Amendment to Tax Levy and Rate Adoption

Amendments were requested for five school district tax levies and rates by the Superintendent of Schools. Marana and Sunnyside Unified School Districts both saw a slight decrease in their Maintenance and Operation line items as a result of these changes. For San Fernando, Empire and Continental Elementary School Districts these changes resulted in an overall increase to their Primary levies and rates. The attached resolution reflects these changes.

Impacts to the Primary levies and rates of the school districts are shown in the table below.

**RESOLUTION OF THE PIMA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AMENDING
RESOLUTION 2019-60 FOR THE LEVY OF TAXES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019/2020**

The Board of Supervisors of Pima County, Arizona finds:

1. That on August 19, 2019, the Board of Supervisors passed Resolution 2019-60, setting forth the amount of taxes and/or special assessments to be imposed on property within the various school districts, municipalities and special taxing districts in the County for Fiscal Year 2019/2020, by or on behalf of those entities.
2. Some of the school district primary property tax levy amounts reported to the Board of Supervisors were incorrect.
3. The Board of Supervisors has received corrected levy amounts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. Resolution 2019-60 is amended to correct the primary property tax levies of the Marana and Sunnyside Unified School Districts and the San Fernando, Empire, and Continental Elementary School Districts, as set forth below.
