson Police Department received slightly over \$600,000. The only adjacent police agency that is 287G Certified, which means a law enforcement officer is cross-certified as an Immigration Enforcement Officer, is the Pinal County Sheriff's Department.

On Tuesday April 23, 2019, the Pima County Sheriff was notified that US Border Patrol requested five Tucson Police Department officers to work in OPSG deployment in Three Points, Arizona or western Pima County, far from their jurisdiction (Attachment 2). While this deployment is not likely to be approved by Chief Magnus, similar requests will become a common occurrence if the Pima County Sheriff is unable to accept an OPSG grant. It is also likely the Pinal County Sheriff's Department, a 287G Certified department, will be deployed within western Pima County.

We now have confirmation that Pinal County Sheriff assets are now being deployed to western Pima County. Attachment 3 entitled, *"Pinal County Aviation Unit Deployments Operating for United States Border Patrol"* is confirmation that the Pinal County Sheriff's Office is now operating in Pima County under Operation Stonegarden. This is likely to increase significantly in the future as the Pinal County Sheriff received major funding for aviation assets under Stonegarden.

These two deployments are problematic for a number of reasons. First, Pima County has no control or influence over these law enforcement operations. We have no reasonable expectation of transparency regarding outside agency operations in Pima County. Both agencies have not adopted the same civil liberty assurances our Sheriff has when carrying out Stonegarden Operations. Second, County residents have no recourse when questioning the authority or actions of these law enforcement agencies within Pima County. We should expect an escalation of the deployment of outside law enforcement resources in Pima County to fill the void created by our personnel if OPSG funding is not approved.

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This is a serious breach of law enforcement accountability to the civilian population policed. Residents of these areas have no recourse to Pinal County, the Tucson Police Department or other law enforcement agencies that might be deployed in the future. Both operations should be terminated immediately. However, we have no base of authority to mandate that occur.



PCSO is scheduled to complete missions in the FA-2/1 areas of responsibility based on Tucson Sectors (TCA) priorities.

FA-2 is TCAs higher priority and is indicated as such in the area column. Daily missions are dynamic and are tasked dynamically, PCSO can be tasked anywhere within the scheduled area.

Traditionally 75% of PCSO operations occur in FA-2 with 25% occurring in FA-1.

Planned named operations will have a smaller restricted area of operations.
