The Primavera Foundation, Inc.

***Project Title/Description:**

AZ Dept. of Economic Security Community Action Agency - Emergency Services Network (ESN). The contract and amendments can be found in OnBase by searching Contracts 18*403 in Doc_ID_AMS.

***Purpose:**

The Primavera Foundation, Inc., a subrecipient, assists households with emergency utility and rental/mortgage financial assistance through case management services including eligibility determination for several funding sources, as well as referral and advocacy services to eligible, low-income households experiencing a temporary financial crisis in order to prevent homelessness and utility disconnection. Funding is ultimately used to ensure households become and remain self-sufficient.

Short Term Crisis Services/Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (STCS/TANF) funds are to be used for eligibility determination and case management services for households with minors facing eviction or foreclosure. STCS/TANF funds can also be used to pay the following: delinquent utility bills to prevent utility shut off and work related expenses such as vehicle, dental and eye related services as needed to secure or maintain employment. This determination can be used to write vouchers to landlords or mortgage companies from Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funds as well as STCS/TANF. Utility shut-off eligibility case management is conducted under the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Based on review of the LIHEAP application, County guarantees payment and issues a voucher to the utility company. County also received a \$575,000 grant from the Arizona Department of Housing (ADOH) for the Housing Trust Fund (HTF) - Eviction Prevention Pilot Program.

This amendment will provide additional funding for the period of July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020.

AMENDMENT TWO

The parties agree to amend the above-referenced Contract as follows:

1. BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE.

- 1.1 Background. On July 3, 2018, Pima County ("County") and The Primavera Foundation, Inc. ("Awardee"), entered into the above referenced contract to provide supportive services and rental assistance to the homeless in Pima County.
- 1.2 Purpose. County operates a local Emergency Services Network ("ESN") to provide emergency financial assistance for qualified households to prevent homelessness or utility disconnection.

- 1.2.1. County through its Community Action Agency, as Grantee, is the recipient of State and Federal Grants for operating the local Emergency Services Network (“ESN”).
- 1.2.2. County is the Subrecipient of USHHS and ADOH funds and is authorized to pass those funds along to other entities, including Awardee, for eligible services.
- 1.2.3. During the first year of the Agreement, County received Emergency Eviction Intervention Program (“EEIP”) funds. EEIP funds have not been provided for FY 2019-2020.
- 1.2.4. County wishes to continue the ESN services provided by Awardee for an additional year.

2. **TERM, EXTENSIONS and AMENDMENTS, SECTION 1.0.** Pursuant to **paragraph 1.2**, County exercises the first of four (4) extension options. This Contract will terminate on **June 30, 2020**.

3. **COMPENSATION AND PAYMENT, SECTION 3.0** is amended as follows:

3.1 **Paragraph 3.1** is amended to increase “the Maximum Allocated Amount”:


