I appreciate your response to my questions regarding this subject. My concern was whether this grant reimbursed overtime in a manner similar to the Operation Stonegarden grant where individuals are specifically requested to work overtime when it may or may not be related to their actual duties. The distinguishing factor, you have identified, is that this is for overtime incurred by an individual who is actively working a narcotics investigation. This means, if the grant were unavailable, Pima County would be funding the overtime.

Based on this clarification in your attached November 25, 2019 memorandum, I am recommending approval of this grant by the Board of Supervisors.

In response to your November 21, 2019 memorandum regarding the U.S. Customs and Border Protection/U.S. Border Patrol Treasury Executive Office Asset Forfeiture (TEOAF) Memorandum of Understanding, you had several valid questions. This memo will attempt to answer those questions and provide insight as to the functionality and importance of this funding source. The TOEAF grant is administered through U.S. Customs and Border Protection; however, this grant is fundamentally different in scope and expected outcomes from Operation Stonegarden.

The TEOAF program originates out of the U.S. Department of the Treasury. Department of Homeland Security agencies (ICE, CBP, U.S. Coast Guard, IRS, and the U.S. Secret Service) seize the original assets in the course of narcotics investigations and the funds are deposited in accounts managed by the Treasury Executive Office for Asset Forfeiture. These funds are then distributed to the various agencies of the Department of Homeland Security to programs and activities focused on disrupting criminal enterprises and enhancing forfeiture capabilities.

This is our fourth year in receiving funds from the TEOAF program. The intent of this program is to support multi-agency task forces with a mission focus on narcotics investigations. The funds received through this program are exclusively used for reimbursement of overtime expenses incurred during narcotics investigations. The TEOAF program differs significantly from Operation Stonegarden in that there is no expectation for additional operations, or for achieving specific federal objectives. The TEOAF program reimburses our overtime for either joint or department initiated narcotics investigations that we routinely engage in as part of our normal operations.

The resources committed to this grant are comprised largely of detectives assigned to our Narcotics and Special Investigations Section (NSIS) and to some extent, our patrol deputies and other detectives as needed. The grant specifically limits the overtime reimbursement to a maximum of \$15,000 per individual detective, not to exceed the overall grant of \$500,000. Previous awards totaled \$300,000 and the current agreement increases that amount by \$200,000. To clarify this point, we do not assign a specific group of detectives to work joint operations supported by the TEOAF grant. Each joint investigation is a unique and distinct criminal case, with the necessary detectives assigned specifically to those individual cases. As each new case develops into a full investigation we utilize TEOAF funds to cover overtime expenditures for NSIS detectives, patrol deputies, and detectives assigned from other units to assist as needed. This allows us to distribute the overall grant to the majority of our NSIS section and support staff.

Our strategic enforcement effort for this program is to reduce and disrupt drug related violence and narcotics trafficking in Pima County. We accomplish this through aggressive collection of intelligence from various sources to include 88-Crime, tips from citizens, other investigations, and through more involved criminal investigations. Our strategy also includes collaborating with other local, state, and federal agencies to allocate the necessary resources to make arrests and refer cases to the Pima County Attorney's Office. The vast majority of our narcotics related investigations require collaboration with our various partners and we routinely engage in task force operations.

Indirect costs are not allowable, nor are EREs, however, this funding helps cover overtime expenses for investigations that the Sheriff's Department would conduct, even absent an additional funding source. These investigations are important public safety, counter-narcotics operations that should not be curtailed, especially considering costs can be mitigated via the TEOAF funding source.

Please find the attached summary of TEOAF expenditures for CY 2018 and YTD 2019. You will notice that some of these employees have significantly higher totals, which is largely due to assignment and availability to work associated investigations. Only one of these individuals has retired in the recent past. Also, you may note two individuals that exceeded the \$15,000 threshold in CY 2018. The TEOAF agreement is based on the federal fiscal year, therefore these totals do not accurately depict an overage. Our Finance Section closely monitors individual expenditures to ensure no one exceeds this limit.

Hopefully this helps clarify this funding source and its importance to public safety in Pima County.

I am returning the attached Board of Supervisors Agenda Item Report for further explanation. I would like to know more detail about this grant, particularly the joint operation, the number of staff involved, the amount of overtime used by each staff member and what assurances can be obtained that this grant is not contributing to pension spiking and acceleration of local government payments now necessary to fund the increasing cost of public safety pension system.

I also strenuously object to indirect costs not being allowed for this grant while they are allowed for others. I believe the decision to deny indirect cost reimbursement or de minimis indirect cost reimbursement is unsupported by federal code. As a subrecipient of this grant through the Arizona Department of Homeland Security, I believe we are entitled to a negotiated de minimis indirect overhead cost.

In addition, as we recently experienced with Operation Stonegarden, similar funding requests have not been productive. Hence, I would like to have more information regarding this grant and how it relates to a joint operation with the US Border Patrol.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) BETWEEN CUSTOMS AND BORDER PROTECTION, UNITED STATES BORDER PATROL AND LOCAL, COUNTY, OR STATE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY FOR THE REIMBURSEMENT OF JOINT OPERATIONS EXPENSES FROM THE TREASURY FORFEITURE FUND

This Agreement is entered into by the <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u> (NCIC CODE #AZ0100000) and United States Border Patrol (USBP), CPA <u>Tucson Sector</u> for the purpose of the reimbursement of costs incurred by the <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u> in providing resources to joint operations/task forces.

