Grantor - Institute of Museum and Library Services Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) funds passed through the Arizona State Library.

#### \*Project Title/Description:

Library Collections: Evaluation to Access

#### \*Purpose:

The goal of this project is to evaluate and inventory the entire PCPL collection (26 locations and 1 Bookmobile) to identify gaps in materials acquisition; addressing customer requests, format types, and advances in technology. Funds will be used to train project staff, purchase laptops and hand-held scanners in an effort to facilitate the inventory of all library materials. Staff will then use the baseline information to implement a dynamic acquisition plan.

#### \*Procurement Method:

Not applicable to grant awards.

#### \*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

By doing an inventory of our entire collection and analyzing our holds ratios and checkouts of materials, we will be able to make the changes to our collection to meet the specific needs of our community as identified by our customers. The project efforts will allow us to actually see what we have in our collection while simultaneously identifying missing, damaged, and non-circulating materials. We can then prioritize spending and add the appropriate items to the collection, reducing high hold numbers and long wait times.

#### \*Public Benefit:

Community members will benefit because the increased access to physical and electronic materials will provide them with the opportunity to gain information in a way that best meets their individual needs.

#### \*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

We will use pre- and post-surveys, interviews, observations, software and hardware to evaluate the collection as part of an overall inventory effort. Project personnel will monitor circulation activity, wait time for holds and turnover rates. We will also compare physical copies and digital copies to see how we are managing circulations and wait times on holds for these different formats. For example, as we identify titles with an extremely high level of holds in all formats, this effort will alert us to purchase more copies in order to lessen the wait times.

# Assurances and Certifications for 2019 Arizona LSTA Subgrant Award

#### 1. Nondiscrimination

#### 2. Debarment and Suspension
