Title: Sabino Canyon Park Road; Carter Canyon Road to USFS Gate (4SCPRD)

*Purpose

A Memorandum of Agreement and Funds Transfer Agreement is necessary for the scoping phase of the project. The scoping effort requires \$10,000 dollars (5.7%) in matching funds from Pima County. Once the scoping effort is complete, the project will be included in CFLHD's programming for design and construction. The anticipated year for construction of the project is FY 24, subject to available CFLHD funding in that year. A separate reimbursable agreement will be necessary for the design and construction phase for which Pima County will be responsible for 5.7% (\$313,500) of the total cost currently estimated at \$5,500,000 dollars. *Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

The goal of the project is to improve access to USFS lands by rehabilitating and paving 0.4 miles of Sabino Canyon Park Road, constructing a new 75 stall parking lot and 21 on-street parking stalls, a kiosk, 5' wide shared-use path and potentially public restrooms.

*Public Benefit:

The improvements will mitigate congestion and improve safety on Sabino Canyon Park Road by providing much needed additional parking for visitors seeking recreational activities on USFS lands below Summerhaven.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

The performance will be measured by successful delivery of the project improvements under consideration.

*Retroactive:

Yes. The performance period began on July 13, 2020 which is the date of the Memorandum of Agreement. Pima County was notified of receiving the grant on July 13, 2020. August 17, 2020 was the earliest BOS meeting date possible for approval of the MOA and Funds Transfer Agreement. If the MOA and Funds Transfer agreement are not approved the project will not go forward.

A. PURPOSE OF THIS AGREEMENT

This Agreement documents the intent of the parties and sets forth the anticipated responsibilities of each party in the development, construction, and future maintenance of the subject project. The purpose of the Agreement is to identify and assign responsibilities for the environmental analysis, design, right-of-way, utilities, acquisition and construction as appropriate for this programmed project, and to ensure maintenance of the facility for public use if improvements are made. The parties understand that any final decision as to design or construction will not be made until after the environmental analysis required under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) is completed (this does not prevent the parties from assigning proposed design criteria to be studied in the NEPA process.) Any decision to proceed with the design and construction of the project will depend on the availability of appropriations at the time of obligation and other factors, such as issues raised during the NEPA process, a natural disaster that changes the need for the project, a change in Congressional direction, or other relevant factors.

B. AUTHORITY

This Agreement is entered into between the signatory parties pursuant to the provisions of 23 U.S.C. 204.

C. PROJECT BACKGROUND/SCOPE

Purpose: The purpose of this project is to improve multimodal access to the Coronado National Forest on Sabino Canyon Park Road from Carter Canyon Road to the USFS gate.

Scope: The scope of this project includes:

- Rehabilitating and paving 0.4 miles of Sabino Canyon Park Road.
- Construct a new 75 stall parking lot, 21 on-street parking stalls, a kiosk, a 5' shared use path, and potentially public restrooms.
- · Improve surface drainage.
- Construct new sidewalk and utility connections.
- Update signage.

The estimated total project cost, including engineering and escalation of construction costs to the program year, is \$5,500,000. The Federal Lands Access Program will provide \$5,200,000. Pima County will provide \$252,000 in cash funds and \$48,000 in utility relocation costs, to meet the 5.70% match requirement. At this time, the project funding is limited to \$60,000 for scoping efforts. This scoping effort will develop refined costs and scope of work for review by the project partners and the Programming Decision Committee for final project selection.

If during implementation of the project it is determined that the total project cost exceeds \$60,000, the Central Federal Lands Highway Division, Pima County, and the USFS will either mutually agree to

reduce the scope of the project, or execute a modification to this agreement to change funding amounts.

H. MATCHING SHARE REQUIREMENTS

The Pima County will provide \$10,000 to meet match requirements.

Matching or cost sharing requirements will be satisfied following the obligation of funds to the project as detailed above in Section G.

J. CHANGES/AMENDMENTS/ADDENDUMS

A change in the composition of the project team members does not require the agreement to be amended.

It is the responsibility of the project team members to recognize when changes are needed and to make timely notification to their management in order to avoid project delivery delays.