Payments may be made to the extent they are included in the CBP Fiscal Year Plan, and the money is available within the Treasury Forfeiture Fund to satisfy the request(s) for the reimbursement of overtime expenses and other law enforcement expenses related to joint operations.

#### I. LIFE OF THIS AGREEMENT

This Agreement becomes effective on the date it is signed by both parties. It remains in force unless explicitly terminated, in writing, by either party.

#### II. AUTHORITY

This Agreement is established pursuant to the provisions of 31 USC 9703, the Treasury Forfeiture Fund Act of 1992, which provides for the reimbursement of certain expenses incurred by local, county, and state law enforcement agencies as participants of joint operations/task forces with a federal agency participating in the Treasury Forfeiture Fund.

#### III. PURPOSE OF THIS AGREEMENT

This Agreement establishes the responsibilities of both parties and the procedures for the reimbursement of certain overtime expenses and other law enforcement expenses pursuant to 31 USC 9703.

#### IV. APPLICABILITY OF THIS AGREEMENT

This agreement is valid for all joint investigations led by USBP CPA <u>Tucson Sector</u>, with the participation of the <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u>, and until terminated, in writing, by either party.

## V. TERMS, CONDITIONS, AND PROCEDURES

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## A. Assignment of Officer(s)

To the maximum extent possible, the <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u> shall assign dedicated officers to any investigation or joint operation. Included as part of this Agreement, the <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u> shall provide the USBP CPA <u>Tucson Sector</u> with the names, titles, four last digits of SSNs, badge or ID numbers, and hourly overtime wages of the officer/deputies(s) assigned to the joint operation. This information must be updated as necessary.

# B. Submission of Requests for Reimbursement (Invoices) and Supporting Documentation

1. The <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u> may request the reimbursement of overtime salary expenses directly related to work on a joint operation with USBP CPA <u>Tucson Sector</u>, performed by its officer(s) assigned to this joint operation. In addition, the <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u> may request reimbursement of other investigative expenses, such as travel, fuel, training, equipment and other similar costs, incurred by officer(s) assigned as members of the designated joint operations with the USBP CPA <u>Tucson Sector</u>.

The <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u> <u>may not</u> request the reimbursement of the same expenses from any other Federal law enforcement agencies that may also be participating in the investigation.

2. Reimbursement payments will not be made by check. To receive reimbursement payments, the <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u> must ensure that Customs and Border Protection, National Finance Center (CBP/NFC) has a current ACH Form on file with the agency's bank account information, for the purposes of Electronic Funds Transfer. The ACH Form must be sent to the following address:

CBP National Finance Center Attn: Forfeiture Fund 6650 Telecom Dr. INDIANAPOLIS, IN 46278

If any changes occur in the law enforcement agency's bank account information, a new ACH Form must be filled out and sent to the CBP/NFC as soon as possible.

- 3. In order to receive the reimbursement of officers' overtime and other expenses related to joint operations, the <a href="Pima County Sheriff's Department">Pima County Sheriff's Department</a> must submit to USBP CPA <a href="Tucson Sector">Tucson Sector</a> the TEOAF Form "Local, County, and State Law Enforcement Agency Request for Reimbursement of Joint Operations Expenses (Invoice)", signed by an authorized representative of that agency and accompanied by supporting documents such as copies of time sheets and receipts.
- 4. The Pima County Sheriff's Department remains fully responsible, as the employer of the officer(s) assigned to the investigation, for the payment of overtime salaries and related benefits such as tax withholdings, insurance coverage, and all other requirements under the law, regulation, ordinance, or contract, regardless of the reimbursable overtime charges incurred. Treasury Forfeiture Fund reimburses overtime salaries. Benefits are not reimbursable.
- 5. The maximum reimbursement entitlement for overtime worked on behalf of the joint investigation is set at \$15,000 per officer per year.
- The <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u> will submit all requests for the reimbursement of joint operations' expenses to USBP CPA <u>Tucson Sector</u>, at the following address: <u>2430 S. #### VI. PROGRAM AUDIT

This Agreement and its provisions are subject to audit by USBP, the Department of the Treasury Office of Inspector General, the General Accounting Office, and other government designated auditors. The <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u> agrees to permit such audits and agrees to maintain all records relating to these transactions for a period not less than three years; and in the event of an on-going audit, until the audit is completed.

These audits may include reviews of any and all records, documents, reports, accounts, invoices, receipts of expenditures related to this agreement, as well as interviews of any and all personnel involved in these transactions.

#### VII. REVISIONS

The terms of this Agreement may be amended upon the written approval by both parties. The revision becomes effective on the date of approval.

#### VIII. NO PRIVATE RIGHT CREATED

This is an internal government agreement between the USBP CPA <u>Tucson Sector</u> and the <u>Pima County Sheriff's Department</u>, and is not intended to confer any right or benefit to any private person or party.
