Dear Mr. Tylutki:

I am pleased to inform you of your Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA) supplemental award in the amount of \$150,925. This one-time, non-renewable award is provided under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act") (Pub. L. No. 116-136), which was signed into law on March 27, 2020. The supplemental funds provided under the CARES Act are to be used by HOPWA grantees as additional funding to maintain operations and for rental assistance, supportive services, and other necessary actions, in order to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus.

This supplemental award may be used to reimburse allowable costs incurred prior to the receipt of your supplemental award provided such costs were used to prevent, prepare for, or respond to COVID-19. Activities for which grantees may use the supplemental grant funds include, for example:

- assisting HOPWA eligible households in accessing essential services and supplies such as food, water, medications, medical care, and information;
- educating assisted households on ways to reduce the risk of getting sick or spreading infectious diseases such as COVID-19 to others;
- providing transportation services for eligible households, including costs for privatelyowned vehicle transportation when needed, to access medical care, supplies, and food or to commute to places of employment;
- providing nutrition services for eligible households in the form of food banks, groceries, and meal deliveries;
- providing lodging at hotels, motels, or other locations to quarantine HOPWA-eligible persons or their household members; and
- providing short-term rent, mortgage, and utility (STRMU) assistance payments to prevent homelessness of a tenant or mortgagor of a dwelling for a period of up to 24 months.

Please note that competitive grantees are not required to use the supplemental grant funds on permanent supportive housing but may use their awards on any HOPWA eligible activities that address the needs of their communities related to coronavirus prevention, preparedness, and response.

In addition, the Office of Community Planning and Development has provided certain regulatory waivers to offer additional flexibility to program participants to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and to facilitate assistance to eligible communities and households economically impacted by the virus. Grantees should consult the "Availability of Waivers of Community Planning and Development (CPD) Grant Program and Consolidated Plan Requirements to Prevent the Spread of COVID-19 and Mitigate Economic Impacts Caused by COVID-19" memorandum for more information on the availability of waivers related to COVID-19.

A new grant agreement for this award will be issued through your local HUD field office. Within fourteen (14) days of executing their grant agreements with HUD, grantees will also be expected to execute new project sponsor agreements addressing how the supplemental funding will be used. Further guidance pertaining to the administration of the supplemental award, including eligible uses of the grant funding and reporting requirements, is forthcoming. The Office of Community Planning and Development is looking forward to working with you as you implement critical actions to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19 in your community. 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RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PIMA COUNTY, ARIZONA AUTHORIZING THE APPROVAL OF THE HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERSONS WITH AIDS CARES ACT GRANT AGREEMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020-2023 FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT

The Board of Supervisors of Pima County, Arizona finds:

- 1. Pima County ("County"), through its Community & Workforce Development Department ("CWD"), administers several federal and local grant programs to benefit low-income, homeless, and certain special needs individuals in Pima County.
- 2. County has administered the Housing Opportunities for Persons with Aids ("HOPWA") grant since 1990's and renews it through HUD's competitive process.
- 3. On May 28, 2020, Pima County submitted an application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") for HOPWA CARES Act funds for fiscal years (FY) 2020-2023 to assist homeless families living with AIDS who are adversely impacted by COVID19. This application named the Southern Arizona Aids Foundation ("SAAF") as a Project Sponsor for HOPWA CARES Act funds.
- 4. On April 2, 2020, HUD issued the "Housing Opportunities for Persons with Aids Program Grant Award Notice" awarding County, as Grantee, \$150,925.00 for FY 2020-2023 under Federal Grant No. AZ-H17003 ("the HOPWA Renewal Grant"). The HOPWA CARES Act Award Notice is attached to this Resolution as **Exhibit A.** The terms of the HOPWA CARES Act Grant require County to enter into an agreement with SAAF to conduct certain grant-related activities.
- 5. It is in the best interests of the residents of Pima County, to accept the FY 2020-2023 HOPWA CARES Act grant funds being provided under Federal Grant No. AZ-H17003.
- 6. Under HUD grant procedures, HUD does not require, and will not accept, a written signature on the Notice of Award and the Terms and Conditions of the HOPWA CARES Act agreement. Such acceptance must be effectuated electronically within the GrantSolutions.gov system.

- A. The Chairman of the Pima County Board of Supervisors is authorized to execute, as necessary, all applicable federal documents associated with the acceptance of and activities under the "Grant Agreement for the Housing Opportunities for Persons with Aids Program" accepting the FY 2020-2023 HOPWA CARES Act Grant, including but not limited to, required HUD budget forms and descriptive grant narratives.
- B. The Director of CWD or his designee is authorized and directed to submit any such documents to HUD, including completing any electronic acceptance, approvals and submissions required by HUD.
- C. The Chairman is authorized to execute any and all agreements with SAAF to conduct certain HOPWA CARES Act Grant-related activities.
