*Project Title/Description:

Emergency Services Network (ESN). The contract and amendments can be found in OnBase by searching Contracts 21*053 (Formerly 18*403) in Doc ID AMS.

*Purpose:

The Primavera Foundation, Inc., a subrecipient, assists households with emergency utility and rental/mortgage financial assistance through case management services including eligibility determination for several funding sources, as well as referral and advocacy services to eligible, low-income households experiencing a temporary financial crisis in order to prevent homelessness and utility disconnection. Funding is ultimately used to ensure households become and remain self-sufficient.

US Department of Health and Human Services funds were approved at the 8/17/20 Pima County Board of Supervisors' Meeting. Short Term Crisis Services/Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (STCS/TANF) funds are to be used for eligibility determination and case management services for households with minors facing eviction or foreclosure. STCS/TANF funds can also be used to pay the following: delinquent utility bills to prevent utility shut off and work related expenses such as vehicle, dental and eye related services as needed to secure or maintain employment. This determination can be used to write vouchers to landlords or mortgage companies from Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funds as well as STCS/TANF. Utility shut-off eligibility case management is conducted under the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Based on review of the LIHEAP application, County guarantees payment and issues a voucher to the utility company.

This amendment will provide additional funding of \$91,351.00 for the period of July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021.

*Procurement Method:

Pursuant to Pima County Procurement Code 11.12.020, Competitive sealed proposals, RFP No. CAA-ESN-2018-06 was conducted with delegated authority.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

The Primavera Foundation, Inc. will provide emergency financial assistance to 300 eligible low-income households.

*Public Benefit:

The benefit of the program is that it will help in alleviating poverty, prevent homelessness, prevent utility shutoffs while promoting self-sufficiency to Pima County residents.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Monthly case management and service reports.

*Retroactive:

Yes. Due to budgets for subrecipients could not be written until the County received the funding agreement from the State which was 06/27/20. The negative impact of not approving this amendment is low income families will not receive emergency utility and rental/mortgage financial assistance for an additional year.

GRANT FUNDED AGREEMENT – AMENDMENT FIVE (5)

1. BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE.

- 1.1 <u>Background</u>. On July 3, 2018, Pima County ("County") and The Primavera Foundation, Inc. ("Awardee"), entered into the above referenced contract to provide supportive services and rental assistance to the homeless in Pima County.
- 1.2 County Organization. Effective July 1, 2020:
 - 1.2.1. Pima County Community Services, Employment and Training Department and Pima County Community Development and Neighborhood Conservation Department are restructured to form the Community & Workforce Development Department.
 - 1.2.2. This Agreement will be renumbered to CT-CR-21-53, but all terms and conditions, except as amended herein, remain unchanged.

1.2.3. Any reference in the Agreement to Community Services; Community Services, Employment and Training Department; or CSET, will mean Community & Workforce Development Department ("CWD").

1.3 Purpose.

- 1.3.1. County through its Community Action Agency, as Grantee, is the recipient of State and Federal Grants for operating the local Emergency Services Network ("ESN") to provide emergency financial assistance for qualified households to prevent homelessness or utility disconnection.
- 1.3.2. County is the Subrecipient of USHHS funds and is authorized to pass those funds along to other entities, including Awardee, for eligible services.
- 1.3.3. Certain federal funds were previously provided for activities under this Agreement. County has not received the following funds for FY 2020-2021:
 - 1.3.3.1. Emergency Eviction Intervention Program ("EEIP") funds; and
 - 1.3.3.2. Arizona Department of Housing (ADOH) Housing Trust Fund Program ("HTP") funds.
- 1.3.4. County wishes to continue the ESN services provided by Awardee for an additional year.
- 2. <u>TERM, EXTENSIONS and AMENDMENTS</u>, SECTION 1.0. Pursuant to paragraph 1.2, County exercises the second (2nd) of four available (4) extension options. This Contract will terminate on June 30, 2021.
- 3. **COMPENSATION AND PAYMENT, SECTION 3.0** is amended as follows:
 - 3.1 Paragraph 3.1 is amended to increase "the Maximum Allocated Amount":
