*Project Title/Description:

911 Backup facility sharing services at PECOC & TOPSC

*Purpose:

Outline the responsibilities of the City of Tucson and Pima County for supporting and maintaining the backup capabilities at the PECOC and TOPSC facilities.

*Procurement Method:

This IGA is a non-Procurement contract and not subject to Procurement rules.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

To share the costs of providing additional workstations to backup 911 services at Pima Emergency Communications and Operations Center and Thomas Price Service Center. City of Tucson and Drexel Heights Fire District will reimburse Pima County with a portion of the recurring costs to support the equipment, software, and telecommunications circuits on a yearly basis.

*Public Benefit:

To support uninterrupted 911 and public safety dispatch services for the City of Tucson and unincorporated Pima County by implementing two staffed facilities.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Number of 9-1-1 service calls received.

*Retroactive:

CONTRACT AMENDMENT

The parties agree to amend the above-referenced contract as follows:

Background and Purpose. 1.

1.1 Background. On 05/20/2014, COUNTY, DISTRICT and CITY entered into an agreement to cooperate in utilization of the CITY's Thomas Price Service Center (TOPSC) located at 4004 S. Park Avenue, Tucson, A'Z and the COUNTY's Pima Emergency Communications and Operations (PECOC) located at 3434 E. 22°d Street, Tucson A'Z for the purpose of supporting backup 911 Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) services, computer aided dispatch and public safety radio dispatch at each facility. The objective is to provide the capability to support uninterrupted 911 and public safety dispatch services for the City of Tucson and unincorporated Pima County by implementing two, staffed facilities.

1.2 Purpose. Arizona Department of Administration (ADoA) 911 Office supports the equipment needs of 9-1-1 Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP) statewide via tax revenue from telephone customers. The state provides funding for telecommunications equipment startup, lifecycle replacement and maintenance. The state provides funding for new a Managed

Services model for PSAP funding. In the past, the state budgeted for capital improvements and annual recurring O & M costs separately. The New Managed Services model will combine the two costs into a lease type arrangement where the costs for hardware are amortized over the term of the agreement. The City of Tucson has already taken advantage of the Managed Services model for their 9-1-1 positions at the Thomas Price Service Center (TOPSC).

At the Pima Emergency Communications and Operations Center (PECOC), the 9-1-1 equipment is being replaced under the Managed Services model. In preparation for this transition, the community need and local resources in order to support emergency deployments at PECOC from the TOPSC were re-assessed by CITY, COUNTY, and DISTRICT.

The State supports a fixed number of operator positions at each PSAP to meet <u>operational</u> needs. The State will not support any additional workstations for training or backup purposes. Capital and recurring expenses to meet these needs are the responsibility of the implementing agency. With regard to TOPSC and PECOC PSAP's, the State provides support for the following number of operator positions:

City of Tucson Public Safety Communications Department

48 Operator Positions

Pima Emergency Communications Operations Center

Pima County Sheriff's Department Primary PSAP

14 Operator Positions

Drexel Heights Fire District Secondary PSAP

4 Operator Positions

At PECOC, after discussions between the COUNTY, CITY, and DISTRICT, the CITY has specified a need for twenty (20) operator positions, nine (9) positions equipped with Intelligent Workstations and eleven (11) positions equipped with Soft Phones (desk phones capable of receiving 9-1-1 calls, but may not support E911 features, ANI/ALI, or mapping capabilities) to satisfy its 9-1-1 needs to support an emergency deployment from the Thomas Price Service Center (TOPSC) to the PECOC facility.

Due to operational size differences, additional, locally supported equipment, must be supported at the PECOC facility to meet the equipment needs for an emergency deployment from the TOPSC facility. The State supported equipment would be insufficient to simultaneously meet the needs of all four agencies.

COUNTY has determined that during a backup deployment of CITY at PECOC it will vacate five (5) of their primary Intelligent Workstations to support the CITY need. The State does not provide funding to support the additional positions needed to support the CITY's need for backup deployment at PECOC. These costs are a burden for the local community and it was determined that the additional cost would be paid via a cost sharing model amongst COUNTY, DISTRICT and CITY.

Cost sharing model: Four (4) additional, locally supported 9-1-1 Intelligent Workstations and eleven (11) Soft Phones will be put into service to support emergency deployments at PECOC from TOPSC. These fifteen (15) positions will be supplemented by five (5) State funded positions allocated to the Pima County Sheriff's Department PSAP which would be made available for CITY use in an emergency deployment. One (1) of the locally supported Intelligent Workstations will be used to meet the daily operational needs of the DISTRICT and made available to the CITY during an emergency deployment to PECOC. For the four (4) additional, locally supported 9-1-1 Intelligent Workstations and the eleven (11) Soft Phones, the three jurisdictions will share responsibility for the annual cost as follows:

9-1-1 Intelligent Workstations:

PCSD- 2 positions

DHFD- 1 position CITY- 1 position

Soft Phones:

CITY and COUNTY will split the cost of the eleven (11) soft phones equally.

Attached is a spreadsheet depicting predicted expenses associated with the 9-1-1 support costs at PECOC. Actual expenses may differ.

Because the CITY PSAP operations at TOPSC exceed the requirements for both DISTRICT and COUNTY in a backup deployment, no additional 9-1-1 positions are necessary. Instead the CITY will make available an adequate number of State funded 911 positions for both DHFD and PCSD to utilize in a backup capacity. The equipment needed for backup deployment at PECOC may otherwise be used to meet training needs for COUNTY and DISTRICT.

