**A RESOLUTION OF THE PIMA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN  
SUPPORT OF ARIZONA SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1001  
RATIFYING THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE  
UNITED STATES PROVIDING EQUAL RIGHTS FOR MEN AND WOMEN.**

WHEREAS, on March 22, 1972, the Congress of the United States adopted a proposition to amend the Constitution of the United States by adding a new Article, which states:

Section 1. Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or any State on account of sex.

Section 2. The Congress shall have the power to enforce, by appropriate legislation, the provision of this article.

Section 3. This amendment shall take effect two years after the date of ratification.

WHEREAS, the above Equal Rights Amendment is needed in order to affirm that phrases such as "all men are created equal," "liberty and justice for all," "equal justice of the laws," "government of the people, by the people, and for the people" apply equally to women and men, and reflect values that are Constitutional in nature; and

WHEREAS, as we enter a new decade women are still not guaranteed equal rights under the U.S. Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Passage of a constitutional amendment requires ratification by three-quarters of the states (38) of which 37 have voted to approve the pending amendment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Pima County Board of Supervisors calls for the Arizona State Legislature to vote on and approve Senate Concurrent Resolution (SCR) 1001, thus providing the required ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment by three-quarters of the states undeniably ensuring the equality of women under the law.


