

Re the current "Suitable Home" law:
By this law, the Board of Supervisors authorized and ordered the county enforcement agent to refuse someone who tries to adopt if, for example, that person is on PACT's "do not adopt" list.

Extremely important: This current law is based on the fact that Pima County has the legal right to refuse. You would be giving up this right, or not using it, if the proposed new law passes.

Under the proposed new law, anyone at all, even an axe murderer, could demand and get an animal, because that law eliminates — repeals — the authority and the order that was given to the county enforcement agent by the Supervisors in the current law.

It is outrageous to argue that Pima Co. must by law give out its animals to anyone who asks, as has been falsely argued by those pushing the proposed new law.