- 1. Scope of Services. The parties have revised the Scope of Services as follows:
 - a. Responsibilities for PECOC. COUNTY and DISTRICT will provide backup communications facilities and equipment for the CITY in the event CITY facilities are disrupted and a deployment to the PECOC facility is necessary. Backup facilities will be made available for training and exercise purposes at a mutually agreeable time for all affected parties. The following workstations will be available:
 - i. City of Tucson Public Safety Communications Division at PECOC main floor
 - 1. Five (5) 9-1-1 IWS workstations
 - 2. One (1) 9-1-1 IWS workstation with a backup radio.
 - 3. Five (5) Soft Phones with backup radios
 - 4. One (1) workstation with a Soft Phone
 - All of the above listed positions will also have Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) consoles. CAD access will be dependent upon network connectivity to the City of Tucson CAD servers.
 - ii. City of Tucson Public Safety Communications Division at PECOC backup area
 - 1. Two (2) 9-1-1 IWS workstations

- 2. One (1) IWS with backup radio
- 3. Two (2) (2) Soft Phones with backup radios.
- 4. Three (3) workstations with Soft Phones
- All of the above listed positions will also have Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) consoles. CAD access will be dependent upon network connectivity to the City of Tucson CAD servers.
- vii. **Telephone**. Both facilities will have 9-1-1 and administrative telephone capabilities available for the guest agencies deployed in a backup capacity.
 - 9-1-1 Telephone. COUNTY purchased additional, self-funded 9-1-1 equipment for PECOC whereas CITY plans to utilize existing 9-1-1 equipment for both facilities, an annual Managed Services contract is required for the additional self-funded positions.
 - a. At PECOC, a total of twenty (20) 9-1-1 capable positions are required to support the backup needs of CITY. This will consist of nine (9) 9-1-1 IWS positions and eleven (11) Soft Phone positions. During a backup deployment, COUNTY will vacate a total of five (5) of their operational IWS positions to support the CITY need. The remaining four (4) 9-1-1 IWS and Soft Phone positions will be funded through a cost sharing plan allocating cost by position as follows:
 - i. CITY will pay for one (1) IWS position
 - ii. COUNTY will pay for two (2) IWS positions
 - iii. DISTRICT will pay for one (1) IWS position
 - iv. CITY and COUNTY will split evenly the cost of eleven (11) Soft Phones
 - b. A detailed five (5) year projection of cost is attached as Appendix A.
 - d. The state 9-1-1 office has determined that the 9-1-1 equipment at PECOC should be upgraded to the Managed Services format. This is a lease arrangement with the required maintenance cost rolled into the lease. CITY has already moved to the Managed Services format. The State 9-1-1 Office has provided funding for the eighteen (18) State funded positions. The additional 9-1-1 positions needed to support CITY backup operations are funded through a cost sharing agreement between COUNTY, DISTRICT, and CITY. These locally funded positions need to be on the Managed Services format as well, to be compatible with the other 9-1-1 positions. Cost associated with backup positions of this IGA will be re-evaluated with any future modifications and/or enhancements to the 9-1-1 equipment.
- ix. Radio. The PCWIN project funded the initial purchase of Motorola MCC7500 dispatch consoles as well as MCD5000 consolettes for both TOPSC and PECOC.

A specified number of MCC7500 consoles and MCD5000 consolettes have been allocated for use by the deployed agencies during a backup deployment.

- 1. At PECOC the following minimum PCWIN equipment quantities will be allocated for CITY use:
 - a. City of Tucson Public Safety Communications Division at PECOC main floor
 - i. One (1) workstation with MCC7500 console including an MCD500 backup consolette
 - ii. Two (2) workstations with MCC7500 console
 - iii. Five (5) workstations with MCD5000 backup consolette radios
 - b. City of Tucson Public Safety Communications Division at PECOC backup area
 - i. Four (4) workstation with MCC7500 console including an MCD5000 backup consolette
 - ii. Two (2) workstations with MCD5000 consolette radios

3. Financing

a. **Financial Management.** The cost sharing plan to cover 9-1-1 IWS and soft phone positions at PECOC will involve payments to COUNTY by both DISTRICT and CITY. The payment interval will be on an annual basis, at the beginning of the calendar year. (The payment interval may change to match required payment to CenturyLink)

RELATING TO INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENTS (IGA); APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE IGA BETWEEN THE CITY OF TUCSON, PIMA COUNTY, AND THE DREXEL HEIGHTS FIRE DISTRICT REGARDING ONGOING USE AND SUPPORT OF THE PIMA EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS OPERATIONS CENTER AND THOMAS O. PRICE SERVICE CENTER IN FURTHERANCE OF THE PIMA COUNTY WIRELESS INTEGRATED NETWORK; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the IGA between the City of Tucson (City), Pima County (County), and the Drexel Heights Fire District was adopted on March 18, 2014 by Resolution No. 22201; and

WHEREAS, the City, County and Drexel Heights Fire District have a long standing reoccurring agreement for 911 backup facilities to include 911 phones, PCWIN radios, consoles and positions and other operational support as requirements;

WHEREAS, all Public Safety Answering Points are required by the State of Arizona to have a 911 backup call and dispatch services apportionment for continuing operations; and

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona only provides funding for primary phone systems, which is the bulk expense. The lower cost for backup apportionment must be negotiated regionally per state requirements; and

WHEREAS, due to the newly implemented Century Link Managed Phone Service, directed by the State of Arizona, this amended IGA is required to fund the backup.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TUCSON, ARIZONA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Amendment No. One (#1) to the IGA between the City, County, and the Drexel Heights Fire District to fund the backup, attached as Exhibit A, is approved.

SECTION 2. The Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized and directed to execute, and the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to any and all other documents necessary to effectuate the Amendment No. One (#1) to the IGA by the City.

SECTION 3. The various City officers and employees are authorized and directed to perform all acts necessary or desirable to give effect to this Resolution.

SECTION 4. WHEREAS, it is necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City that this Resolution become immediately effective, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.
