*Project Title/Description:

Health Promotion and Disease Prevention Research Centers

*Purpose:

Funding from the Health Promotion and Disease Prevention Research Centers will facilitate implementation of a project titled Unidos: Linking Individuals to Social Determinant and Community Health Services. The purpose of this project is to address chronic disease and social conditions that contribute to health disparities among Latinos in Arizona. This will involve delivering education and resources to target communities through Community Health Workers (CHWs) who understand and represent community needs within and outside of traditional health systems.

*Procurement Method:

This Revenue Contract is a non-Procurement contract and not subject to Procurement rules.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

It is expected that this project will show that enhanced social support and networks will improve reported health over a six month period. The outcome of this research will be a scalable, sustainable Community-Clinical Linkages model that lowers chronic disease risk. Community Health Workers within the Pima County Health Department will accomplish these outcomes by working with El Rio Community Health Center to identify program participants. CHWs will work with participants to:

- 1) Support and connect participants to health promotion resources;
- 2) Provide individual and group-based support; and
- 3) Leverage community resources to help individuals address social determinants of health-related needs.

*Public Benefit:

Reduction of chronic disease and improved social conditions among Latino adults in Pima County.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

- Provide individual and group-based support; and
 Leverage community resources to help individuals address social determinants of health-related needs.

 1. Participate in the Arizona Prevention Research Center (AzPRC) Community Action Board (CAB) Research Committee;

- 3. Employ a CHW to implement the community program;
- 4. Participate in CHW training related to the research intervention;
- 5. Collect survey data relevant to the community program being implemented by CHWs in the community; and
- 6. Participate in dissemination and scale up activities as appropriate.

Yes. The grant funding for Year 1 of the contract began October 1, 2019. However, the final agreement was not received from the University until Jan. 7, 2020. PCHD will not begin implementation of this project until BOS approval.

Pima County Health Department is the primary entity protecting and promoting the health of Arizona's 2nd most populous county. Pima County Public Health Services was selected as a partner for the AzPRC Core Research Project based on the criteria: 1) is a county health departments responsible for working with ADHS in administering public health and chronic disease prevention programs; 2) is located in a county with a large Mexican origin population which is the focus of the study. 3) Is located in a county in which a CHC had agreed to participate in the research and provide clinical data; 4) worked collaboratively to develop the research project; and 5) expressed interest in partnering in the research.

The SOW for Pima County Public Health Services is:

- Participate in the AzPRC CAB Research Committee that will meet monthly and be responsible for guiding overall research and interpreting and disseminating research outcomes:
- Work collaboratively with the CAB research committee and AzPRC research team to refine Unidos, a CHW community-clinical linkage model that will provide social support to individuals at risk for chronic disease and help them address the social determinants of health;
- Employ a CHW or equivalent position trained in CHW Core Competencies to implement the community program;
- Participate in CHW training related to the research intervention;
- Collect survey data relevant to the community program being implemented by CHWs in the community;
- Participate in qualitative data collection activities such as focus groups with staff and group meetings; and
- Participate in dissemination and scale up activities as appropriate.

Budget Justification:

Personnel: Three part-time Community Health Workers (CHWs), at \$15,600 each, will be hired for years 1-3. One CHW will be retained for year 3. The community-based CHWs will be housed in the Pima County Health Department (PCHD) to connect participants to health promotion resources, provide individual and group-based support, as well as leverage community resources to address participant's

needs. A .10 FTE Program Coordinator will be funded in years 4-5 to attend Community Action Board (CAB) Research Committee meetings and participate in other oversight activities as needed.

Travel Expenses: \$3,000 is allocated for travel in years 1-2. This includes attending one CAB meeting outside Pima County during years 1-2 (mileage, lodging and per-diem), as well as local mileage to sites around Pima County (4,000 miles per year at .445/mi = \$1,780 for years 1-3; 500 miles in Years 4-5). Travel is also included for two in-state professional development activities, such as conferences, which equates to \$983 in years 1-2 (hotel 2 nights at 130/night = 260, per diem at $49/\text{day} \times 2 \text{ days} = 98 , mileage 300mi/.445 = 133.5). Professional development travel will not be necessary in years 3-5.

Materials and Supplies: \$4,520 is budgeted for materials and supplies for years 1-2. These costs taper off for years 3-5 to approximately \$700. The materials and supplies purchased for this project include health promotion materials, such as books, water bottles, and other relevant incentives, which will assist in recruitment and promotion. Offices supplies will support program efforts and include items such as copy paper, printer ink, copy machine toner, pens, and other general supplies.

Other Expenses: \$1,000 for years 1-2 and \$360 for year 3 will cover all other expenses. Printing of program forms, materials, and brochures is necessary for ensuring community members can participate in the project as well as have access to information about workshops, services, and other resources provided by PCHD and community-based organizations. Printed materials will also be used for recruitment purposes. Development of program materials, such as recruitment flyers/brochures, is also included; the Pima County Communications and Pima County Health Department will design materials. Special printing projects may be needed at times and will also be covered under this section.

Indirect Costs

Indirect costs for years 1-5 represent 10% of personnel/ERE costs.

Data and Resources Sharing Plan

The Arizona Prevention Research Center has a long history of sharing findings to diverse stakeholders, making data available to others, and freely distributing curricula and evaluation tools. This has and will continue to include in kind technical assistance for those curricula and tools. We will continue to do this through the support of our website as part of the communication core as well through other core activities. Additionally, the University of Arizona, with passage on April 4, 2016 by the Faculty Senate, supports an "Open Access Policy" for peer-review manuscripts generated by University researchers. The policy reads, "The Faculty of the University of Arizona is committed to disseminating its research and scholarship as widely as possible" and seeks to increase the impact of UA research by making it more widely available and supports our institution's UA's land grant mission. A UA Campus Repository is now established to share scholarship as freely and widely as possible, and is supported indefinitely by the University Libraries. All peer reviewed manuscripts that are accepted for publication will also be submitted to the digital archive PubMed Central as applicable.

Additionally, as allowed by the Centers for Disease Control Prevention, current law (federal and Arizona) and the UA's Institutional Review Board, we will make de-identified, analysis ready datasets (supported by our data manager) from all research activities of the Center available to external parties within three and half years of the data being collected. Also within 3.5 years of their creation, all instruments, materials, manuals and protocols will also be made available to external parties. We believe such effort contribute to the expedited translation of research results into knowledge, products, and procedures to improve human health.

Our processes and findings will also be shared in a timely way to a diverse range of stakeholders. This includes conference presentations, publications, community presentations and meetings with valued stakeholders such as patients/participants, government officials (federal/state/local), community health centers and other primary care providers (networks and individuals), health professional workforce development organizations and networks including those focused on community health workers, community-based organizations, and local/stake coalitions addressing cross-cutting chronic disease problems like diabetes, heart disease and cancer. As part of all these dissemination activities we will continue our track record and extend them by closely engaging community action board members in the scientific and policy dissemination process, and seek to develop capacity in chronic disease prevention and control-related research with all collaborating individuals and organizations of our Center.
