*Project Title/Description:

Hazardous Materials Response Program

*Purpose:

With the exception of the Picture Rocks Fire District, it is the desire of the "Parties" to jointly exercise their powers pursuant to A.R.S. § §11-951 through 11-954 to continue to participate in a hazardous materials response program. for the provision of fire, hazardous materials and emergency medical services in the event of a major incident, natural or human caused disaster or other significant event that affects the safety and welfare of the general public. The 🧁 purpose for this amendment is to exercise the extension option and renew the Hazardous Materials Response Program IGA for an additional (5) years. There is no expense or revenue in this agreement.

*Procurement Method:

This IGA is a non-procurement contract and not subject to procurement rules.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

Each Fire District and the City of Tucson has Firefighters, hazardous materials technicians, emergency medical technicians, and related apparatus and equipment, and will provide fire, hazardous materials response and emergency medical services cooperatively in the event of major incident(s), natural or human caused disaster(s), or other significant event(s) which may occur within Pima County for another (5) years under this agreement.

*Public Benefit:

Residents of Pima County will not be at risk in the event of a major hazardous materials incident, natural or human caused disaster or other significant event that effects the safety and welfare of the general public with a hazardous materials response team in place that will provide resources to efficiently and effectively safeguard the lives and property within Pima County for an additional (5) years.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Required participation in the annual review of the participating fire departments Hazardous Materials Technician rosters, verification of certifications and proficiency trainings, and completion of a medical examination meeting the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standard for Hazardous Materials personnel. Attendance and participation at the monthly Regional Hazardous Materials Team meetings. Provide briefings at the quarterly Pima County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) meetings on significant incidents, training, and specialized equipment. Participate in annual Regional Hazardous Materials Team exercise.

*Retroactive:

Extended time was necessitated due to coordination of all parties and obtaining each Fire Department and District's governing board approval in the midst of COVID-19 and Bighorn Fire activities. Additionally, the commencement date is different because this amendment had been forwarded to each Fire Department or District for review and approval prior to the May 28, 2020 Effective Date and Commencement Date verbiage change. The difficulty of starting this lengthy process over again during unprecedented times and during two declared emergencies where all parties were heavily involved, was too challenging.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT (IGA) AMENDMENT

The parties agree to amend the above-referenced Agreement as follows:

1. Background and Purpose.

- 1.1. <u>Background</u>. On January 06, 2015, the Parties entered into the above referenced Agreement to allow for emergency response by a hazardous materials team in Pima County, Arizona.
- 1.2. <u>Purpose</u>. With the exception of Picture Rocks Fire District, it is the continued desire of the Parties to jointly exercise their powers pursuant to A.R.S. § §11-951 through 11-954 to participate in a hazardous materials response program for the provision of fire, hazardous materials and emergency medical services in the event of a major incident, natural or human caused disaster or other significant event that affects the safety and welfare of the general public.

2. Term.

- 2.1 The Agreement terminates on January 05, 2025, and may be renewed for one (1) additional five (5) year period.
- 2.2. Picture Rocks Fire District has submitted written notice to the other Parties canceling its participation and is no longer a Party to the Agreement.

3. Insurance.

Section IX. Insurance, is deleted and replaced with the following:

Each District Party and the City shall make available evidence of insurance with limits of liability not less than those stated below:

- A. Commercial General Liability (CGL) Occurrence Form with limits of \$2,000,000 Each Occurrence and \$2,000,000 General Aggregate. Policy shall include bodily injury, property damage, broad form contractual liability coverage, personal and advertising injury and products completed operations. Pima County is to be named as an additional insured for all operations performed within the scope of the Agreement.
- B. Business Automobile Liability Bodily Injury and Property Damage for any owned, hired, and/or non-owned automobiles used in the performance of this Agreement with a Combined Single Limit (CSL) of \$1,000,000 each accident.
- C. If this Agreement involves professional services, evidence of professional liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 must be provided.
- D. Workers' Compensation (WC) and Employers' Liability Statutory requirements and benefits for Workers' Compensation. In Arizona, WC coverage is compulsory for employers of one or more employees. Employer's Liability coverage- \$1,000,000 each accident and each person disease.
- E. Upon request, a Party shall provide any other Party with satisfactory proof of insurance. The Parties will provide thirty (30) days written notice of cancellation, non-renewal or ten (10) days written notice in the event of non-payment of premium. Any modifying language in the insurance certificate must be deleted.
- F. The Parties to this Intergovernmental Agreement acknowledge that a Party may be self-insured pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes, Title 11. Such self-insurance shall satisfy the insurance requirements of this Agreement.

4. Party Addresses for Providing Notice.

Exhibit B is deleted and replaced with Exhibit B.1.

The effective date of this Amendment is January 6, 2020.

All other provisions of the agreement not specifically changed by this Amendment remain in effect and are binding upon the parties.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto each sign this Amendment on a separate signature page. Each signor warrants that he or she has been duly authorized to commit the jurisdiction to continue to participate in the Agreement by formal approval of the jurisdiction's governing body.

RELATING TO THE TUCSON FIRE DEPARTMENT; APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR HAZARDOUS MATERIAL (HAZMAT) EMERGENCY RESPONSE BETWEEN THE CITY OF TUCSON, ACTING THROUGH THE TUCSON FIRE DEPARTMENT; PIMA COUNTY, ACTING THROUGH THE PIMA COUNTY OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AND HOMELAND SECURITY; AND SIX OTHER REGIONAL FIRE DISTRICTS FOR COOPERATIVE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY RESPONSE TO HAZMAT INCIDENTS WITHIN PIMA COUNTY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on September 7, 2004, by Resolution No. 19930, the Mayor and Council approved an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) under which the City of Tucson (City), acting through the Tucson Fire Department (TFD), cooperatively participated with Pima County, and the Northwest, Green Valley, Golder Ranch, and Drexel Heights Fire Districts in a countywide HazMat response program to provide emergency response to hazardous materials incidents within Pima County; and

WHEREAS, on January 6, 2015, by Resolution No. 22339, the Mayor and Council approved the most recent version of the County HazMat IGA between the City, acting through TFD; Pima County, acting through the Pima County Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security; and the Drexel Heights, Golder Ranch, Green Valley, Northwest, Picture Rocks, Avra Valley and Rincon Valley Fire Districts; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council now wish to approve an Amendment to the 2015 County HazMat IGA that renews that IGA for an additional five (5) year period (to January 5, 2025) between all participating parties except the Picture Rocks Fire District, which has submitted written notice to the other parties canceling its participation and is no longer a party to the IGA.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TUCSON, ARIZONA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Amendment to the County HazMat IGA attached hereto as Exhibit 1, renewing that IGA for an additional five (5) year period (to January 5, 2025), is approved.

SECTION 2. The Mayor is authorized and directed to execute the Amendment to the County HazMat IGA for and on behalf of the City of Tucson and the City Clerk is authorized and directed to attest to the same.

SECTION 3. The various City officers and employees are authorized and directed to perform all acts necessary or desirable to give effect to this Resolution.

SECTION 4. WHEREAS, it is necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City of Tucson that this Resolution become immediately effective, an

emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.
